

FSU women top Vol swimmers

The Florida State women's swim team came up with another major victory Saturday, winning 75-56 over tough Tennessee. The FSU win, combined with last weekend's impressive romp through the Nebraska Invitational, has the swimmers off to one of their best starts ever.

The Seminoles, now 5-1 in dual competition, found themselves battling the weather as much as the Volunteer swimmers Saturday afternoon. The temperature dropped 20 degrees from the beginning to the end of the meet, which was held at the FSU union pool.

"The weather inhibited some of our performances," FSU Coach Terry Maul said, "but our depth again paid off."

Florida State took eight firsts out of 15 events, but sewed up the victory with its team depth. FSU got 10 third place finishes in the 13 events that included three spots.

Terri Miller, an All-American and one of the team's Miller twins, was FSU's only double winner. She took first place in the 400-meter intermedi-

ate medley and the 200-meter butterfly, with her time in the 400 intermediate medley being under the national qualifying time.

She also took a third in the 200-meter intermediate medley and helped the Seminoles' 400-meter freestyle relay team to a first-place finish in the meet's final event.

Sister Kathi Miller also took a part in that 400 relay victory, in addition to winning the 200 freestyle. She added a third-place finish in the 100-meter butterfly and was a part of FSU's winning 400-meter medley relay team. Maul pointed out that she swam the lead leg of the two winning relay teams.

Other Seminole swimmers snaring first-place finishes were Sally Davis in the 100-meter butterfly (with a personal-best time of 1:01.2), Lisa Nencioni in the 200-meter breaststroke and Tallahassee Godby graduate Kim Dunlop in the 100-meter freestyle. Dunlop also swam on the winning 400-meter freestyle relay team.

The Seminoles next meet is scheduled for Dec. 21 in Fort Pierce against Michigan State.
