## FSU women second in swim

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Florida State women's swim team is in second place behind host Alabama after the first day of the Region III AIAW meet Thursday.

There are two days remaining in the competition.

The Crimson Tide has a commanding 403-285 point lead over FSU. Auburn is third with 196 points and Georgia fourth at 130. Four other teams complete the field.

Lisa Nencioni was the only FSU swimmer to place first in an event. She won the 500-yard freestyle in a time of 5:01.1, and the 50-yard breaststroke with a 32.2 clocking.

Teammate Jeanne Dowdle finished third in that event, two-tenths of a second behind Nencioni.

Nencioni and Dowdle were also members of the relay team that finished third in the 200-yard medley. Their teammates were Kim Averill and Kathi Miller.

Nencioni added a third place finish in the 200-yard individual, while Miller took second place.

A relay team including Miller, Jackie Bajus, Paula Hartzer and Nancy Pfaff finished second in the 800yard freestyle.

Alabama won the team title in the three-day tourney with 1,163 points. FSU had 850. Other scores were: Auburn 638, Indian River Community College 354, Georgia 349, South Florida 303 and Georgia Southern 161.

Freshman Lisa Nencioni won her third championship of the tourney Saturday, adding a 2:25.7 victory in the 200-yard breastroke to go with earlier wins in the 50-and 100-yard breastroke events.
