Columbia, S.C. — Florida State women's swim team turned in a score of 197 to rank second Thursday, after the first round of the Women's National Independents Championships at the University of South Carolina.

Southern Illinois held the top spot at 203.

## FSU women swim to 1st

COLUMBIA, S.C. — The Florida State women's swim team captured first place with 634 points in the finals of the Women's National Independents Swimming Championships held in Colombia, S.C.

Southern Illinois finished second with 479 Points followed by South Carolina with 430, Cincinnati with 374 and Virginia Tech with 246.

## FSU women swim to records

COLUMBIA, S.C. — Florida State set 13 AIAW national qualifying times and broke five school records in surging from second to first place after the second day of the Women's National Independents Swimming Championship Friday.

The Lady Seminoles leads the meet with 435 points, followed by Southern Illinois at 334, South Carolina 288, Cincinnati 256, Virginia Tech 156 and Old Dominion at 113.

FSU's Laurie Lehner won the 50-yard butterfly in 24.88, a national qualifying time and school record. The time was the second fastest in the nation this year.
