

FSU's Fuller diving for berth in NCAA meet

Freshman Florida State diver Wendy Fuller gets her chance to continue an FSU tradition today when competition opens in the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships at the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa.

For the past nine years, the Florida State women's swim team has scored points in the national championship meet, including a second place finish in the AIAW Nationals in 1982.

To get into the point-scoring top 16, Fuller must survive two cuts. After five of 11 dives, the field of 32 will be cut to 24. After eight dives, that number will be cut to 16. Those divers make the finals, and after the final set of three dives, the top 12 are named All-Americans.

For Florida State, this is the second straight year a Lady Seminole diver advanced to the NCAA Championships.

FSU diver places 15th in NCAA competition

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Freshman Wendy Fuller scored 406.05 points and placed 15th on the one-meter springboard in the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships on Thursday to become the first Florida State University female diver to make the finals and score points for the Lady Seminoles in national competition.
