

Brahmans, FSU Play To Tie

TALLAHASSEE (Special)
— The University of South Florida girl's tennis team and Florida State University battled to a 6-6 standoff in a match here yesterday.

The Brahmanettes would have won the match 6-3 had it gone the standard six singles and three doubles, but both teams agreed to play their entire squads in order to get ready for the FSU Invitational Collegiate Tennis tournament that opens here today.

Eighteen teams from around the Southeast are entered in the three-day Invitational with schools like North Carolina, South Carolina, Vanderbilt, Alabama, Furman, Auburn, Duke and Mercer joining state powers Rollins, and Florida in quest for the title.

Rollins has more seeded players than any other entrant, making the Tars the favorite. The Winter Park school also has the No. 1 single's top seed in Raney Fox.
