FSU tourney is under way

First day play of the 13th Annual Lady Seminole Collegiate Invitational Tennis Tournament pared a large field of nearly 100 down to 16 yesterday and perhaps the biggest surprise of the day was the general lack of surprises.

Of the 15 original seeded players, 11, including the top seven have made it to the round of 16 which is being played

today on FSU's Montgomery Gym courts.

Doubles competition was also scheduled to get under way this afternoon, with quarter and semi-final singles and doubles set for Saturday. All finals matches will be played Sunday.

Number one seed Candy Reynolds of Chattanooga met little resistance as she breezed to straight set victories over two opponents, Debi Snelling of Georgia, 6-0, 6-1 and Cammie Timberlake of North Carolina, 6-2, 6-3.

Miami's Susan Epstein-Robinette, the second seed, disposed of her two opponents in easy fashion as well, giving up just a single point enroute.

The day's biggest upset was pulled by Florida State's own Sally Schweppe who defeated the number eight seed,

Kathy Morton of Lamar 7-6, 6-3.

Other upsets were recorded by Susanne Bowron who defeated Judy Gfroerer of MUW; Liz Broughton of Rollins who downed Diane Armao of Miami, and Patty Mays of Duke who toppled Lamar's Lynn Koth.

UF, Miami tied at FSU

The top six seeded players advanced to the quarterfinals as a result of second day action at the 13th annual Lady Seminole Collegiate Invitational Tennis Tournament here Friday.

Florida and Miami are in a tie for the team honors with 18 points apiece. Rollins is third with 15 and Duke is fourth with 13. FSU is fifth with 12.

Top-seeded Candy Reynolds of Chattanooga eliminated Carol Dixon of Auburn 6-0, 6-2 and second-seeded Susan Epstein Robinette of Miafni came from behind to trim 10th seeded Ann Ellis of LSU 3-6, 6-2, 6-1.

Kay McDaniel, also of LSU, edged the University of Florida's Barbara Black 6-3, 4-6, 7-5 to advance as the third seed player.

Other seeded players to advance were Jodi Appelbaum of Miami, Judy Acker of Florida, Nancy Yeargin of Rollins and Debbie Dunkin of Florida.

Quarterfinals begin this morning at 9 o'clock and the four winning players will advance to the semifinals which begin at 11:30. All matches will be played on the Tully Gym courts.

There was an upset in the doubles competition as the unseeded team of Timberlake and Garcia of Miami defeated third-seeded Reynolds and Abney of Chattanooga 4-6, 6-3, 6-1.

All other seeded doubles teams advanced to the quarterfinals, including top-seeded McDaniel and Ellis of LSU, Acker and Dunkin of Florida, Appelbaum and Salganik of Miami, Yeargin and Broughton of Rollins, Morton and Carson of Lamar Tech, Donahue and Mays of Duke and Cloaninger and Preyer of the University of North Carolina.

Doubles quarterfinals matches will start at 1:30 p.m. today and the semifinals will begin at 3:30.
