

## FSU women share lead

TEMPE, Ariz. — Florida State, Odesa of Texas and Pepperdine shared the lead after the first round of the USTA women's collegiate national tennis tournament here Monday.

Mary Ellen Wilkinson, Beth Hinson and Sherri Shores all won their opening matches for the Lady Seminoles, giving Florida State three points in the early going. However, the seeded players (including FSU's Sally Schweppe) all received byes in the first round, and didn't begin play until today.

Temperatures on the courts reached the 103 mark in Monday's opening round, and the forecast called for 107 as the high today.

Wilkinson defeated Lenore Miller of California State in the opening round, and was scheduled to play 11th-seeded Sue Boyle of Arizona State today.

Hinson whipped Delores Payne of Washington 6-3, 6-2 in the opening round, and played Miami's Jodi Applebaum today.

Shores downed Vicki Robinson of the University of Texas at Austin 6-1, 7-5 in the first round, and played Arizona's Debbie Lee today.

Schweppe will see her first action today, facing Oklahoma's Lisa Barra.

## FSU's Shores still alive in singles

TEMPE, Ariz. — Florida State still has one player alive in championship singles and another in consolation singles here in the women's national intercollegiate championships.

Sherri Shores was scheduled to play No. 5 seeded Jean Nachand of California-Irvine next in the championships after beating Debbie Lee of Arizona 6-2, 6-2.

Sally Schweppe lost her opening round championship match, then bounced back in the feed-in consolation to win two matches and remain alive. She lost 6-0, 6-2 to Lisa Barry of Oklahoma State, then beat Kathy Beck of Washington State 6-2, 6-2 and Hilda Goeltz of Mary Baldwin 4-6, 6-2, 6-3.

Beth Hinson, who lost her second-round match to Judy Applebaum of

Miami 6-0, 6-0, came back to beat Helen Vozcmilek of Oregon 6-4, 6-4 before being eliminated by Lindy Mitchell of Texas 6-1, 6-2.

Mary Ellen Wilkinson, who won her first round match with a 6-3, 6-3 verdict over Lynora Miller of Cal State, later lost to No. 11 seed Sue

Boyles of Arizona State 6-0, 6-0 in the second round. She then lost to Meliza Robinson of Texas A&M 6-3, 7-6 in a tie-breaker in the consolation.

The team's sudden success in the tournament has delayed its return to Tallahassee until either Saturday or Sunday.

## *FSU women stand 13th in tennis nationals*

TEMPE, Ariz. — Florida State's women's tennis team stood 13th out of 34 teams with Sally Schweppe the only individual left alive Thursday as of the round of 16 in the AIAW national collegiate tennis tournament.

Schweppe defeated Jamie Bowen of Texas Christian 6-4, 6-4 in Thursday's consolation play and was scheduled to meet Dundee Davis of Florida.

Sherry Shores was finally dropped from the running for the individual title by Jean Nachand of California at Irvine 6-3, 6-4. Shores was then eliminated from consolation play by Penny Johnson of Long Beach State 6-1, 6-1.

Having a busy day, Shores also teamed up with Schweppe to lose a 6-1, 6-1 doubles match to Stacy Bowman and Ann Schroeder of Trinity, and the FSU pair will now go into the consolation round.
