

Seminoles win tennis openers

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Sue Hatch and Lee McGuire, both from the Florida State women's tennis team, won both their opening-day matches Thursday in the Women's Southern Intercollegiate Tennis Championships.

Those championships are a qualifying tournament for the Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches Association's Women Collegiate Indoor National Championships to be held February 8 through 11 in Provo, Utah.

In the singles match, Sue Hatch defeated Grace Fowler (Tulane) 6-2, 5-7, 6-4 and then prevailed to win her second match against T.J. Kleynhans (Austin Peay) 6-2, 6-2.

Lee McGuire, the No. 5 seed in the tournament for FSU, defeated Julie Price (Emory University) 6-1, 6-3.

Lisa Ehrgott (FSU) defeated Jan Martin (Florida) in her first-round match 6-3, 3-6, 6-3 but lost the second match and was eliminated from the tournament by No. 3-seed Jane Forman (Clemson) 6-1, 6-2.

Play continues today with Sue Hatch meeting Lisa Spain (Univ. of Georgia) at 9 a.m. and Lee McGuire meeting Jodie Trucks (Clemson) also at 9 a.m.

FSU's Hatch, McGuire fall in singles

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Florida State's Sue Hatch lost to Georgia's Lisa Spain 6-1, 6-2, and the Lady Seminoles' Lee McGuire lost to Clemson's Jodie Trucks 6-4, 1-6, 6-3 in Friday's single matches in the Women's Southern Intercollegiate Tennis Championships.

The tournament is a qualifying event for the Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches Association Women's Collegiate National Indoor Championships Feb. 8-11 at Provo, Utah.

In doubles, Hatch and McGuire, the No. 4 seeds, bounced back for FSU, stopping Tulane's Lori Kosten and Jane Carroll 6-2, 6-1 in a first-round match.

In the second round, Hatch and McGuire defeated Lynn Cleary and Hillary Warren of Alabama 3-6, 6-3, 6-2.

Hatch and McGuire advance to today's semifinals.
