

Asked about Notre Dame's recruiting of six Floridians this year, Holtz said: "There's no doubt the best football in the country, at the high-school level, is played in the state of Florida."

Holtz was ready for the question on why Notre Dame moved away from the College Football Association's TV plan to sign a lucrative separate contract

with NBC. "First of all, the biggest thing is trying to figure out where to put the peacock on our uniform," quipped Holtz, alluding to NBC's trade-mark symbol.

Corey Fuller, the FSU-bound star of Rickards High, received two club honors - the Offensive Player of the Year Award and the Gene Cox Player of the Year Award.

Lincoln High's Dwayne Bryant received the Defensive Player of the Year Award, and Lincoln's Steve Hardin the Coach of the Year Award.

Steve Williams succeeded Bob Goin as president of the club.
