FAX: 644-3820 Florida State Women's Tennis NCAA Championships Athens, GA May 13-21

NCAA Participants: The Seminoles placed two players in the singles tournament and one team in the doubles portion of the NCAA Championships. Audra Brannon will be making her second consecutive appearance in the singles and doubles tournament. In doubles, Brannon will pair with Elke Juul. Last season, Brannon lost in the first round to Suzi Itailiano of USC in singles. In doubles she teamed with Laura Randmaa and the pair advanced to the quarterfinals of the tournament and became the first All-Americans in FSU women's tennis history.

Lori Sowell, a freshman from Ft. Lauderdale, will compete in the singles tournament. Sowell is the first FSU freshman to be invited to Nationals.

**More than Ever:** The three players that Florida State is sending to the singles and doubles tournaments is the best ever showing for the Seminoles. Previously, FSU only sent two players to Nationals.

A Bit of History: FSU players that competed in past Nationals are:

1983: Jaime Kaplan, singles; Kaplan/Lee McGuire, doubles

1986: Patti Henderson/Sue Hatch, doubles

1993: Audra Brannon, singles; Brannon/Laura Randmaa, doubles

**Two in Top 100:** For the first time in the last five years, Florida State has two players among the top 100 collegiate singles players. Currently, Audra Brannon is 28th, while team-mate Lori Sowell is 54th. Sowell, only a freshman, has done something that no other rookie has done in the recent history and that is be ranked. The first year player out of Ft. Lauderdale, FL first broke into the rankings on March 15 when she placed 69th. After a brief drop to number 79th, Sowell has catapulted to 54th.

Brannon is also ranked in doubles with partner Elke Juul. The pair are currently ranked 11th.

Raking in the Hardware: Florida State swept the Atlantic Coast Conference Awards as Audra Brannon was named Player of the Year, Lori Sowell won the Rookie of the Year award and Alice Reen was named the Coach of the Year.

A three-time all-conference honoree, Brannon compiled a 17-7 overall record including a 7-1 ACC record. Sowell, the number two singles flight champion, put together a 18-5 singles record and a 7-1 ACC mark. Head Coach Alice Reen led the Seminoles to a 15-9 record and its first appearance in the ACC finals.

Competing in her second consecutive NCAA singles and doubles tournament...last season was defeated in the first round by Suzi Italiano of Southern Cal...teamed with Laura Randmaa to reach the quarterfinals of the doubles tournament...earned All-American honors, the first in FSU tennis history...defeated Cecile Verdier of Arizona in the team competition to notch first NCAA singles win...one of the most successful players in the history of Lady Seminole tennis...the Player of the Year in the Atlantic Coast Conference...one of three squad cocaptains...plays number one singles and number one doubles for FSU...a three-time All-ACC selection...earned ACC Flight Champion honors at number one singles and number one doubles with Elke Juul...named the FSU Most Valuable Player...currently is ranked 28th...has beaten #1 Lucie Ludvigova of Texas, #9 Terry Ann Zawacki of Wake Forest and #15 Jen Callen of Virginia and #14 Boba Tzvetkova of Clemson..is 18-7 in dual matches this spring...established a 7-1 mark against ACC foes...amassed a 10-6 record against players in the top 100 this spring...in doubles is ranked 11th with partner Elke Juul...pair are 5-2 against ranked opponents including wins over #6 Durden and King of Clemson, #7 Lyons and Mraz of Duke, #10 Ludvigova and Taylor of Texas, #10 Barker and Evans of Wake Forest and #11 Schofield and Cohen of Virginia...overall is 15-4 in doubles including an 8-0 mark in ACC play.

### Lori Sowell Freshman Ft. Lauderdale, FL (St. Thomas Aquinas) Singles Qualifier

The first FSU freshman to be invited to the NCAA Tournament...stepped right into the number two singles and doubles spots...the Rookie of the Year in the Atlantic Coast Conference...also tabbed to the All-ACC squad...named one of the Most Improved Players on the FSU team...has already eclipsed the 25 win mark...this spring has tallied a 22-8 mark including a 18-6 record in dual competition...has only lost one ACC singles match while winning seven...was the ACC Flight Champion at number two singles...broke into the national rankings on March 15...currently ranked 54th...has beaten four of the last five ranked opponents she has faced including #66 Janice Durden of Clemson, #72 Ly-Lan Schofield of Virginia, #50 Jill Craybas of Texas, #73 Anne Smalt of FlU and #35 Monica Mraz of Duke...has won ten of last thirteen singles matches...paired with Jen Hyde to play number two doubles...recorded a 6-2 mark against ACC competition and a 10-6 overall record...named ACC runner-up flight champions at number two doubles.


