Florida State Women's Tennis Takes All from Hatters

FSU wins in doubles and singles led by senior Anca Dumitrescu who won at number one singles and doubles.

Tallahassee – The Florida State women's tennis team (3-0, 0-0 ACC) won 7-0, beating the Stetson Hatters (1-2, 0-0 Atlantic Sun) on Saturday afternoon at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center in Tallahassee, FL. The Seminoles, on a three-match win streak, swept the doubles area for the second time and the singles are for the third time during the 2004 season.

The Garnet and Gold led off the match with three victories in doubles. At the No. 1 position, senior Anca Dumitrescu (Bucharest, Romania/VCU) and newcomer Lindsay Deason (St. Petersburg, FL/Boca Raton Prep) sweated out the match against the Hatter tandem of Milica Milovanovic and Marina Levin 8-4. Seniors Brooke Cordell (Soddy Daisy, TN/Tennessee) and Christina Denny (Canton, Ohio/Bradenton) rolled, beating their opposition of Beth Hayden and Jackie Bohannon at number two doubles, 8-1. Junior Daniela Gheorghe (Delray Beach, FL/Fresno State) paired with fellow junior Amberly Tantee (Dana Point, CA/Futures) secured the doubles point with an 8-1 win against Jennifer Wisnoski and Ashley Eville

At number one singles, Dumitrescu quickly bested Milica Milovanovic 6-0, 6-1. At the two spot, junior Mihaela Moldovan (Bucharest, Romania/ Emil Racovita) blanked Jackie Bohannon, 6-0, 6-0 for the match win. Deason, who's posted four 6-0 set wins this season, earned the fourth point for FSU, defeating Marina Levin 6-4, 6-0.

At the four spot, rookie Roxanne Clarke (Cape Town, South Africa/Clapham), competing in her first spring singles match of her career, battled Hayden for the win. Clarke, who posted a 10-3 singles record in the fall, won the first set 6-4, then took Hayden to the edge, dropping the set 6-7(6), before picking up the win at the end of the two-hour match, 6-2.

"With Rox, she did a great job," noted FSU head coach Lise Gregory. "Mentally, she did everything I've asked her to do. She stayed very positive and competed extremely well. She could've easily gotten down on herself but she didn't. I was really happy with her first match."

Gheorghe, one of three Tribe members to see their first action at singles this season, won against Wisnoski in two sets, 6-2, 6-2. Junior Natalie Tirapelli (St. Petersburg, FL/Connecticut), defeated Mollman in straight sets, 6-3, 6-2 playing at number six for the first time this season.
