

Prairie View Triumphs; Snider Cops 14 Points

DENTON (SPL) — Prairie View A&M, scoring 84 points, outdistanced UCLA, which was second with 68, to claim the team title at the sixth annual Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women Track and Field Championships.

Prairie View's Andrea Bruce and UCLA's Francie Larrieu, both Olympians, won three individual events each in pacing their teams past Texas Woman's University, the defending national champion, which fell to third place with 47 points.

Baylor finished 11th in the national meet as freshman Suzie Snider scored all of her team's 14 points. Miss Snider finished second in the discus with a 144-foot, 2½-inch throw, took fourth in the shot put (43-10½) and fifth in the high jump (5-6).

Miss Bruce established a meet record in the high jump (6-0), won the long jump (19-5¼) and 100-meter hurdles (13.9) and finished second to teammate Mary Ayers in the 400-meter hurdles, in which both were timed at 1 minute, 1.1 seconds.

Debra Sapenter set records in the 440-yard dash (53.4) and with the Prairie View 880 medley relay team (1:42.3). Miss Ayers added a second place in the 100-meter hurdles, and Prairie View was second in the sprint relay.

Miss Larrieu led UCLA to a one-two-three sweep in the two-mile run with a clocking of 10:56.6, a one-two-five finish in the mile (4:59.4) and set a record in the 880 (2:10.5). Teammate Julie Brown was second in the mile and two-mile and third in the 880, Clare Choate was third in the two-mile and fifth in the mile, and UCLA took second in the 880-medley and mile relays.

One of two TWU units set a record in the sprint relay (46.5), and the other finished sixth. Rochelle Davis won the 100 (10.4), Janet Brown was second in the 100 and took third in the 220, and TWU was third and fifth in the 880 medley relay and added fifths in the 100 and pentathlon.

Los Angeles State, taking fourth place in team standings with 36, had seconds in the 440 and long jump and thirds in the 400-meter hurdles and javelin. Iowa State, fifth with 29 points, won the mile relay in record time (3:55.5), was third in the long jump and fourth in the mile, two-mile and sprint relay.

Lynette Mathews of Seattle-Pacific retained her shot put championship with a 46-9 effort and finished third in the discus, which Iva Wright of Fresno State captured at 147-7.

Other individual winners were Chicago State's Rosalyn Bryant, who ran a 24.3 in the 220, Hayward State's Barbara Pickel, who tossed the javelin 166-2, and Illinois State's Debbie Wilson, who totaled 3,257 points in the pentathlon.
