

Lady Seminoles fourth in track

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — The Florida State women's track team placed in seven events Saturday to finish fourth among 24 schools in the Memphis State Women's Invitational Track and Field Meet.

The Seminoles, who placed behind Kansas State, Tennessee and Tennessee State, earned firsts in the 400-meter hurdles and javelin while staging an excellent performance in the two-mile relay.

Nancy Townsend won the javelin with a toss of 125-3½, while in the hurdles Mary-Catherine Kelly won with a school and meet-record time of 1:01.9, followed by Roz Anderson in fourth at 1:06.3.

The two-mile relay team set a school standard and ran the second fastest time in the country this year as Nancy McCormac, Laura Ledbetter, Leslie Sullivan and Bev Cox ran a quick 9:11.9, finishing right behind Kansas State.

In the discus, Kim Travers was second at 128-11 and Vickie Smith placed fifth at 126-0. The two also

placed high in the shotput, Smith placing third at 44-1 and Travers fourth at 43-8.

The 880-yard medley relay team of Karen Keith, Kim Soergel, Anderson and Kolly placed third with a time of 1:48.1 and the mile relay foursome of Soergel, McCormac, Ledbetter and Sullivan placed sixth in 4:06.2.
