

FSU women win Auburn indoor meet

AUBURN, Ala. — Freshman Rose Giampalmo set two meet records and anchored relay teams to two others Saturday as the Florida State women's track team won the Auburn Invitational indoor track meet.

Giampalmo won in record fashion in the 440-yard dash and 800-yard run. She also raced with the record-setting mile and two-mile relay teams.

Nancy McCormac also set a meet record with her win in the mile as FSU scored 50 points in the meet. Alabama was second with 37 points and the other 12 teams in the meet were far behind.
