

## FSU runners set records

GAINESVILLE — The Florida State women's track team set two school records and met NCAA-meet qualifying standards in three events Saturday in an unscored indoor quad-meet at the University of Florida.

Tennessee and Virginia also participated.

Ovrill Dwyer-Brown set a school record in the 600-meter run. Her time of 1:28.9 placed her third behind Tennessee's Delisa Walton (1:26.58) and Cathy Rattray (1:28.07) and met the qualifying time.

Dwyer-Brown also ran the third leg of the winning and record-setting 4x400-meter relay. Randy Givens, Jennifer White and Angela Wright were the other runners who combined for a 3:41.90 clocking. That qualifies the foursome for the NCAA meet in Pontiac, Mich. in March.

Long-jumper Alice Bennett also met qualifying standards, placing third with a leap of 19-5¾.

Givens also won the 55-meters in 7.07, followed by Wright, fifth in 7.24 and Bennett, sixth in 7.26.

Other high finishers for Florida State were: Wendy Markham, second in high jump (5-7¾); Nancy Rettie, second in 1,500-meters (4:25.14); Carla Borovicka, fifth in 1,500-meters (4:33.3, a personal record) and Tonja Brown, third in 55-meter hurdles (8.2) and fourth in 800-meters (2:15.7).

Others placing were Kelly Hackler, fifth in 800-meters (2:16.3) and Margaret Coomber, second in 1,000-meters (2:50.53).

The 4x800-meters relay of Chris McKay, Scooby Golden, Coomber and Borovicka took second in 9:05.6.
