FSU women fare well in Florida Track Invitational

GAINESVILLE - Opening its indoor track season, Florida State's women's team won four events and would have won the Florida Invitational if it had been a scored meet

Saturday.

Brenda Cliette set a new school record when she won the 55-meter dash in 6.97 seconds. FSU won the first five places in that event. Michelle Finn and Marita Payne tied for second (6.98); Janet Davis was fourth (7.02), and Randy Givens came in fifth (7.10). Cliette, Finn, and Payne each qualified for the NCAA Indoor Meet for that event.

Also setting a new school record was Carla Borovicka in the 1,500 meters (4:24.24). Her first-place finish also qualified her for the NCAA Indoor Meet for the 1,500 meters.

Joanne Brown won the 55-meter hurdles (8.25) and three other Lady Seminole runners came in fourth through sixth. Mary Hawkins was

fourth (8.92), Julie Dorman fifth (9.12), and Anita Byrd placed sixth (9.17).

The "A" relay team of Ovrill Dwyer-Brown, Samantha Green, Chris McKay, and Marita Payne won the 4X400-meter relay (3:47.3). Three other FSU relay teams finished right behind.
