1988 LADY SEMINOLE VOLLEYBALL HIGHLIGHTS

- \*\*\* To close out the 1988 season, Florida State competed in its fourth NCAA post-season playoff match hosting the Colorado State Rams at Tully Gym. Although the home-court advantage was on their side, the Lady Seminoles dropped a four-game match 15-3, 15-5, 9-15, 15-7 to end the season with a 28-8 record. FSU's previous playoff appearances came in 1983, 1985 and 1987.
- \*\*\* To earn its appearance in the NCAA playoffs, Florida State won its fourth consecutive Metro Conference Tournament and fifth in the last six years. The Lady Seminoles entered the tournament tied for first in the Metro race but were seeded second, due to a tiebreaker. In the opening round, FSU defeated Southern Miss in three games and eliminated South Carolina in three games the following night. In the championship game, the Lady Seminoles beat host-team Cincinnati in four games.
- \*\*\* FSU earned several individual honors at the 1988 Metro Tournament as well as the team championship. Selected to the 1988 All-Metro team was junior setter Nancy Gaspadarek, senior middle hitter Deanne Kaleta and sophomore outside hitter Maggie Philgence. The trio also earned awards for their performance during the tournament as Gaspadarek and Philgence were named to the All-Tournament team and Kaleta was chosen the tournament's Most Outstanding Performer. Also, thirteenth year head coach Cecile Reynaud was chosen the Metro Conference Coach of the Year for the first time.
- \*\*\* By finishing the season at 28-8, it gave the Lady Seminoles a .778 winning percentage for the 1988 season. That figure marks the best Florida State season record since the 1983 campaign when the Lady Seminoles finished with a 31-6 record for a .838 winning percentage. To reach its final 28-8 record, FSU finished the season strong winning 20 of its last 22 matches including a streak of 14 wins in a row.
- \*\*\* Three members of Florida State volleyball team were chosen as Metro Conference Player of the Week during the 1988 season. Deanne Kaleta was the first to win the award in late September. Nancy Gaspadarek won the next conference award after the Lady Seminoles won four matches over the course of three days. Maggie Philgence closed out the regular season as the conference player of the week after FSU scored an upset victory over nationally-ranked Kentucky in the Kentucky Wildcat Classic.
- \*\*\* Florida State won its biggest match in the 13-year career of head coach Cecile Reynaud when the Lady Seminoles took a four-game match from the University of Kentucky. It was the first FSU win over a top-ten ranked team, according to Reynaud. The 15-10, 16-14, 13-15, 15-12 also ruined a dramatic final home performance for three Kentucky seniors.
- \*\*\* Florida State's .286 hitting percentage ranked eighth in the AVCA

national rankings for the 1988 season. That mark also led the Metro Conference.

- \*\*\* In FSU's five-game win over Cincinnati on October 28, junior setter Nancy Gaspadarek broke the FSU career set assist record of 2,815 held by Marie Sanders, who played at Florida State from 1980 to 1983. A starter since her freshman year, Gaspadarek averages 36 set assists per match. She holds the FSU single match record of 68 assists, coming in a four-game win over Florida in 1987. Gaspadarek, who missed 12 matches earlier in the season with a broken bone in her hand, will continue to build on the current career record of 3,394 set assists.
- \*\*\* The Lady Seminoles enjoyed a record attendance at Tully Gym in 1988. Following an unprecedented amount of pre-season publicity, more than 700 fans packed Tully for the September 2 opener against Alabama-Birmingham. That number was topped when 1,135 viewed the FSU/Florida matchup on October 24. In 12 home dates, Florida State averaged 419 fans per match.
- \*\*\* Sophomore middle hitter Gabrielle Reece was featured in the October issue of Elle magazine. Reece, a sophomore from Seminole, FL, spent last summer modeling in New York and Europe. She plans to take correspondence courses during the spring semester while modeling, and plans to return to Florida State for the fall 1989 semester and volleyball season. Reece, at 6-3, was FSU leading blocker with an average of 1.27 per game and 171 total blocks.
- \*\*\* Florida State should return just as strong in the 1989 season, losing only Deanne Kaleta from the current lineup. 11 rostered players should return for next year's campaign. Kaleta, a 5-11 middle hitter from Riverside, Illinois finshed the season with a .319 hitting percentage and had a total of 1,195 career kills and 1,083 career digs. Kaleta's 1988 awards included Metro Conference Player of the Week, All-Metro Conference and the Metro Conference Tournament's Most Outstanding Performer.
- \*\*\* FSU volleyball was featured on three Sunshine Network telecasts during the 1988 season. The October 24 match against the Florida Lady Gators, was the first women's athletic event broadcast from Tully Gymnasium. That match and later matches against William & Mary and South Florida were shown in prime time viewing hours to more than two million homes in the state of Florida. The Lady Seminoles were also featured on the syndicated show, World Class Women. Hosted by Randi Hall, the Baton Rouge, LA based program, caught up with Cecile Reynaud and company at an away match with LSU. Highlighted in the piece were sophomores Maggie Philgence and Gabrielle Reece.
- \*\*\* Thirteenth year head coach Cecile Reynaud has been the cornerstone of FSU volleyball. Coming to the FSU campus after graduation from Southwest Missouri State in 1975, she has never experienced a losing season. Her recent success is most impressive. Her Lady Seminoles have taken the last four Metro Conference Tournaments and five of the last six. Reynaud's current FSU record stands at 378-158-1 for a winning percentage of .704. Following the 1988 season, Reynaud was named the Metro Conference Coach of the Year for the first time in her career. A member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) for many years, Reynaud has been voted president-elect for 1988 and will begin her term as President for the 1989-90 year.
