Kentucky puts end to FSU season

LEXINGTON, Ky. — For the fourth consecutive year, the Florida State Lady Seminole volleyball team was eliminated from the NCAA Championship Tournament in the first round, losing in four games to the Kentucky Wildcats on Friday night in Memorial Coliseum.

Kentucky (22-11) took the match by scores of 15-12, 15-10, 10-15, 15-10. FSU closed out its season at 25-10.

In advancing to postseason play, both teams received a second chance after being eliminated early from their respective conference tournaments. FSU lost to Louisville in the Metro semifinals and Kentucky was eliminated in the first round of the SEC tournament by Mississippi.

Kentucky raced to a two-game advantage as FSU held leads of 8-4 in game one and 8-6 in game two before falling behind. In taking the lead in the second game, FSU battled back from a 5-2 deficit before Kentucky scored eight unanswered points to go ahead 13-6.

"We did not seem to have a team flow tonight," said FSU coach Cecile Reynaud. "We had people playing balls that shouldn't have been. Kentucky played

phenomenal defense. They made some great saves that gave them confidence and morale."

The Kentucky defense, which recorded 87 digs, held FSU's main offensive threat, Maggie Philgence, in check as the NCAA Division I fifth all-time kill leader was held to 10 kills and a .077 hitting percentage.

FSU's offensive woes could have been attributed to a knee injury suffered by freshman setter Jennifer McCall in Thursday's practice.

"The sets tonight were so far off the net that our hitters could not get good swings," said Reynaud.

Kentucky, on the other hand, capitalized on the performance of All-SEC setter Laura Linder, who had 63 assists. Another All-SEC performer, outside hitter Cathy DeBuono, led the Wildcats with 23 kills.

"We wanted to pass the ball well enough to put the ball in Laura Linder's hands," said Kentucky coach Kathy DeBoer.

The Lady Seminoles were led by Gabrielle Reece's 17 kills and four blocks, while Bianca Stevens added 10 kills and six blocks.

With the win, Kentucky advances to meet the winner of Friday's Texas-Maryland match.
