MEN'S & WOMEN'S OUTLOOK

With the entry into the Atlantic Coast Conference, the past few years can be labled as "firsts" for the Florida State men's and women's cross country teams. This season will be no different as 1993 will also be labled a "first." This year marks the inaugural season under newly named head coach Scott Irving.

A smooth transition from the former regime to Coach Irving's style is expected. The returning athletes are encouraged and confident about their new program. Coach Irving brings much of both to the Florida State University track program and it appears to be contagious.

Irving has reason to be encouraged. "This group has more ability than they even realize," Coach Irving said of his '93 squad. "It's now a matter of bringing that ability together."

The main goal for this cross country season is to improve from last year's successes and make an impact on the upper level of the Atlantic Coast Conference. What many people do not realize is that the ACC is the top cross country conference in the country. Most schools in the conference put most of their scholarships and energy into their distance programs.

Not FSU. The Seminole track and cross country program is more balanced, prefering to spread their successes throughout the entire program. Despite this fact, Coach Irving still believes that this team can be competitive and surprise the upper echelon of the conference.

"Everything might not fall together right away," Irving said of this year's prospects. "But we are definitely on our way. I think things will come together for this team. They certainly can accomplish a lot this season."

The men's squad is a young team with most of their talent lying in the middle distance. Mark Grey, Mike Hampton and Tim Middlekoop are all extremely talented at the mid-distances. They have been increasing their base this summer.

The women's team needs their sixth and seventh runners to make strides toward closing the gap between themselves and the top group.



This is critical to the squad's success.

Ian Potter and Hampton return to lead the men in '93. They will be closely followed by Jason Kaiser, Grey, Craig Maguire and Middlekoop. Any of the six can emerge as the team leader. As always, trading off between leaders is a good indication that your team is improving.

Stacey Bowrosen, Tracy Pepoon and Karla Severs lead the charge for the women. All three have the potential to be an All-Conference performer. Lisa Beck, Holly Higgins and Kerry White could not only surprise their teammates, but the ACC as well.

Top newcomers David Ogletree and Grey both bring national meet experience which may eliminate the "first timer" lapses that come with first year athletes.

As with every program, the Florida State cross country team's first priority is to be able to compete at the top level of the conference. Once that is accomplished the national rankings will take care of themselves. "It's a matter of our team believing they belong competing at that conference level," Coach Irving said. "If they eventually beleive they can compete, than any successes are attainable!"

HEAD COACH

SCOTT IRVING

Scott Irving returns to the Sunshine State after a four year hiatus at the University of Illinois. A veteran coach, Irving enters his first season as a member of the Seminole track and field coaching staff. Irving will direct all aspects of the cross country program in the fall and handle the middle and long distances runners as well as javelin throwers in the spring.


Although a newcomer to Tallahassee, Irving is not new to track and field, or the state of Florida. Coach Irving brings well deserved credentials to Florida State University. He has directed countless conference champions, over 30 NCAA All-Americans, six national champions, numerous national team members and two Olympians, in a coaching career that spans nearly two decades.

Irving began his coaching career in the heart of distance running country at the University of Oregon (1977-83). He received cross country instruction from noted distance coach Bill Dellinger, and was as assistant track and field coach with the women's program.

Coach Irving's next stint was at the University of Florida (1983-89), where he assisted Dr. Lyle Knudson with the women's cross country program that captured the '85 SEC title. From Florida, Irving joined the Fighting Illini in the fall of '89 as the field events coach/recruiting coordinator. While at Illinois he recruited noted pole vault coach Chris Leeuwenburgh who, in turn, recruited 1993 NCAA indoor 800m and outdoor 1500m champion Marko Koers.

A recepient of two master's degrees, the 1973 Willamette University graduate places the pursuit of academic excellence an upmost priority. Oregon athletes annually dotted the dean's list. Athletes that were coached or recruited by Irving at Florida made All-SEC Academic teams 40 times. Phenomenonally, in two out of only four years at Illinios he had athletes awarded the most prestigious accolade, the Big Ten Medal of Honor, for academic/athletic excellence.

Irving and his wife, Allyn, have been married for twenty years and have two sons, six-year old Shannon and Kevin, three.



Ian Potter—Begins '93 season in good form after struggling last year...will vie for the squad's top honors...has potential to raise his performance to the top level of the conference...improved attitude can vault him to that level...strong Canadian cross-country runner...sat out the '92 season while redshirting...finished sixth at the Canadian Junior Nationals...his Ottawa Lion Track Club team finished first in that meet.



David Ogletree—Brings fine credentials from high school level...a local prospect that FSU was fortunate to keep in Tallahassee...long term potential is limitless...an All-State selection out of Lincoln High...named the Tallahassee Democrat's Athlete of the Year.



Mark Grey—A prototype national class runner...possesses body type, running form and temperment to attain national success...ready to step up to the next level of competition...a quality runner at the middle distances...question mark lies in his ability to handle the longer distances...spent past two years at Coffeyville (Kansas) J.C.



Tim Middlekoop—Placed third at the Canadien Nationals this summer in the 800m in 1:48.06...increased stock at 800m not only in conference, but nationally...ability to succeed needs to be carried over to the longer distances...may emerge as a surprise athlete later in the season...will be his first season running with FSU's X-C team...a highly successful high school athlete out of Ontario, Canada.

Stacey Bowrosen—Tremendous awareness of what it takes to reach higher levels...has a strong background in dietetics and fitness that should help this season...possesses a good work ethic and a deep desire to see the team excell...ran second on the team while helping team to fifth place finish at the '92 ACC meet...ran a season best18:46 at the NCAA District III meet...one of the top performers on squad during '91 season...finished second in the Georgia Tech, North Florida dual meet; and sixth at the Barnett Bank Invitational where she ran a season best 18:35...an All-County and All-State selection out of Father Lopez High.



Holly Higgins—A surprise runner for this year's team...has the right body type for distance running...improvement as the season progresses will be a key factor for the team's outcome at the ACC Championships...has already made significant improvements from last year...ran a season best 20:06 at the '92 Florida Intercollegiate championships...recorded a personal best 19:25 for a 5K at the UNC- Charlotte Invitational for UNC-Charlotte...a two-time JuCo All-American while at Brevard Junior College in the 3,000 meter run and the 3,200 relay.



Tracy Pepoon--Had a fantastic season on the track that should carry over to X-C...one of the team's top returnees...will vie for top team honors again this season...strength lies on the distance...returns much stronger than previous seasons...strong track athlete in the 5,000 and 10,000 meters that carries over to cross-country...ran a season best 18:57 at the conference meet...hopes to improve on that mark at this year's ACC meet...a former high school All-State athlete out of Ft. Walton Beach High.



Karla Severs—possesses a never say die attitude...a relentless pusher...drive tends to be infectious to other team members...actions speak volumes and adds important dimension to team...possesses foot speed...team captain in '92...was consistently one of the team's top performers...took top team honor's at the Georgia State Invitational...missed '91 season with a foot injury...a '90 letter winner...took top team honors at the Georgia State Invitational that year...highly successful track athlete and an Indoor All-American in1990...Florida state Cross Country runner-up and two-time 880 yard state champ for Astronaut High.
