

# #40 Randy Allen




Forward 6-8, 222, Senior Milton, FL

Kennedy on Allen:

"Randy is one of our senior leaders and we look for him to emerge as the premier forward in our conference and one of the nation's finest."

Already the 18th leading career scorer in Florida State history with 1,062 points...a two-time second team All-Metro pick...also a member of FSU's 500 career rebound club with 501 to his credit...his career scoring average currently stands at 12.5 points per game and his rebounding at 5.0...has shot 50.1 percent from the field...needs six steals and 19 blocks to come up with 100 in each category for his career...will be an important season coming up for the senior foward...he's listed as the nation's #17 power forward by The Sporting News' pre-season magazine...has put on about 15 pounds which should help him weather the pounding of the inside game...Allen was built to play basketball...has a vertical jump that sends him 20 inches over the rim.

As a Junior (1985-86): Although it was a disappointing year for Allen and his fans, he still was selected to the Metro Conference second team as well as the National Association of Basketball Coaches' first team for District 6...squad's second leading scorer with a 13.7 average and the top rebounder with 6.2 per game...both of those were off his sophomore averages, as was his shooting percentage...it dipped to an un-Allen-like 46.1 percent...had 30 blocks, his most at FSU, and 32 steals...after a hot start where he averaged 18.4 points in the first five games, injured an ankle in a practice session at Alabama...he missed two games and tried to play at North Carolina, but the bothersome ankle plagued him for most of the season...probably his top performance came in the last regular season game against South Carolina when he hit 11 of 14 floor shots for 24 points, had seven rebounds and five steals...his season high of 25 points came early in the season against Western Carolina...chosen Metro Conference Player of the Week for Tampa and Florida games...scored in double figures in 20 of the 27 games he played in and led the FSU squad seven times in scoring and eight times in rebounding...had four blocked shots in two different games...his career high of 14 rebounds came against New Orleans and was also a season-high for the FSU squad...34 dunks gives him a career total of 77.



As a Sophomore (1984-85): Made second team all-Metro Conference in just his second season, one of only two underclassmen in the conference to do so...scored in double figures in all but four games while averaging 15.2 points and 6.8 rebounds per game...had eight games where he scored 20 or more points...top game came against Memphis State in a regionally televised matchup where he had 31 points, 27 of those in the first half, nine rebounds, one assist, one block, one steal and four dunks...he shot 14-21 in that contest and was named the conference's Player of the Week...on the season, shot 53.1 percent



from the field and totaled 37 steals and 28 blocks...turned the ball over just once every 20.9 minutes...started 27 games and one other game he did not start because of a foot injury...led Florida State in scoring in eight games and was the leading rebounder in seven games...shot just 61.4 percent from the line during the season...high rebound game of the year was the 13 he totaled the first time FSU met Jacksonville...had a team-leading 34 dunks...made the USA-ABA all-star team that played exhibition games in Yugoslavia and then played in the annual World Cup Team Championships in Spain.

As a Freshman (1983-84): Started 30 of 31 games and missed the one with a finger injury...averaged 8.5 points and 4.9 rebounds...blocked 23 shots, second on the squad, and was also second in dunks with nine...named to Metro Conference all-freshman team and was also chosen honorable mention freshman All-American...had lowest ratio of turnovers-to-minutes, committing just one turnover every 23 minutes...best games came against Louisville (16 points, 10 rebounds) and N.C. State (18 points, seven rebounds)...shot well from the field, hitting 51.7 percent of his shots...that FG percentage was better than his foul shooting percentage (50.7)...spent the summer following his freshman season playing basketball in Yugoslavia, Italy and Ireland as a member of the Nike-N.I.T. all-star squad...all the competition was against Olympic national teams.

High School: Considered by many to be the number two player in the state as a senior...averaged 22.3 points and 8.5 rebounds for Milton High School while shooting 59.5 percent from the field...led his team to a 22-5 record...individual honors included first team 2A all-state, Adidas All-American South squad and honorable mention Converse All-American...led his team to the state semi-finals as a junior...following his senior year, played on Team Florida AAU squad that won the National Junior Olympic Championship...Allen had 19 points and 12 rebounds and scored the winning shot in double overtime in the championship game.

# #20 Pee Wee Barber



### Guard 5-11, 175, Senior Harrisonburg, VA


### Kennedy on Barber:

"Pee Wee is one of the nation's most talented guards and we look for him to be a legitimate candidate for the 1987 Naismith Award."

The Seminoles' bump-and-run guard who never slows down . . . looks small but plays big . . . a fine ball handler and shooter who has established himself as one of the top returning scorers at guard in the country . . . although Barber is a natural second guard where he can score more effectively, he has been used at point guard . . . could become FSU's third two-year 1,000 point club member.

As a Junior (1985-86): In his first season at Florida State, led the team in scoring (16.8 per game), assists (5.0 per game) and steals (1.8 per game) while being asked to play point guard . . . finished third on the Metro Conference scoring list, topped only by Virginia Tech's Dell Curry and Memphis State's William Bedford, both who are gone to the NBA . . . Barber's assists also ranked third and his steals were tied for fourth . . . shot 50.7 percent from the floor and 76.5 from the line . . . scored in double figures in all but four games and scored over 20 points in 16 of the squad's 29 games . . . his best series was the Metro Conference Tournament where he was named to the fiveman all-tournament team and was the MVP runnerup to Louisville's Pervis Ellison . . . Barber averaged 24 points for the two games while handing out seven assists and shooting 57.4 percent from the floor . . it was his last second 24-foot jump shot in the first round vs. Virginia Tech that enabled FSU to reach the semi-finals . . . in that game vs. Memphis State, he hit a 12-footer at the first half buzzer to draw within two points . . . but FSU fell two points shy when it was all over . . . scored a personal high of 27 points twice, including a brilliant performance in FSU's upset of fourth-ranked Memphis State at home where he scored 21 points in the second half . . . also had a fine game at Alabama with 23 points, five rebounds, 10 assists (tied for the FSU season high) . . . his total of 146 assists on the season tied for 12th best in a single season by a Seminole . . . Barber's overall consistency shows up in comparison of his overall stats vs. his Metro Conference stats: scoring (16.8 to 16.9), field goal percentage (50.7 to 51.8) and free throw percentage (76.5 to 72.2).

# #31 Tony Carter



Guard 6-4,185, Junior Pensacola, FL

Kennedy on Carter:

"Tony will have to be ready when needed and he has that great attitude necessary for a role player."

A big second guard, Carter will be contributing off the bench in 1986-87...one of the best leapers on the squad, he isn't afraid to go to the boards and mix it up...has quickness and plays hard...has become a crowd favorite with that all-out play.

As a Sophomore(1985-86): Tony did play in 13 games but logged less than 50 minutes of playing time...at one point in the season was part of "Team 2" when FSU rotated five fresh men into the game replacing the starters...scored six points on two occasions–vs. California (Pa.) and New Orleans at home...in that game he hit 2 of 3 shots from the floor and 2 of 2 from the line and pulled down a rebound in three minutes of play...his most floor time (12 minutes) came in a home win over Miami where he had four points, one rebound and a blocked shot...averaged 1.9 points for the season.

As a Freshman (1984-85): Earned more playing time as the season progressed and made appearances in 14 games...averaged 1.7 points with a career high of seven coming against Florida International...was the Seminoles' youngest player, turning 18 shortly after classes began.

High School: Averaged 17.9 points and 9.1 rebounds while leading his school to a number seven ranking in the state his senior season...made first team 3A all-state as well as *Orlando Sentinel's* prestigious "Sweet 16" list...also picked up *Pensacola News Journal's* all-Northwest Florida honors his junior and senior seasons...averaged 17 points and nine rebounds as a junior.

# #42 Raleigh Choice



Center 6-10, 210, Senior Bainbridge, GA

Kennedy on Choice:

"Raleigh's scoring, size and experience will be a great asset to our team during the long haul."

Florida State's leading candidate to take up the starting duties at the center position . . . has a good shooting touch and a nice turnaround jumper on the baseline . . . needs to be more aggressive on positioning and on the offensive boards . . . excellent foul shooter . . . very fluid and smooth for a big man.

As a Junior (1985-86): Missed the first four games of the season after sitting out as a transfer . . . one of five players who scored in double figures, averaging 10.0 points as the sixth man . . . did start nine of the 24 games he played in . . . had the second best mark on the squad in foul shooting with his 79.9 percentage . . . that mark was the eighth best in the Conference . . . 14 blocks were the squad's third best mark as was his 4.5 rebounding average . . . had FSU's biggest scoring night of the season when he poured in 31 points against Southern Miss while collecting nine rebounds . . . had 20 points and seven rebounds in his other big outing vs. Virginia Tech on the road . . . scored in double figures in just 12 games and was over 20 points just twice, but still was able to average 10.0 for the year . . . statistics show that Choice played just a little better in Metro Conference games, averaging 10.6 points, 4.2 rebounds and shooting 54.2 percent from the floor and 80.0 at the line . . . those statistics include the Metro Conference Tournament, where Choice had just three points and two rebounds in two games.

As a Sophomore (1983-84): Started in 22 of Middle Tennessee's 27 games, averaging 9.2 points and 5.6 rebounds ...totaled 20 blocked shots on the year and shot 72.9 percent from the line . . . high scoring game against Georgia College where he had 20 points, his career high . . . top rebounding game was 14 against Austin-Peay . . . was a teammate of FSU guard LaRae Davis at Middle Tennessee.

As a Freshman (1982-83): Became a starter in January and started 18 of his team's 27 games . . . averaged 8.6 points and 3.0 rebounds . . . 16 blocked shots on the season . . . top game came against Youngstown with 20 points and seven rebounds . . . originally had signed with Clemson but never played there.

High School: He and FSU guard LaRae Davis led Bainbridge High School to the state semi-finals . . . averaged 15 points and 10 rebounds as a junior and 10 points and six rebounds as a sophomore. 

# #14 LaRae Davis



Guard 6-0, 177, Senior Bainbridge, GA

### Kennedy on Davis:

"LaRae along with being such a fine young man, can look to emerge as one of the nation's finest three point shooters.


When the three-point shot was voted in, LaRae Davis began licking his chops in Tallahassee...definitely Florida State's best outside shooter from the long range...a streak shooter who can't miss when he's hot...consistenly accurate foul shooter and also a slick rebounder who picks up a lot of loose balls off the boards...his only weakness would be inconsistency between his big scoring games...underwent arthroscopic surgery on his knee during the off season but is back at 100 percent.

As a Junior (1985-86): Although he had to wait through four games before he got to suit up for FSU he was a starter by the sixth game...put together a fine shooting percentage of 54.4 while hitting a team leading 80.8 percent of his foul shots...at one point in the season hit 21 consecutive free throws...his field goal percentage was the fourth best in the Metro...averaged an eye opening 4.4 rebounds and was second on the team in assists with 97 (3.9 per game)-fifth best in the conference...also collected 32 steals...his best game came in a home win over fourth-ranked Memphis State where he had 21 points and a team high nine rebounds...was in double figures in scoring in 16 games and had 20 points or more five . . . pulled down seven or more rebounds in six games, too...took the last shot of the 1985-86

season, just missing an 18-foot shot that rimmed out, and would have sent FSU into overtime with Memphis State in the Metro semi-finals.

As a Sophomore (1983-84): Was the starting guard for Middle Tennessee, averaging 11.8 points and 2.9 rebounds . . . shot 81.1 percent from the line and handed out 69 assists . . . top scoring game against Murray State when he had 26 points . . . had 10 rebounds vs. Georgia State . . . although MTSU was beaten soundly by Memphis State, Davis scored 18 points vs. the Metro Conference school . . . led his team in scoring in 10 games . . . named to the alltournament teams at the Wendy's and Coca Cola Classics.

As a Freshman (1982-83): Started all 27 games, averaging 35 minutes of playing time per game . . . led team in scoring at 11.1 points and 4.1 rebounds while playing the wing position . . . shot 70.7 percent from the free throw line . . . paced team in assists (74) and steals (27) . . . career high of 28 points came in the last game of the season vs. Eastern Kentucky . . . over the season, made 14 three point goals.



High School: Averaged 21.4 points as a senior and was named the team MVP . . . was also picked as the MVP his sophomore (26 ppg) and junior (24 ppg) seasons . . . played in the state semi-finals while at Bainbridge . . . teammate of Raleigh Choice there, who he would go on to sign with at Clemson, transfer to Middle Tennessee with and end up with at Florida

# #23 Jerome Fitchett



Forward 6-7, 182, Junior Perry, FL

### Kennedy on Fitchett:

"Jerome will once again be called upon to do a little bit of everything for the Seminoles, which he does with a great effort and attitude."

He's the kind of player you don't notice—he stays in the background but yet is a model of consistency...takes few shots, but makes most of them and presently stands as the second best shooter in FSU history with a 61.3 percentage...the most shots he's taken in a Seminole uniform is 13 in one game...he needs just seven points to reach 500 for his career...his career scoring average stands at 8.5 points while his rebounding mark is 4.1...has excellent leaping ability...he's second to Randy Allen in minutes logged in an FSU uniform.

As a Sophomore (1985-86): Fitchett was the only player to start all 29 games for the Seminoles...continued his steady high percentage shooting and canned 61.5 percent of his shots, the seventh best mark for a season in FSU history...also led the Metro Conference easily...averaged 10.2 points and 4.5 rebounds per game...his statistics back up his all-around play: 31 assists, 32 steals and 24 blocked shots...averaged just under 30 minutes playing time...best showings were a 22-point, eight rebound outing at Miami and a 19-point, nine rebound day at Cincinnati...his 22 points vs. Miami were a personal high for the year and his second best point total at FSU...had a career-high 10 rebounds along with 10 points vs. Virginia Tech on the road...scored in double figures 18 times.


