




Records





Florida State basketball has long been known for its potent offensive attack and Pat Kennedy has managed to continue that trend since he took over the program five years ago. In fact, the 1988-89 team, which finished 22-8 on the season, set a Metro Conference

team, which linished 22-8 on the season, set a Metro Conference record averaging better than 91 points per game. Interestingly, Florida State has had 17 players score 500 or more points in a season during its basketball history. Of those 17 athletes, five of them reached the milestone during Kennedy's tenure. George McCloud and Tony Dawson scored more than 500 twice, while Pee Wee Barber, Tharon Mayes and Irving Thomas made the list during their seasons. their senior seasons.

Kennedy's four years at FSU have produced a wide range of points-per-game averages. His first team averaged 83.7 points per game during the 1986-87 season. The 1987-88 version of the Tribe averaged 84.3 points and the 1988-89 squad had the conference record 91.3 per game average. Last season, the Seminoles averaged just 76.6 points. The average during Kennedy's stint at FSU is 84.0 points per game.







The Metro Conference: A National Leader

ffective leadership and aggressive promotion have become the trademarks of the Metro Conference administration, while the accomplishments of its athletic teams are now recognized in all sports. Fourteen league championships are decided in the men's sports of baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, swimming and diving, tennis and track and field, and in the women's sports of basketball, cross country, golf, swimming and diving, track and field, tennis and volleyball.

The Metro Conference, originally called the Metro Six, was formed on June 13, 1976. Charter members included the University of Cincinnati, Georgia Tech, Louisville, Memphis State, St. Louis and Tulane University.

Recognition came quickly, due largely to the excellent basketball tradition at each school. In unprecedented fashion, the Metro was awarded automatic qualification for the NCAA Basketball Tournament on September 22, 1975. No other conference had become an immediate qualifier for the postseason event in its first year of existence. Since then, Georgia Tech and St. Louis have withdrawn their membership. Tulane, which withdrew from the Metro in 1985, re-entered the league as of September 1, 1989 and joined Florida State, South Carolina, Southern Mississippi and Virginia Tech in the eight-member conference.

On August 5, 1987, Ralph McFillen was named commissioner of the Metro Conference, succeeding Steven J. Hatchell. Hatchell had served since 1983 when he replaced Larry Albus, the league's first commissioner.

In addition to Tulane's re-admission, the Metro has experienced significant growth during McFillen's term. Member institution's chief executive officers have become more integrated in the governance of the conference, and the league has established a compliance program committed to better-service the schools in adhering to NCAA rules and regulations. An annual distribution of television revenue among Metro institutions has also gone into effect under McFillen's leadership.

Academics has remained the No. 1 priority for the Metro's member schools. In 1990, a record 605 student athletes were named to the Commissioner's list, indicative of above-average grade point averages (3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale) achieved during the academic year. The list was incepted in 1983.

The Metro Conference has also continued to stress a commitment to aggressive promotion. The league newspaper, Metro News, is the only bi-monthly (during basketball season) conference publication, which is distributed 15 times each year. In addition, the Metro Conference Sports Writers and Broadcasters Association (MCSWBA), formed in July, 1984, assists in publicizing the league's accomplishments.

The Metro mystique came to fruition in 1979-80. Led by player-of-theyear, Darrell Griffith, Louisville won the NCAA Basketball Championship with a 59-54 victory over UCLA. With that win, the Metro became the first conference to capture a national title after only five years in existence.

The 1985-86 season was highlighted by Louisville's second national title in six years. With the victory, Denny Crum became the only coach to have won the title twice in the 1980s, until Indiana's Bobby Knight matched the feat at the conclusion of the 1986-87 season. Southern Mississippi contributed to the Metro annals in 1987 when the Golden Eagles captured the National Invitation Tournament title.

Only twice in the last 15 years has the Metro not advanced at least two teams into the NCAA Tournament. The league has been represented in the Final Four five times in the last 10 years. Overall, the Metro Conference has produced two national champions and five regional winners, while earning a 39-30 (.525) record in NCAA Tournament play.

The quality of play in the conference has been consistently high-lighted at the national level. In 1989, the Metro placed a record four teams (Florida State, Louisville, Memphis State and South Carolina) in the NCAA Tournament. The conference boasted back-to-back Basketball Weekly "Rookie Coaches of the Year," in 1987 and 1988, when Memphis State's Larry Finch garnered national honors followed by Virginia Tech's Frankie Allen. Players in the conference have also added to the nation's spotlight. In addition to Griffith being named College Player of the year in 1980, his Louisville teammate Rodney McCray was selected to represent the United States on the 1980 Olympic basketball squad. Virginia Tech's Bimbo Coles was the first Metro player to actually play in the Olympic Games (the 1980 games were boycotted by the U.S.) when he travelled to Seoul, South Korea, in the summer of 1988.

The Metro has continued to supply the National Basketball Association with talent, as well. Louisville center Felton Spencer emerged as a first-round pick (sixth overall) in the 1990 NBA draft after the league surrendered three first-rounders in 1989, including the Cardinal's Pervis Ellison, who was picked first overall.

The Metro Conference has served as host for NCAA Tournament action throughout its 15 year history. In 1984, the league served as host for the Midwest Regional in St. Louis. The following year and again in 1987 and 1989, the conference hosted the first and second rounds of the East (1985) and Southeast (1987, 1989) regionals. The 1986 Southeast Regional also came under the direction of the Metro, which also will serve as host of the 1991 Southeast subregion.
