

# SEMINOLE SMOKE SIGNALS

FIORIDA STATF, which played in the 1957 College World Series, is making its sixth appearance in the last seven years as an at-large entry in the NCAA District 3 playoff. In its five previous NCAA tournament appearances (1956-57-58-59-61), FSU has compiled an 8-11 record for a .421 percentage that ranks the Seminoles 47th among 97 college that have competed for the national collegiate baseball championship since 1947.

With 11 lettermen on hand this year, Coach Danny Litwhiler's Seminoles won 17 of 28 regular-season games, defeating Georgia, Georgia Tech, Navy, Clemson, Furman, Miami, Duke, North Carolina, North Carolina State, Georgia Southern, Florida Southern, and

top-ranked Florida.

The Seminoles' longest winning streak was five games, occurring twice during the season. The longest losing streak was two, also occurring twice. The Tribe won four one-run decisions while losing two. Three of the one-run decisions were extra inning affairs with the Seminoles winning all three.

Of the 23 players on FSU's tournament roster, nine are sophomores, eight are juniors, and six are seniors. The six seniors—Bob Madison, Hal Mangin, Doug French, George Fergusson, Ray McShane, and Jack Ross—played in last year's District 3 tourney.

Nine school records were broken during the regular season. The team set records in hits (307), doubles (47), home runs (27), runs allowed (178) and double plays (31). Individually, leftfielder Billy Williamson (.378) set the record for hits (45) and home runs (8). Catcher Buddy Teagle (.354) set a doubles mark by hitting ten. Shortstop Woody Woodward (.372) snapped an old mark by getting 110 assists and also figured in 18 of the Tribe's 31 double plays. Teagle and Williamson are juniors while Woodward is a sophomore.

The Seminoles "W & W" boys (Williamson and Woodward) lead the Tribe in nine of 11 offensive categories. The only categories they do not lead are doubles and walks. Teagle leads in doubles (10) and senior co-captain, Bob Madison, leads in walks (22). Williamson leads the club in seven categories—at-bats (119), hits (45), home runs (8), total bases (80), stolen bases (11), runs-batted—in (28) and average (.378). Woodward is tied with Billy in runs (29) and leads the club in triples (5). Woodward hit safely in the Seminoles' first 16 games while Williamson has hit safely in the last 17 games.

FSU, now in its 15th year of baseball, has never had a losing season. Litwhiler's eight teams have a sparkling 157-65 (.707) record. The all-time Seminole record is 245-

117-1 (.677).

### COACH DANNY LITWHILER

Florida State is fortunate in having one of college baseball's most dynamic and imaginative coaches.

Danny Litwhiler has not only led the Seminoles to a .707 (157-65) winning percentage in his eight years of coaching at FSU, but he has come up with ideas which have helped college baseball as well as major and minor league baseball.

The popular Tribe skipper has led Florida State baseball teams to six District 3 playoffs in the last seven years. The Seminoles went to the College World Series in 1957.

Litwhiler played 10 years in the National League with the St. Iouis Cardinals, Philadelphia Phillies, Cincinnati Reds and the old Boston Braves. Danny went down in the books for several outstanding performances before retiring as an active player in 1950. He batted safely in 21 straight games in his first major league season. He belted a home run in every National League park in 1941.

In 1942, he became the first major league player to play a complete errorless season. He handled 317 chances in 151 games that year and over a period of two seasons set a record of playing 187 consecutive games without an error. The glove Litwhiler used in that string is retired in baseball's Hall of Fame at Cooperstown, N. Y.

In 1942 and 1943, Danny tied a National League record for the most years leading in fielding percentage by an outfielder appearing in 100 or more games.

After retiring as an active player, Danny coached with Cincinnati in 1051 and has managed minor league clubs at Wilkes-Barre, Pa; Jamestown, F.Y.; Duluth, Minn.; and Fargo, N. D.

His long-range hits have beaten the American League in the past few years in the Oldtimers Game at St. Petersburg. Litwhiler, 45, was born in Ringtown, Pa.

During the past few seasons, scores of Seminole players have signed with major league clubs the majority signing only after graduation. One of Litwhiler's prodigies, 145-pound shortstop Dick Howser of West Palm Beach, was named captain of the Kansas City Athletics last year and responded by hitting .280 (leading average for regular American League shortstops) while just being nosed out for American League "Rookie of the Year" honors. Howser was named to the NCAA's first-team All-America squad in both 1957 and 1958 and was team captain his senior year. In 1959, FSW's Bob Clem won a second-team All-America spot as a second baseman and last season Jack Dull won a third-team All-America spot for the same position.

# TRAINER DON FAULS

Personable Don (Doc) Fauls, a native of Ithaca, N. Y., has been with the Seminoles since 1954. The Tribe trainer is no **strenger** with baseball aches and pains as he is no stranger to North Carolina or Omaha, Neb.

Fauls was trainer for the Greensboro Patriots of the South carolina Baseball League before joining the St. Louis Cardinal chain as tainer for the Omaha club.

Not only is Fauls an outstanding trainer but he also serves as an "exofficio" member of the coaching staff. Don works with the Seminole mound staff
as well.

Fauls worked at the Gilmore Clinic in Greensboro. Don was graduated from Ithaca College in 1948 with a degree in physio-therapy and began his professional work with a hospital in Bath, N. Y.

# SPENCER ROSS--SEMINOLE SFORTLIGHT

Spencer Ross, the "voice" of the Seminoles, comes to Florida State University by way of New York City. A senior at the university, he originally came to FSU to play basketball and instead found himself with a microphone in his hands.

Spencer has been the play-by-play announcer of all Florida State basketball and baseball games for the past two seasons.

This season the baseball games are being broadcasted over radio station WTAL in Tallahassee as they have been for the past two seasons.

# CATCHER BUDDY TEAGLE

When it comes time to select All-America candidates you look at batting averages, power, speed, good arm, etc.

The Seminoles' "W & W" boys have those qualifications and more. The Tribe's answer to the Yanks' "M & M" boys, Billy Williamson and Woody Woodward have the batting average, the power, the speed and the arm to make them worthy candidates.

"Williamson and Woodward are as good as any four and five hitters in college baseball," says Coach Litwhiler. "They have power, good speed and all the tools it takes to be great ballplayers."

Williamson leads the Seminoles in hits (45), home runs (8), total bases (80), stolen bases (11) and runs-batted-in (28). The hits and home runs are new school records. Billy leads the Tribe hitters with a .378 batting average.

The rugged leftfielder started out the season at second base, figuring in 13 of the Tribe's school record 31 double plays for the season. When called on to take over in left field the speedy junior made the switch with ease because he came to the Seminoles as an outfielder from St. Petersburg Junior College. Williamson has hit safely in the last 17 Seminole games.

Woody Woodward, the second half of the "W & W" boys, hit safely in the first 16 Tribe contests this year, hitting .470 during that span. A mid-season slump dropped him around the .370 mark which he has been able to maintain since.

"Woodward is as good as Dick Howser was as a sophomore and maybe better because he has more power," says Litwhiler. The 6-2 sophomore is leading the Seminoles in triples (5) and tied Williamson with runs scored (29). The bespectacled shortstop is close behind Williamson in hits (42) and runs-batted-in (27).

Woody closely resembles Marty Marion with his fielding. He has set a www Seminole mark in assists (110), while fielding .920. Woodward figured in 18 of the Tribe's 31 double plays.

# FSU'S 1962 ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATES

"Teagle (catcher Buddy) is one of the best backstops in college baseball; he is a fine receiver and has a great arm," says Litwhiler of the junior catcher.

Buddy is hitting at a .354 clip, setting a school record for the number of doubles (10) in one season. Teagle has the size (6-4, 220) to be one of the fine receivers in baseball. The Tribe receiver started slow at the plate last season but came along steadily during the season, raising his average to .308.

Teagle hit .600 (6 for 10) in last year's District III playoff in Gastonia. The massive junior took part in seven double plays this year.
