For the 10th consecutive year, many Florida State baseball games can be heard live on WTNT-FM (94.9). In 1990 WTNT, or its AM counterpart, WYYN (1270) will carry 35 regular season games, both home and away, giving the Seminoles one of the most extensive college baseball radio packages in the nation.

WTNT, a powerful 100,000 watt station, broadcasts Seminole baseball action across North Florida and South Georgia. This year, highlights of the package are FSU's series with Arizona, Florida, Miami, Tulane, Southern Miss and South Carolina. The station will also follow the Seminoles to the Metro Conference Tournament in

Hattiesburg, Miss. and into the postseason.

Tallahassee radio newsman Lee
Bowen takes over play-by-play chores for
the first time in 1990. Bowen continues a
long association with the Seminole radio
networks. He serves as the engineer for
FSU's football and basketball broadcasts,
and has also worked as a statistician for the

In addition to the 35 games on WTNT, other Seminole home games will be broadcast on WVFS-FM (89.7). Florida State's student-run radio station will be handling 13 broadcasts, the second year the station has aired FSU baseball games.

### TELEVISION

The Sunshine Network, Florida's most successful sports cable network, will feature exciting Florida State baseball throughout the spring. Broadcasting to 2.5 million homes in Florida, the network takes Florida State baseball to all corners of the state.

But the exposure doesn't stop there, because Sunshine is part of the Prime Network family, an affiliation of regional sports networks nationwide. Through this affiliation, the FSU Seminoles have the potential to reach an audience of 11 million households in 14 states around the country. It's programming reaches to New Mexico, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Louisiana and Colorado in addition to Florida. Its growth from an initial subscriber base of 1.5 million has led to its current ranking as the third largest regional sports network in the country.

In 1989, Sunshine will air seven regular season FSU baseball games, highlighted by contests with Miami, Arizona and Florida.

FSU will also gain national television exposure at the ABCA Hall of Fame Tournament as both of its games there will be televised by ESPN. Florida State and North Carolina kick off ESPN's collegiate baseball season Feb. 10.
