Second team Freshman All-American by Baseball America in 1990...top returning starter on the FSU pitching staff...will get the ball opening day...has not lost since Feb. 21, 1990 when he gave up four runs in the first inning of his first career start...FSU lost the game 4-3...surprised coaches by easily making the jump from a small (1A) high school to the top level of collegiate baseball in 1990...showed the ability to pitch well under pressure with victories in both the Metro Conference and NCAA Tournaments with Florida State facing elimination...good speed and movement makes fastball effective...pitched out of many a jam his first year...showed poise and control...slight frame is deceptive...1990: Seminole coaches could not keep him out of the pitching rotation...improved throughout the season...won nine straight decisions after a loss in his first start...earned Freshman All-America honors along with teammate Chris Roberts...did not allow more than four earned runs in any of his 13 starts...biggest victories came in the Metro Conference and NCAA Regional tournaments...at the Metro, defeated homestanding Southern Miss and its ace with the Seminoles facing elimination...pitched 5.2 innings of three-hit ball, allowing an earned run and striking out four...at the regional, pitched seven-plus innings and gave up seven hits, three earned runs and four walks while striking out four to lead Florida State to a 6-4 win over Big Ten champ Illinois...emerged as the Seminoles' No. 3 starter following the Miami series in Tallahassee...second on the team in wins with nine...posted the top winning percentage in the Metro Conference (.900)...ranked fourth on the team in innings pitched (74.2) and in strikeouts (54)...his earned run average of 2.65 was first among Seminole starting pitchers last year and the fourth-best mark in the Metro...threw a three-hitter over 7.1 innings vs. Jacksonville in his longest outing of the year...PREP: Four-year letterman at nearby Chattahoochee High where he also starred in basketball and football...All-Big Bend and 1A All-State selection his senior year after posting an 11-2 record and 1.09 ERA...struck out 170 in 80 innings...captained the Yellow Jacket team to the state semifinals...went 12-1 (1.17 ERA) with eight saves and 159 strikeouts while leading Quincy Post 84 to the state American Legion tournament...chose Florida State over Alabama... PERSONAL: Currently enrolled in Florida State's undergraduate studies program...born October 3, 1970.

CATCHER 6-0, 175, JUNIOR TALLAHASSEE, FLA. (SOUTH GEORGIA JC/ FLORIDA HS)

Made the squad as a walk-on this fall...joins three other Florida High graduates on the 1991 roster...came to FSU after two seasons at South Georgia Junior College...one of a trio of players who will back up Pedro Grifol behind the plate...competing with Marc Dunbar and Jon Bolin for the second team catcher spot...also a candidate for action as a pinch-runner and utility player...honored as a leader at every stop in his career...JUNIOR COLLEGE: Hit .351 and scored 50 runs his sophomore year at South Georgia Junior College...drove in 30 runs...swiped a team-leading 32 bases to rank fifth among Georgia JC players last year...led SGJC to a second-place finish in the state in 1990...squad also ranked 19th nationally...earned the team Leadership Award following both his seasons at South Georgia...PREP: Played high school baseball just over the left field wall from Dick Howser Stadium at Florida High School...two-time All-Big Bend first baseman by the Tallahassee Democrat...captained the Florida High team as a senior in 1987...won the team Leadership Award that year...selected as a Player-of-the-Week during the season...PERSONAL: First name is pronounced "McKelly"...majoring in accounting at FSU...born August 1, 1969.



ALLEN BEVIS

SECOND BASEMAN 5-9, 171, JUNIOR TALLAHASSEE, FLA. (FLORIDA HS)

Enters 1991 as FSU's second baseman after a stellar sophomore campaign...emerged as one of the Seminoles' top offensive and defensive players last season...expected to fill a leadership role as a junior...effective leadoff hitter who is overcoming a tendency to strike out...his speed on the basepaths leads to runs...two-year starter...possesses quick hands and accurate throwing arm...not afraid to get dirty...hard worker...strong upper body gives him surprising power at the plate...has excellent range at second, especially up

the middle...quick on the double play pivot at second base...consistency has been one of his biggest assets...career batting average of .320 is tops among returning players...1990: The All-Metro Conference second baseman in 1990...MVP of the Metro Tournament...hit.409 (9-22) over the six-game tourney...scored seven runs, drove in seven runs, walked seven times and reached base 18 times to lead FSU to its eighth straight Metro title...consistent throughout the season, but starred in the final three weeks...in the regional, had six hits, scored six runs and drove in four...also walked six times and stole a pair of bases...made the Seminole offense go when inserted into the leadoff role early in the year...reached base over 56 percent of the time during the season...his .350 batting average ranked third on the team and ninth in the Metro Conference...second on the team in many offensive categories including runs (68), hits (79), walks (50) and stolen bases (33)...led the team in triples with five ... second in the Metro in stolen bases...blasted 27 extra base hits in 1990...recorded the longest hitting streak on the team with a 12-game run from April 7 to May 4...the Metro's Player-of-the-Week May 7 after leading FSU to two wins at Miami with five hits in 13 at bats...collected two or more hits in 27 of the 67 games he played...picked up at least one hit in 45 games...after not hitting in FSU's first three games, never went more than two straight contests without a hit...scored runs in 22 of FSU's last 27 games and scored more than one run in a game 19 times...consistent defensive player...charged with fewer errors than any other middle infielder last season...went a long stretch of games without committing an error...in on 47 double plays...1989: Shared the starting second base job as a freshman...went three-for-five with three RBI in the Atlantic Regional, including a key ninth-inning single in a 7-6 come-from-behind win over Auburn...tripled in his only CWS plate appearance...stole a team-high four bases vs. Richmond...finished second on the squad with 25 thefts...among team leaders in fielding, committing just six errors in 154 chances (.961)...in on 16 double plays...PREP: Three-year letterwinner at Tallahassee's Florida High where he played in 86 games in his prep career...recipient of the Tallahassee Democrat"s Player-of-the-Year award in '88 after hitting .573 as a senior...stole 79 bases in his career...swiped 39 while leading the Demons to the state 2A finals in '88...selected to play in the Florida North/South All-Star Game...team MVP his senior season...first team All-Big Bend choice...PERSONAL: Plans to major in communications...shares a June 25 birthday with FSU teammate Chris Roberts.

OUTFIELDER 6-0, 184, JUNIOR TALLAHASSEE, FLA. (LINCOLN HS)

Leading candidate for the starting spot in centerfield...top

defensive outfielder who made some spectacular catches in 1990...used primarily in a reserve role as a sophomore...also working at third base due to lack of depth in Seminole infield...versatile player...improved offensively over the past year and is expected to contribute at the plate...his speed is a big advantage...displays a strong arm...hitting a respectable .287 for his career...1990: Began the season as the back-up third baseman, but developed into a fine defensive outfielder...used in a reserve role last season...saw action in 57 of FSU's 72 contests...in addition to outfield work, served as a pinch-runner...made the most of his playing time with 15 stolen bases to rank fourth on the squad...scored 32 runs to rank ahead of several regular players...put together a five-game hitting streak early in the season against Ball State and Richmond...at the Metro Tournament went three-for-five with three RBI...hit his only home run of the season against Virginia Tech...made a fantastic diving catch of a sinking liner against Cincinnati...hit .291 for the season, with 23 hits in 79 at bats, 12 RBI and 19 walks...1989: Played in 26 games without a start, slapping five hits in 16 at bats (.313)...blasted a two-run homer in his first collegiate plate appearance in a nationally-televised game vs. Georgia Tech...went two-for-two in a reserve role vs. Louisville...also called to pinch-run in several games...PREP: A two-time All-Big Bend selection after hitting over .500 his junior (.506) and senior (.548) seasons at Lincoln High...swiped 39 bases as a junior and 42 more the following season, when he earned first team All-State honors in class 3A...won the team hitting award and was team MVP his final year...PERSONAL: English major...born December 9, 1969.

Half of the senior class on FSU's 1991 team...back-up catcher who made the team as a walk-on in 1990...one of three players on the FSU roster who played junior college ball at Gulf Coast Community College...hard worker who is always willing to help...adds depth to the 1991 squad...will be used to spell Pedro Grifol in mopup situations...could see action as a pinch-hitter...1990: Made the team as a walk-on during fall practices...served a valuable role as FSU's bullpen catcher...stroked a single in his first-ever at bat for Florida State, against Virginia Military...got into five games...hit .333 on the season with one hit in three trips to the plate...JUNIOR COLLEGE: Played at Gulf Coast Community College with current Florida State teammates Tim Davis and Nandy Serrano...PREP: Starting catcher for the A. OUTFIELDER 6-0,172, JUNIOR ALTAMONTE SPRINGS, FLA. (LYMAN HS)

FSU's "ironman" of a year ago...the only Seminole to play in all 72 games...ready to reclaim a starting job in rightfield...in 1990, shared the job with several players...entered every game he didn't start as a defensive replacement...one of the best defensive outfielders on the squad...possesses an extremely strong and accurate arm...plays the tricky FSU wall and screen area well...top assist man in the outfield who has made some key throws to get the Seminoles out of trouble during his career...has played in more games (140) than any other player on the team entering 1991...good bunter...1990: Valuable as a starter and as a defensive replacement...started 35 games on the year, mainly in right field...after hitting .333 his freshman season, batted .250 (37-148) in 1990...ranked second on the team in triples with three and in sacrifice hits with four...walked 19 times and scored 19 runs...started four-of-six games at the NCAA Regional Tournament and slapped four hits, including a double...collected a season-high three hits against North Carolina at the ABCA Tournament...began the year with a six-game hitting streak...six multi-hit games in 1990 give him a total of 18 for his career...1989: Surprised FSU coaches in the fall of '88 with his defensive skills...platooned in right and played in all but four games (68)...took over as the starter for the Metro and Regional tournaments and responded with a 15-for-36 streak...carried a 10-game hitting streak into the CWS...named to the All-Atlantic Regional team after hitting .500 (8-16) with three RBI and a key assist to nail a Clemson baserunner in the championship game...best performance was a four-for-five day vs. Auburn in the Regional...led all outfielders in assists with nine while committing just one error...batted .333 (51-153) on the year...seven of his hits went for extra bases (all doubles)...PREP: A four-time All-County and threetime All-Conference pick at Lyman High...earned four letters...hit over .380 each year...hit for a sensational .421 average as a junior, when he also drove in 35 runs...collected 76 extra base hits in 120 games as a prep ...stole 84 bases in his career...PERSONAL: Business major who posted a 3.75 grade point average for the fall '90 semester...born February 5, 1970.

One of the top athletes on the FSU campus who is making a serious bid for a starting job in the Seminole outfield in 1991...has exhibited the work habits and dedication which made him a second team All-America cornerback for the Seminole football team last fall ...joined the baseball team in January...fastest player on the squad...speed is evident when he runs down line drives and fly balls in the outfield...also uses speed to his advantage on the basepaths...baseball skills have improved dramatically since last season, especially at the plate...candidate for duty as a pinch-runner...coming off a spectacular sophomore season with the fourthranked FSU football team...a 15th-round selection in the '89 professional baseball draft...1990: Played in 16 games as a part-time baseball player...went through spring football practice during baseball season...used primarily as a pinch-runner and in late-inning situations...got to the plate eight times and collected a pair of hits, including a double against Richmond...scored four runs and stole a base...played about half the season before abandoning the baseball team...playing time was limited due to depth and experience on the FSU squad...FOOTBALL: A second team All-American by Associated Press in his sophomore season...one of the most exciting players in the nation ...big play man on the FSU defense...scored four touchdowns in 1990, two on punt returns and two on interception returns...has five career TDs...picked off six passes to lead FSU and rank 14th in the nation....owns or tied for three school records...ranked sixth in the nation in punt returns with 14.6 yards per return...had five returns of over 48 yards his sophomore year...made 43 tackles...has nine career inter-ceptions...PREP: Led Pascagoula High to the 5A state finals, hitting .344 at the leadoff spot...stole 41 bases, smacked seven doubles and five triples while earning a spot on the All-Coast squad...PERSONAL: Enrolled in FSU's undergraduate studies program...born June 7, 1971.

CATCHER 6-1, 196, JUNIOR MIAMI, FLA. (COLUMBUS HS)

Two-year starter at catcher who anchors the Seminole infield...contender for All-America honors in 1991...one of the best defensive catchers in the nation and the top backstop in the Metro Conference...his experience is a plus for the largely new FSU pitching corps...dedicated worker who continues to improve...has thrown out over 40 percent of the runners who have attempted to steal on him in his FSU career...improved offensively in each of his years as a Seminole...played in the Cape Cod League last summer and was named to the league All-Star team...has become an expert at blocking the plate, saving FSU pitchers countless wild pitches...quick release and accurate arm make him lethal to opposing baserunners...durable player who caught 63 of 72 games last season...will wear number 5 instead of 22 in 1991...needs 23 doubles in 1991 to tie the Florida State career record of 62...1990: All-Conference catcher as a

sophomore...raised his average to .279 (65-39), with 31 extra base hits...25 doubles ranked first on the team while five homers was second-best total...went double or nothing in the NCAA South II Regional Tournament ... all six of his hits in the tournament were doubles, including one in each of the last four games...on the year, drove in 35 runs and scored 39...had hitting streaks of six, seven and nine games in 1990...threw out 46 percent of potential basestealers (35-76)...charged with only seven errors and five passed balls...top offensive game came against Virginia Tech in the Metro Tournament with a career-high four hits to drive in three runs...belted a grand slam in FSU's 7-0 victory over Southern Miss...collected more than one hit in 15 games and has 27 multi-hit games in his career...1989: Turned in a solid season both offensively and defensively, hitting .256 (61-238) with six homers while nailing more than 40 percent of potential base thieves...the only FSU player chosen Metro Conference Player-ofthe-Week during the season...earned the accolade after a six-for-12 series vs. Miami...charged with eight passed balls in 66 games behind the plate...had three-hit, four-RBI performances vs. Richmond and Jacksonville...third on the team in home runs (6), doubles (14), and RBI (48)...tied for second with 10 sacrifices (four hits, six flies)...first career hit at FSU was a home run against Georgia Tech...selected to play on the USA National Team the summer of '89...traveled throughout North America playing international competition...PREP: Florida's 1988 4A Player-of-the-Year out of Miami Columbus High, one of the state's most successful programs...a first team All-State choice...chose Florida State over Miami...PERSONAL: Majoring in social work...born November 28, 1969.
