

ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE



14 — CHRIS ROBERTS LEFTHANDED PITCHER/OUTFIELDER 6-0. 180. JUNIOR MIDDLEBURG, FLA. (MIDDLEBURG HS)

Top candidate for All-American, Player of the Year and the Golden Spikes Award in 1992 after a stellar sophomore season and an even better summer...triple threat who can run, hit and pitch in his dual role as outfielder/pitcher...will be the Seminoles' starting leftfielder again in 1992...will begin the year as the top short relief man out of the FSU bullpen...deceptively quick runner...bats righthanded and pitches from the left side...one of the few hitters in the FSU lineup with potential to go deep at any time...Player of the Year in the Metro Conference last year ...starting leftfielder for the USA National Team last summer... hit .331 in 35 games for Team USA to rank second on the team...led the squad in hits (46), runs scored (30), home runs (11), runs batted in (40) and slugging percentage (.626)...starred

in the 1991 Pan American Games in Havana, Cuba...only United States player named to the Pan Am Games All-Tournament team...batted .304 over 10 games in Havana, with 14 hits and 12 RBI...his five home runs led all players in the tournament...came through with a pair of game-winning hits...blasted a two-run home run in the ninth to give Team USA a 5-4 victory over Netherlands Antilles...against the Dominican Republic, singled in Stanford's Jeff Hammonds in the bottom of the 15th inning to give the United States a 2-1 win and the bronze medal ... accounted for the U.S.' only run against Puerto Rico in the Pan Am semifinals with a first-inning solo homer...one of two United States representatives to the World All-Star Game in Dodger Stadium last August...picked up the save for the West team in that contest...named the Amateur Player of the Year by the Florida Diamond Club last fall...invited to the initial trials for the USA Baseball Team in November...did not participate due to injury...moving onto the ranks of FSU's all-time leaders with 116 career RBI and 20 career homers...has compiled a 15-4 pitching record...1991: Capped a productive year by earning Metro Conference Player of the Year and third team All-America honors...a second team All-America choice by Collegiate Baseball...hit .321, which ranked fourth on the squad...drove in 77 runs with his 78 hits...ranked second on the squad in RBI (77) and home runs (14), and third in stolen bases (17)...finished with 14 home runs (see box)...Most Valuable Player in the NCAA Atlantic Regional...went 6-for-15 (.375) with four runs batted in, two doubles, a homer and two stolen bases in four games...sent FSU into the regional championship game with a two-out, bases-loaded double in the eighth...broke a 2-2 tie and keyed the Seminoles' regional win...collected hits in 16 of FSU's last 18 games...in the Metro Conference and Atlantic Regional tournaments, hit .395 (15-38) with 10 RBI and scored 11 runs...belted nine of his 31 extra base hits in those nine tournament games...four times, hit two homers in a game...has five two-homer games in his career...last season, had 21 multi-hit games, including six three-hit efforts and two four-hit games...named to the all-tournament team at the Metro Conference Tournament...went 9-for-22 (.409) with two roundtrippers and six RBI...produced 21 runs during an eight-game stretch in March...drove in four runs in consecutive games against Miami (twice) and Florida...connected on a first-inning grand slam against the Gators as FSU claimed a 4-2 win...on the mound, posted a 7-2 record in 16 appearances...started 15 games and compiled a 3.52 earned run average...top pitching performance came against Michigan (3/16)...threw a perfect game through six innings before giving up an infield single...only one other runner reached base, on an error, as he completed the one-hitter...struck out a career-high 13 and did not walk a batter...made it back-to-back shutouts one week later by throwing a four-hitter against Southern Mississippi...5-1 with 47 strikeouts and a 1.27 earned run average after his first eight starts...gave up 53 hits and 28 earned runs in his next eight appearances as his ERA went to 3.52...beat Miami on April 14...allowed eight hits and four runs in eight innings in an 8-5 FSU victory...1990: Capped a great year with his selection to Baseball America's freshman All-America second team...finished the season by hitting .320 at the NCAA South II Regional with three roundtrippers and nine RBI...went eight-for-25 and scored four runs in the tournament...blasted a pair of home runs and drove in four in Florida State's 11-9 win over Mississippi State...came back the next day with another dinger...three-homer outburst put

him on the all-tournament team and tied him for the team lead in home runs...on the year, hit. 296 (55-186) with 39 RBL...23 of his 55 hits went for extra bases (16 2B, 1 3B, 6 HR)...streaky home run hitter with blasts in consecutive games against Ball State March 2-3...on the mound, compiled an 8-2 record as

Fantastic 14

There's something uncanny about Chris Roberts and the number 14. As a sophomore, the outlielder/pitcher from Middleburg was nothing short of amazing on the 14th of each month.

It started on Feb. 14 at Arizona, where Roberts blasted two home runs and drove in four. He went four-for-six in FSU's 15-8 win. On March 14 vs. Richmond in Tallahassee, Roberts was two-for-four with four RBI and two more home runs in a 12-4 FSU win. The unlucky opponent on April 14 was Miami. All Roberts did at the plate against the Hurricanes that day was go two-for-four with two more home runs and four more RBI. He also picked up the win on the mound for FSU with eight innings of work.

Roberts hit .571 (eight-for-14), drove in 12 runs and blasted six homers on the 14th's. And on May 14th? Well, the Seminoles were not in action. But that was the day Roberts learned he had been named the Metro Conference Player of the Year.

Oh by the way, Chris Roberts' number? 14. of course!

FSU's No. 2 starter... ranked third on the team in victories...went 7.1 innings against Florida in Gainesville to beat UF 3-2...PREP: Came to FSU as the highest draft choice ever to attend Florida State ...selected by the Philadelphia Phillies in the second round of the June '89 draft...played for the USA Junior National Team the summer after high school... USA TO-DAY's High School Athlete of the Year in the state of Florida ...regarded the state's top high school recruit and one of the top pitching prospects in the country...picked up 10 wins in 11 decisions

while posting a 0.80 ERA with 125 strikeouts and only 15 walks in 75 innings (8.33 to 1 ratio)...earned District 5 Player of the Year, all-ciry, all-county and all-state honors...batted .400 with sixround-trippers...drove in 32 runs and swiped 20 bases...earned Most Valuable Player honors at both the Sunbelt Classic and Florida All-Star Game...hit .300 with a pair of dingers for the USA Junior National Team prior to his senior year...went seven-for-14 with a home run and four doubles...PERSONAL: Enrolled in the undergraduate studies program at FSU...born lune 25 1971


FIRST BASEMAN 6-2, 185, JUNIOR DALLAS, TEXAS (TALLAHASSEE CC/MIAMI PALMETTO HS)

In a battle with fellow newcomer Kevin McCray for the starting spot at first base...a second baseman in junior college who spent the fall and preseason learning the new position...adapted well...his performance at the plate will determine his playing



time...could be used as the designated hitter in 1992...height is an advantage for him at first, but needs experience at the position...JUNIOR COLLEGE: Second baseman for former Florida State pitching coach Mike McLeod at Tallahassee Community College...part of the group which helped revive baseball at TCC after a 20-year layoff...led TCC at the plate...PREP: Starred for Miami Palmetto Senior High...an all-Dade County selection at second base his senior year...honorable

mention all-Dade County his junior season...PÉRSONAL: A psychology major...born May 1, 1970...parents moved to Dallas following his graduation from high school in Miami.



4 — ROGER BAILEY RIGHTHANDED PITCHER 6-0. 170. JUNIOR CHATTAHOOCHEE. FLA. (CHATTAHOOCHEE HS)

FSU's top starter last year...enters 1992 as the staff ace...one of two Florida State invitees to the USA National Team Trials last November...performed before the coaches who will pick the 1992 Olympic Team...allowed two hits and struck out five in four innings of work at the Trials...experienced hurler with a 20-4 career record at FSU...career total of 150 strikeouts in 193.2 innings tops all returning pichers...will get the ball opening day for the second consecutive season...his record in Dick Howser Stadium is 10-1, the only loss coming in his first start two years ago...good speed and movement makes fastball effective...a slow starter who gives up most of his runs and walks in the first two innings...possesses poise and control on the mound...a great fielding pitcher who led all FSU hurlers in assists (44) and putouts (12) last year...gives the Seminoles a fifth infielder...slight frame hides deceptive strength...pitched in the Cape Cod League last summer...1991: Followed up a great freshman campaign with a superb sophomore year...FSU's most consistent starter throughout the season who assumed the role of staff "ace" ... led all pitchers in starts (18), complete games (5), innings (119), strikeouts (96) and wins (11)...finished the year with a 3.78 earned run average...went over a year between losses, from Feb. 21, 1990 to March 1, 1991...top performances came in a pair of complete game victories over Miami...limited the Hurricanes to

four runs (two earned) and 13 hits while fanning 18 in 18 innings...beat UM 5-2 in Tallahassee, striking out 10 and giving up seven hits...in Miami, broke FSU's three-game losing streak with a 3-2 win...struck out eight and gave up six hits and no walks...won Metro Conference Pitcher of the Week acclaim after that performance...earned all-tournament honors at the Atlantic Regional with a dominating performance against Coastal Carolina...shut out the Chants on a complete-game sixhitter...won nine of his last 10 decisions before taking the loss in FSU's first game at the College World Series...pitched into the eighth inning in eight of his last 10 starts with four complete games...only losses came against New Orleans in the Busch Challenge, at Florida and at the CWS...1990: Made a successful jump from a small (1A) high school to the top level of collegiate baseball...pressure pitcher who won games with FSU facing elimination at the Metro Conference and NCAA tournaments...won nine straight decisions after a loss in his first start...earned second team freshman All-America honors...did not allow more than four earned runs in any of his 13 starts...at the Metro Tournament, defeated homestanding Southern Miss ...pitched 5.2 innings of three-hit ball, allowing an earned run and striking out four...at the regional, gave up seven hits and three earned runs over seven-plus innings to lead Florida State to a 6-4 win over Illinois...emerged as the Seminoles' No. 3 starter following the Miami series in Tallahassee...ranked second on the team in wins with nine and posted the top winning percentage in the Metro Conference (.900)...fourth on the team in innings pitched (74.2) and in strikeouts (54)...his earned run average of 2.65 was first among Seminole starters and fourth in the Metro...PREP: Four-year letterman at Chattahoochee High where he also starred in basketball and football...all-Big Bend and all-state selection his senior year after posting an 11-2 record and 1.09 ERA...struck out 170 in 80 innings...captained the Yellow Jacket team to the state semifinals...posted a 12-1 (1.17 ERA) mark with eight saves and 159 strikeouts while leading Quincy Post 84 to the state American Legion tournament...also an all-state selection as a junior...three-time all-Big Bend choice... PERSONAL: Majoring in leisure services...born Oct. 3, 1970.

1 — ALLEN BEVIS Second Baseman 5-9. 168. senior tallahassee. fla. (florida hs)

Three-year starter at second base...senior member of FSU's "Demon Infield"...the entire starting infield played at Florida High School in Tallahassee...coming off a solid junior season... leadoff hitter for FSU in each of the past two years with his ability to spark the Tribe offense...injuries hurth is effectiveness as a base-stealer in '91...needs 23 steals in 1992 to break the FSU school career record...for his career, totalled 179 hits in 179 games...possesses quick hands and accurate arm...quick on the double play pivot at second...consistency, both offensively and defensively, has been one of his biggest assets...traditionally plays well in the post-season...in on 92 twin-killings during his career...1991: The Seminoles' leadoff hitter and second

baseman...wielded a hot bat in the Metro and NCAA regional tournaments...hit in 12 of FSU's last 15 games...had an eightgame hitting streak in that run and reached base 15 times...scored six runs and drove in five in post-season play...his 10th-inning leadoff home run against South Carolina in the Metro Tournament gave FSU a 10-9 win...best hitting series came in the



season finale at Cincinnati where he went nine-for-18...in a 26-4 FSU win over Ball State, blasted a pair of home runs and drove in a career-high six runs...tallied 17 multi-hit games, including four straight to close out the regular season...finished the season hitting .279 (65-233)...scored 57 times and drove in 29 from his leadoff position... leads returnees with 18 stolen bases ...took part in 29 double plays in 1991 ...committed only 14 errors, fewest among the middle infielders, for a .935

fielding percentage... after missing 10 games at the beginning of the year with a back injury, played every game.. 1990: The All-Metro Conference second baseman as a sophomore...MVP of the Metro Conference Tournament...hit .409 (9-22) over the six-game tourney...scored seven runs, drove in seven runs, walked seven times and reached base 18 times in the tourney...consistent throughout the season, but starred in the final two weeks...the Metro Conference Player of the Week on May 7 after leading FSU to two wins at Miami with five hits in 13 at bats...in the regional, picked up six hits, scored six runs and drove in four, walked six times and stole a pair of bases...reached base over 56 percent of the time during the season...his .350 batting average ranked third on the team and ninth in the Metro...second on the team in many offensive categories including runs (68), hits (79), walks (50) and stolen bases (33)...led the team in triples with five...second in the Metro in stolen bases...recorded the longest hitting streak on the team with a 12game run from April 7 to May 4...collected two or more hits in 27 games...picked up at least one hit in 45 games...after not hitting in FSU's first three games, never went more than two straight contests without a hit...scored runs in 22 of FSU's last 27 games...charged with fewer errors than any other middle infielder...in on 47 double plays...1989: A second team freshman All-American in his initial season...went three-for-five with three RBI in the Atlantic Regional...ninth-inning single keyed a 7-6 come-from-behind win over Auburn...tripled in his only CWS plate appearance...stole a team-high four bases vs. Richmond...finished second on the squad with 25 thefts...among team leaders in fielding, committing just six errors in 154 chances (.961)...PREP: Recipient of the Tallahassee Democrat's Player of the Year award in '88 after hitting .573 as a senior...stole 79 bases in his prep career...swiped 39 while leading the Demons to the state 2A finals in '88...played in the Florida North/ South All-Star Game...team MVP his senior season...first team all-Big Bend choice...PERSONAL: Majoring in political science...shares a June 25 birthday with FSU teammate Chris Roberts.

OUTFIELDER-CATCHER 6-1, 170, SENIOR ALTAMONTE SPRINGS, FLA. (LYMAN HS)

Top defensive outfielder who has seen action in 207 of Florida State's 215 games since his freshman season...possesses a strong and accurate arm...plays the tricky FSU rightfield wall and screen well...leading candidate for the starting spot in rightfield again this year...battling freshman Justin Rigney for the job...experience gives him the edge...strong arm led coaches to try him at catcher...could see action there behind Marc Dunbar...looking to improve on a dismal year at the plate in 1991...career numbers include 114 hits in 435 at bats with 65 runs scored and 58 runs batted in...along with Chris Roberts and Ty Mueller, part of an experienced outfield trio...one of two three-year letterwinners on the 1992 squad...good bunter...played in 128 straight contests for the Seminoles from his freshman season in 1989 through April 16, 1991...1991: Excellent outfielder who started 33 games for the Seminoles despite struggling at the



plate...late-inning replacement in games he didn't start...came through in the NCAA Regional championship game with a two-out, two-run, pinch-hit single which tied the score at five...scored the winning run in the seventh when he walked and stole second before coming around on a double...entered the Metro Tournament with seven hits in his last 16 plate appearances (.438)...tied for team lead with four sacrifice bunts ...batted only .193 but his 26 hits drove in 20...1990: The only Seminole to

play in all 72 games in 1990...entered every game he didn't start as a defensive replacement...hit .250 (37-148)...second on the team in triples with three and in sacrifice hits with four...slapped four hits, including a double, at the NCAA Regional...collected a season-high three hits against North Carolina at the ABCA Tournament...began the year with a six-game hitting streak... 1989: Platooned in right and played in all but four games...took over as the starter for the Metro and Regional tournaments ...responded by going 15-for-36 in those contests...carried a 10game hitting streak into the CWS...named to the All-Atlantic Regional team after hitting .500 (eight-for-16) with three RBI and a key assist in the championship game...best performance was a four-for-five day vs. Auburn in the regional...led all outfielders in assists with nine while committing just one error...batted .333 (51-153) on the year...PREP: A four-time allcounty and three-time all-conference pick at Lyman High...hit over .380 each year...batted .421 as a junior, when he also drove in 35 runs...collected 76 extra-base hits in 120 games as a prep...displayed speed with 84 career thefts...PERSONAL: Accounting major who is one of the top students on the team...born Feb. 5, 1970.

School...looking to gain experience and develop his offensive and defensive skills in 1992...possibly the Seminoles' catcher of the future...performance at the plate could lead to more playing time this year...PREP: Atwo-sport star for Elmira Free High in New York state...three times selected to the allarea team...league Player of the Year his final season...twice won the league batting title...an all-area all-star catcher and the Metro Player of the Year as a

senior...named to the Myrtle Beach all-tournament team his junior and senior years...also a high school record breaker in football...a two-time all-state and all-league selection in his "second" sport...PERSONAL: Enrolled in FSU's undergraduate studies program...born Jan. 2, 1973.


LEFTHANDED PITCHER 5-10, 160, FRESHMAN MIAMI, FLA. (NORTH MIAMI SENIOR HS)

as he gains collegiate experience...has thrown well in preseason practices... came to FSU with impressive prep credentials as the top hurler in Miami last year...used the fall practice season to gain strength...PREP:A1991 first team all-state selection from North Miami Senior High...also named Dade County Player of the Year by the Miami Herald...MVP of his North Miami High team...played for several all-star teams, including the Dade County All-Stars...

competed in the Sunbelt Classic and the Florida All-Star game... selected to the Ted Williams Classic all-tournament team... PERSONAL: Enrolled in FSU's undergraduate studies program...youngest player on the 1992 team who turned 18 last Oct. 22nd.



7 — TIM DAVIS LEFTHANDED PITCHER 5-11, 165, SENIOR BRISTOL, FLA. (GULF COAST CC/LIBERTY COUNTY HS)

A great pitcher for the Seminoles in 1991...moves to the starting rotation in 1992 after serving as FSU's middle relief expert last year...won some important games as a junior...combines three pitches with great control...possesses a curveball and slider that can be unhittable...can put those pitches, and his fastball, wherever he wants...ranked second on the '91 squad in appearances...returned to FSU for his final season although drafted by the Minnesota Twins in the 34th round of last June's selection...familiar with the starting role from his junior college days...1991: Made an immediate impact by picking up a win in FSU's season-opener against Duke...compiled a 9-2 record with all the wins in relief ... ranked second on the team in victories ...finished third in the Metro Conference with 11.76 strikeouts per nine innings...struck out 91 in 69.2 innings...walked just 21 for a walk to strikeout ratio of better than 4:1, the top mark on the team...gave up only 22 earned runs to post a 2.84 earned run average...top performance came in the Atlantic Regional against Alabama...entered in the second with the bases loaded, two out and the Crimson Tide leading 1-0...dominated the Tide over the next seven innings, allowing three hits and striking out a career-high 12 as FSU won 5-2...named to the All-Atlantic Region team on the basis of that game...his only two starts resulted in losses, to Miami in Miami and to Florida in the College World Series...defeated both those teams earlier in the year...pitched five scoreless innings of two-hit ball in 12-4 win over Miami at Howser Stadium...at home, was a perfect 7-0 with a miniscule 0.77 earned run average in 14 appearancesJUNIOR COLLEGE: MVP of the Gulf Coast Community College squad as a sophomore...named to the second-team JC all-state team...compiled a 9-1 record in 12 starts...completed eight games and recorded a shutout...finished with an earned run average of 2.75 and struck out 67 in 95 innings...his freshman year, went 3-1...PREP: Played at Liberty County High where he was team MVP his junior and senior seasons...an all-Big Bend choice for three years...played on the same American Legion team as FSU righthander Roger Bailey...PERSONAL: Majoring in finance...lone married player on the Seminole team...wife's name is Mary Katherine...born July 14, 1970.

CATCHER 5-9. 170. JUNIOR TALLAHASSEE, FLA. (DUNEDIN HS)

Came out of "retirement" in the fall to claim the starting catcher's spot...hung up his cleats after graduating from Florida State last summer with a degree in political science...enrolled in law school at FSU and will pull the improbable double of baseball season and law school this semester...was asked to come back due to FSU's lack of experience behind the plate...will start at catcher after three years as a back-up to Pedro Grifol...displayed a good arm in preseason practices... learning to



control the game and the pitching staff as the leader of the infield....also has the ability to contribute offensively...possesses better than average speed...hard worker with a great attitude...six of his 13 career hits have been for extra bases...1991: Spent most of the year as a backup catcher and reserve outfielder...proved a valuable addition to the Seminole outfield corps when Garrett Blanton was hurt...started eight games in the outfield...gunned down three of four baserunners who attempted

to steal...had the only two-hit game of his career in Florida State's series-opening victory over Miami at Howser Stadium, smashing a run-scoring double to ignite a rally...appeared in 42 games...five of his 11 hits went for extra bases, including four doubles and a triple...committed only one error in 16 games behind the plate...1990: Saw action in 21 games... played a few innings at catcher, was used as a pinch-runner, as a pinch-hitter and even at second base...collected a pair of hits in 12 at bats...doubled against VMI for the first extra base hit of his career...singled, stole a base and drove in a run against Louisville...scored seven runs on the year, primarily in pinchrunning duties...1989: Redshirted...PREP: A 3A all-state selection as a senior at Dunedin High...won the Koutsarias Hitting Award...all-county choice...played in the Florida North/South All-Star Game...versatile player who played the infield, outfield and catcher during his prep career...PERSONAL: Completed




