A WINNING TRADITION

• Fifty-two years, eight head coaches and always the same result — a winning season for the Seminoles. Florida State has never posted a losing record during its history, in fact, the closest the Seminoles ever came was a 9-8 mark in their inaugural season of 1948 under the tenure of Charlie Armstrong. Over the last 20 seasons, Mike Martin has led FSU to 18 50-win seasons, including each of the last six years,


Florida State has made 17 trips to the Colege World Series — the sixth-best total in NCAA history — and 37 appearances in the NCAA Baseball Tournament — the second-best total in NCAA history. The Seminoles have appeared in the NCAA Tournament for 22 consecutive seasons, the second-longest current streak in Division I Baseball.


 The Seminoles have won 14 conference championships, including two Atlantic Coast Conference titles since joining the league in 1992.

 Florida State has produced 167 players that have been selected in the Major League Draft (since 1966), including 14 first-round picks. The Seminoles have had 41 former players advance to the Major Legaues.

Since Dick Howser became Florida State's first All-

American in 1957, 68 Seminoles have garnered All-America honors. Three Seminoles — Mike Fuentes, Mike Loynd and J.D. Drew — have won the Golden Spikes Award, the Heisman Trophy of amateur base-

Accredited photographers holding passes will be admitted to shoot in designated areas on the field.


These areas are marked just inside the gates in the protected area at the corners of the home and visitors' dugouts. Still photographers are asked not to restrict views of the fans if at all possible.

INTERVIEWS

On game days, Florida State players are available to the media prior to and during batting practice. FSU Head Coach Mike Martin and his players will be available for postgame interviews following a 10-minute cooling off period. Martin will meet with the media in the Florida State dugout immediately after talking with the team in the Seminole lockerroom. Requested Florida State players will be escorted to the interview area by Florida State Sports Information personnel after Coach Martin.

Florida State players are also available on the field at Dick Howser Stadium prior to practice on non-game days. Reporters who wish to interview players before practice should be at the field between 1:30-2:30 p.m. Please contact Jeff Purinton at the Florida State Sports Information office to arrange off-day player phone interviews. Contact Coach Martin's office directly at 850/644-1073 to arrange interviews with him.

or the ninth consecutive season, Seminole baseball fans do not have to miss a minute of exciting Florida State baseball action. Tallahassee's Sportsradio 1270 will once again broadcast every inning of every game in 2000. From the season opener January 28th through the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament and NCAA Regional action in May, the radio home of the Seminole baseball is Sportsradio 1270.

WNLS-AM will broadcast Seminole baseball for the 19th consecutive season. With WNLS' complete coverage, the Seminoles have one of the best and most extensive radio packages in college baseball.

The voice of the baseball Seminoles for the tenth year is Lee Bowen, who continues a long association with the Florida State Radio Network in 2000. The producer of FSU's football and men's basketball radio network, Bowen had previously worked as a statistician for the Seminole Radio Net-

work. Bowen has also called play-by-play for the minor league Burlington (N.C.) Indians, a rookie league team in the Appalachian League. WTNT's Jim Crosby will join Bowen in the booth for all home games. Crosby is a 17-year veteran of Seminole baseball broadcasts.

TELEVISION

Florida State's rich baseball tradition will once again attract live coverage from cable television networks throughout the Southeast. The Seminoles' strong baseball tradition and Atlantic Coast Conference schedule make Florida State no stranger to television exposure. This year, the FSU baseball team can be seen on television 15 times.

The Sunshine Network is once again the home of Seminole baseball in 2000. The Sunshine Network, a Florida-based cable network, will televise eight games from Dick Howser Stadium. Gene Deckerhoff and former Seminole Link Jarrett will handle the play-by-play and color again for Sunshine in 2000. Broadcasting to over 2.5 million homes in Florida, the Sunshine Network takes Florida State baseball to all corners of the state. The 2000 Seminoles debut on Sunshine on January 28th in their season-opener against Western Kentucky.

he success of Florida State's baseball program during the Mike Martin era speaks for itself. After coming up one run short in the championship game at the College World Series in 1999, this year's version of the FSU baseball

team is eager to take another shot at the title and make a return to trip to the familiar grounds of Rosenblatt Stadium. Although second baseman

Marshall McDougall returns after a junior season that ranks as one of the finest in school history, the strength of the 2000 Seminoles will be the

notes will be the pitching staff. Junior Jon McDonald and Sophomore Blair Varnes have been named to several preseason All-America teams and will anchor the first two starting spots in the

rotation. Several new arms have impressed the coaching staff in fall practice and should help fill the void left by graduating seniors Chris Chavez and Zach Diaz and first round draft pick Nick Stocks.

PITCHING

Coach Martin welcomes back two of the top starting pitchers in the country in junior Jon McDonald and sophomore Blair Varnes. McDonald was 9-3 last season with a 3.57 ERA and is a Collegiate Baseball preseason first team All-

American. Varnes, named Freshman Player of the Year by Collegiate Baseball and a third team preseason All-American, will be the No. 2 starter. Varnes was 11-2 in 1999 and is best known for his courageous effort in the national championship game when he started on the mound despite a ruptured ACI. "The story of this year's club is pitching," said Martin.
"I've been impressed with how the staff has thrown so far.
We've got to put a premium on pitching and understand that
this club is not going to put up the same numbers offensively as we did last year."

Junior Mike Ziegler leads a trio of Seminoles battling for the job as the third starter. Ziegler is a two-time junior college All-American who spent last season at Tallahassee Community College and ran up a 15-2 record with a

1.42 ERA. John Bentley, who was 7-2 with a 2.96 ERA in 1998, returns to action after sitting out the 1999 season while fully recovering from a shoulder injury. Freshman Matt Lynch has thrown well during fall practice and is expected to see plenty of innings.

"We feel good about Jon McDonald and Blair Varnes as the first two starters," said Martin. "That third spot will be a battle between Zeigler, Bentley and Lynch. All three of them

are quality guys and will pitch a lot either way."


Chris Ginn returns in middle relief after a

strong 1999 season in which he was 5-0 in 26 appearances and led the team with a 1.31 ERA. Freshman Daniel Hodges will also be used in the middle innings after impressing the coaching staff during fall practice.

Mike DiBlasi is back for his senior year after leading the ACC with nine saves last season. He will be used in both middle relief and as a lefthanded stopper in the late innings. Righthander Chris Whidden had a strong freshman season and will team with DiBlasi as the team's closers.

Chris Smith, who was a part-time starter in the outfield in 1999, will see more action as a pitcher this year. Others expected to contribute on the mound are Eric Roman, Robby Read and Nick Whidden.

"One of the keys to this ballclub is replacing Zach Diaz and Chris Chavez," said Martin. "Those two were able to go out anytime our starter struggled and keep us in a ballgame. I've been impressed with these guys ability to do that."



BEHIND THE PLATE

Although Jeremiah Klosterman hit just .298 with five home runs last season, his leadership and presence behind the plate were a big reason for FSU's success. Sophomore Chris Hart will be pushed by junior college transfer Blair McCaleb for the starting job. Hart saw time last year spelling Klosterman at catcher and also as a designated hitter. Cory Posey, a senior who joined the team in January after spending two years playing junior college baseball and one year at McNeese State, could play catcher or be used as a designated hitter.

"Chris Hart has done a good job behind the plate," said Martin. "Jeremiah's leadership was so evident last season. We need someone to step in and handle the pitching staff the way he did."

the lineup as a designated hitter.

Sophomore Ryan Barthelemy will start at first base for the Seminoles to open the season. Barthelemy took over toward the end of the 1999 season and started during FSU's postseason run. John Halliday, who started 56 games at first base and designated hitter, has been hampered by injuries and his status is uncertain for the early part of the year.

his status is uncertain for the early part of the year.

When he returns, Halliday will likely take over as the designated hitter. Freshman Justin McClain could also see

some time at first behind Barthelemy.



Coach Martin could do some shuffling here with four quality players returning from a year ago. The Seminoles will have to fill a huge void in right field with Matt Diaz signing with Tampa Bay. Diaz hit .379 and was second to McDougall with 21 home runs and 94 RBI.

Sophomore John-Ford Griffin, who recorded a team-best batting average of .436 in his rookie season, will move over to right field as the full-time starter. Futrell will open in left field, where he split time with Griffin last year.

In center, Karl Jernigan looks to bounce back after going through a bit of a sophomore slump at the plate. Jernigan, who could lead off, boasts exceptional speed and is the best

defensive player in the FSU outfield.

Sophomore Chris Smith split starting duties with Jernigan in center in 1999 and will see action in both left field and center field as well as on the mound this season.

Clint Thigpen will push for playing time in the outfield along with freshman Ryan West, who opened practice at third base, but has since moved to the outfield. West could also see time at designated hitter from the left side.

AROUND THE INFIELD

The middle infield will be strong with Brett Groves back to start his third year at shortstop and All-American Marshall

McDougall returning at second base. Sophomore Bobby Spano, who could also play third base and shortstop, will back up McDougall at second base while freshman Brian Kraft is the No. 2 shortstop.

"There's not much more you can say about the season Marshall had for us last year," said Martin. "He and Brett also give you one of the best double play duos we've ever had."

McDougall stole 22 bases and Groves took 29 to lead the team. Those numbers should increase as Martin plans to increase run production by stealing more bases and utilizing the hit-and-run more of-

"It remains to be seen if Marshall will hit second or third in the order," said Martin. "I like him hitting second. We need a good consistent leadoff guy and hopefully Brett or Karl Jernigan will be the answer there."

At third base, junior college transfer Pichi Balet appears to have the inside track on the starting job. Pushing Balet will be newcomer Scott Boyd. Boyd also has a chance to get into

THE SEASON AHEAD

FSU's 2000 schedule will again rank as one of the most difficult in the country. In addition to ACC competition, the Seminoles will travel to Arizona State, Florida and Miami for non-conference road games. Stanford, the

top ranked team in the country in most preseason publications, will visit Tallahassee in February.

"The schedule is going to be even tougher than last year's that was No. 1 according to the RPI," said Martin. "The addition of Stanford, playing Arizona State on the road and bringing a pretty good

Pittsburgh team here has upgraded the schedule. Clemson is going to be one of the teams to beat when we go into ACC play; they have a lot of guys back from a team that just missed going to the College World Series."

With an emphasis on pitching and defense, the 2000 Florida State baseball team will look more like Seminole squads of the past. The early schedule against some of the best teams in the country will help prepare the Tribe for the postseason.

"In order to manufacture runs this season, we will try to utilize our speed more this season by stealing bases and calling more hit and runs," said Martin. "Last year was one of the few years at FSU that we had fewer than 100 stolen bases. That was due to the potential of our lineup for the big inning."
