

FRESHMAN YEAR (2004): True freshman made an impact in 2004 appearing in 12 games and posting a 1-0 record ...started three games and had a strikeout to walk ratio of almost 2:1 ...Florida State posted a 3-0 record in the three games Chambers started...held left-handed hitters to an average of just .277, seventh lowest on the team...averaged almost seven K's per appearance.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS: Made his first career appearance at Arizona State (2/8) and made his first-career start against Butler (3/10)...earned the win after working a pre-determined four innings while allowing two runs on five hits with five strikeouts and two walks...worked four innings against Jacksonville (3/17) giving up two runs on six hits with six strikeouts and one walk...pitched two scoreless innings of relief at UNC (3/26) and allowed three hits...made his second start at Jacksonville (4/7) and gave up three runs on five hits with two strikeouts in 3.1 innings...worked the final 1.2 innings in the Friday game against Georgia Tech (4/23) with three strikeouts and just one hit...pitched 1.2 innings of relief at Virginia (5/8) and gave up two runs on four hits with two walks...made his last regular season appearance in a win over Wake Forest (5/21) where he worked one inning ...pitched 2/3 of an inning in the ACC Tournament versus Georgia Tech (5/28) allowing just one hit and no runs.

PREP: Went 4-4 with a 1.80 ERA as a senior...named All-District, All-Region, All-County and All-Sun Coast as a junior...also named honorable mention All-State...went 7-3 with a 1.26 ERA as junior...played at Tropicana Field for the Perfect Game National Showcase...struck out 14 batters including the first nine he faced and only allowed two hits against East Bay in the Tony Saladino tournament in the spring of 2003 in Tampa, FL.



FRESHMAN YEAR (2004): One of FSU's top relievers in 2004... posted a 4-1 record and appeared in 27 games...had the fifth-best ERA on the FSU staff at 3.89...opponents hit just .213 off Chambliss, which was second-best among Tribe pitchers...tied for fourth on the team with one save...struck out more than twice as many batters as he walked...right-handed batters hit just .205 against the freshman, third-lowest on the staff...only one FSU hurler had a lower opponent average versus lefties than Chambliss' .224...also second on the team when it comes to pitching with runners on base as he held opponents to a .205 average...no FSU pitcher in 2004 had a higher winning percentage and a lower ERA than Chambliss...was among the top five on the team in a dozen different categories...was first or second on the team in nine categories...led the squad with 19 games finished, fewest hits allowed (32), triples allowed (0), home runs allowed (3) and doubles allowed (6)...second on the staff in win percentage (.800), games in relief (26), runs allowed (26) and earned runs allowed (17)...fifth-most appearances amongst all ACC pitchers.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS: Pitched one inning and allowed one run on two hits against VMI (2/2) in his first career appearance...picked up his first-career save against UNC Asheville (2/29) after working a scoreless ninth inning...has recorded eight strikeouts in three innings of work over his last three outings (March 5-14)...struck out the side in the ninth inning against Jacksonville (3/17)...worked two scoreless innings with one hit and one strikeout in the series against Maryland...allowed five runs (four earned) on two hits with one walk and one strikeout at UNC (3/28)...earned his first-career win after working the final 3.0 innings and giving up just one hit with five strikeouts in the Seminoles 7-6, 11 inning win against NC State (4/3)...pitched a scoreless ninth inning in FSU's 10-3 win at Miami (4/18)...worked 2.1 innings of relief at Virginia (5/8) and allowed three runs on two hits with one strikeout and tied a season-high with two walks...had a big outing versus Wake Forest (5/22) when he threw 2.2 innings, his second-longest stint of the season at that point, striking out one batter and allowing no runs in the 10-6 win...got a key out in a 6-5 victory over NC State (5/26) helping FSU win its opener at the ACC Baseball Championships...set a new career high pitching four innings and tied a career high with five K's in a 6-3 win over Duke (5/27) at the

ACC Baseball Championships...was called on to make the first start of his career in the ACC Tournament versus Georgia Tech (5/29). He pitched six innings and allowed just three earned runs in FSU's 8-7 victory that sent the Tribe to the title game...made his first NCAA appearance versus UCF (6/6) pitching 1.1 innings in relief.

PREP: As a senior, he hit .380 with five home runs and was named first team All-State as a utility player...saw playing time at third base in addition to his pitching duties...recorded 12 strikeouts against Santa Fe High School in the district playoffs his senior year...pitched five innings with 10 strikeouts against North Florida Christian and only allowed three hits...a third team All-State selection at third base as a junior...hit .401 with two home runs...also pitched his junior year with a 6-2 record and a 1.77 ERA...played for the Tallahassee Titans with fellow Seminole newcomers DiCarlo Thompson and Brant Peacher in the Perfect Game World Wooden Bat Championships in Jupiter, Florida over the last three years.

PERSONAL: Born December 4, 1984...son of John and Melanie Chambliss...enrolled in FSU's undergraduate studies program.



JUNIOR YEAR (2004): Started 52 games last year and appeared in 61...started 24 games at third, 26 games in left and two games at DH...in 199 at bats, Chapman hit .307 with 41 RBIs and a .452 slugging percentage...his .370 average against lefties was third on the team and he hit .346 with runners on base...had the fourth-highest average on the team with bases loaded...hit .600 in five pinch hit opportunities...hit a sixth-best .356 with runners in scoring position and with a runner on third and less than two outs, Chapman hit .600...one of nine Seminoles with double digit RBIs with two outs ...fourth on the squad advancing runners successfully over 55% of the time...only two starters struck out looking fewer times than Chapman who watched strike three just once in every 25 at bats...had the fifth-most multi-hit and multi-RBI games in 2004...one of only six Seminoles in 2004 with a hitting streak that reached double digits (10)...was second on the team in triples (3), fourth on the team in sac bunts (3), fifth in stolen base percentage (.889) and fourth in assists (50)...fourth in the ACC in triples recorded in conference games... named ACC Player of the Week (2/23) with a .750 batting average (6-for-8), two home runs and a slugging percentage of 1.500 in four games against Jacksonville and ORU...had the conference's third-most triples per game in ACC contests.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS: Made his first career start at third base against VMI (2/2) and recorded a career-high four RBIs, while going 2-for-4 with a triple...went 3-for-3 with two RBIs and a run scored including his first career home run against Jacksonville (2/16)...drove in two runs while going 2-for-3 with a run scored against Oral Roberts (2/20)...plated the go ahead run and went 1-for-4 with two RBIs in the Seminoles 4-1 win over UNC Asheville (2/29)...went 2-for-3 with three RBIs against Illinois State (3/9)...scored four runs with two doubles, five walks and an RBI while going 5-for-9 (.556) in the series against Michigan State...scored three runs while going 2-for-3 with a double against Jacksonville (3/17)...hit .364 with a double and a triple in the conference opening series against Maryland...went 1-for-2 with a run scored at Jacksonville (4/7)...had two RBIs while going 2-for-6 in the three games at Miami...drove in three runs while going 1-for-4 with a run scored against Florida (4/21)...started in left field in the Sunday game against Georgia Tech (4/25)...went 2-for-4 with a double, an RBI

and a run scored against Georgia Tech (4/23)...hit a three-run home run in the Seminoles 7-6 loss to Georgia Tech (4/25)...went 3-for-4 with a double, two runs and two RBIs at Virginia (5/9)...helped FSU to an opening win in the 2004 ACC Tournament by going 2-for-4 with a run scored, an RBI and a triple versus NC State (5/26)...had two more RBIs in the tournament coming versus Duke (5/27) and North Carolina (5/29)...finished strong with a 3-for-5 day in the championship game versus Georgia Tech (5/30) including a double and three runs scored...both his RBIs in the NCAA Regional came in games versus UCF...opened NCAA Super Regional play by going 2-for-5 with a double, a run scored and two RBIs versus Arkansas (6/11).

JUNIOR COLLEGE: Played second base at both Indian River Community College and Lake Sumter Community College before transferring to Florida State...earned second team All-State and first team All-Conference honors as a sophomore in 2003...hit .392 as a sophomore with seven home runs, 15 doubles, four triples and 43 RBIs...went 4-for-6 with two doubles, a home run and five RBIs against St. John's River Community College.

PREP: Named All-Conference his junior and senior seasons...hit .400 with seven home runs as a senior at St. Cloud High School...played second base as a sophomore and shortstop his junior and senior seasons.

JUNIOR YEAR (2004): Had a breakout season in 2004 as Cheesman raised his average for the third consecutive season while starting every game behind the plate...the team captain set career highs in every offensive category...from 2003 to 2004, Cheesman raised his average 63 points (.284 to .347), started more than twice as many games (29 to 68), doubled his runs scored (25 to 50), almost tripled his hit production (31 to 83) and double production (7 to 18), hit the first three triples of his career and tripled his career home run total (1 to 3)...Cheesman almost doubled his RBI total as he drove in 42 runs in 2004 compared to 22 in 2003 and his total bases increased from 41 to 116...his slugging percentage went up over 100 points as well from .376 to .485...had a team best 15 game hitting streak, had the third-most multi-hit games (23) on the team and the fourth-most multi-RBI games (11)...fourth-best average among lefties (.365), second-best average versus righties (.341), second in average with the bases loaded (.333) and fourth-best average with two outs (.308)...number three on the team with 18 two-out RBIs...advanced runners successfully over 50% of the time...in the top five in 15 different offensive categories...one of only two Seminoles to start every game in 2004...his .347 average was second to only first round draft pick Stephen Drew...had the team's fourth-best slugging percentage (.485), third on the squad with a .444 on base percentage and 83 hits, fifth in RBIs (42), second in doubles (18) and triples (3), fifth in total bases (116), third in walks (34) and second in sac bunts (7)...one of the Tribe's best fielder's as well with a .982 fielding percentage in a team high 500 chances...also led the squad with 448 putouts while catching 18 runners trying to steal...fourth in the conference in on base percentage...was fourth in the ACC with a .444 on base percentage...named to the Dairy Queen Classic All-Tournament team at catcher.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS: Went 1-for-3 with a run scored in each of the first two games of the Arizona State series...had a home run and a double while going 3-for-4 with a career-high four RBIs at Jacksonville (2/15)...hit .400 (4-for-10) with three RBIs and a run scored in the Oral Roberts series...improved his average from .281 to .357 after hitting .600 (6-for-10) with two doubles, one triple and two runs scored in the series against UNC Asheville...went 2-for-3 with a triple against Butler (3/10)...had four RBIs, a run scored and two doubles while going 6-for-11 (.545) in the series against Michigan State...had career-long 15-game hitting streak from 2/20-3/17...went 1-for-2 with two runs, an RBI and his first-career stolen base against Maryland (3/21)...had a double and scored a run while going 2-for-5 against NC State (4/3)...went 3-for-4 with a home run and three RBIs at Miami (4/18)...scored a career-high three runs while recording three hits (3-for-4) for the second straight game with two RBIs against Florida (4/21)...went 2-for-4 with a run scored against Georgia Tech (4/25)...hit .500 (6-12) in the Clemson series with three doubles, a home run and a 1.000 SLG%...tied a career high with four RBIs while going 3-for-4 with two runs and a career-high two stolen bases against Duke (5/14)...had a dominant series against Wake Forest as the Seminoles swept the Demon Deacons. Cheesman went 8-for-12 with five runs scored, three RBIs and two doubles...opened the ACC Tournament with a 3-for-4 day including a run scored, a double and threw out a would be base stealer against NC State (5/26)...helped FSU clinch its second ACC Tournament title in the last three years as he went 4-for-5 with three runs scored, two RBIs and a double in the final versus Georgia Tech (5/30)...helped to clinch FSU's sixth consecutive trip to the Super Regional by going 3-for-4 with an RBI, a double and four runs scored versus UCF (6/6)...had a great Super Regional recording back-to-back multi-hit games versus Arkansas. 2003 (Sophomore Year): Served as the back-up to three-year starter Tony Richie at catcher and also saw time at DH...had a 2-for-3 outing with three RBIs while starting at catcher at Stanford (2/9)...hit his first career home run against Evansville, going 2-for-3 with two runs and an RBI (2/14)...went 2-for-4 with two runs and tied a career-high with three RBIs vs. Evansville (2/15)...went 3-for-4 with an RBI and two runs scored vs. CSU (2/28)...had two hits against Georgia Tech (5/4) and Jacksonville (5/6)...went 3-for-5 at Maryland (5/9) with two doubles and two runs scored...tied a career-high with three RBIs at Duke (5/16), going 3-for-5 with two runs scored...started as the DH in four of FSU's five ACC Tournament games...went 2-for-11 (.182 in the tournament), but totaled three RBIs and had a .308 on-base percentage...went 0-for-1 in two appearances in the NCAA Regional.

PREP: Named first team 5A all-state as a senior and played in the Florida high school all-star game...the *Sarasota Herald-Tribune's* All-Area Player of the Year following a senior season in which he hit .413 with three home runs and 26 RBIs, leading the team to the state tournament...named honorable mention 5A all-state as a junior...a three-year letterman in both football and baseball...attended the same high school as former FSU All-American John-Ford Griffin...graduated with highest honors and was a member of the National Honor Society.
