Roberts, a former graduate, is in his third year at the helm of the Seminoles, he previously served as assistant track coach to Mike Long for eight years.

A native of St. Petersburg, Fla., Roberts was an outstanding distance runner at FSU while earning three varsity letters. He captained the

first two cross country teams in 1962 and 1963.


After graduating in 1964, Roberts remained on the campus as a graduate assistant in cross country and track. He received his master's degree and moved on to Dunedin High School as head coach for three seasons and was named Florida High School Coach of the Year in 1968.

Roberts returned to FSU in 1970 as academic advisor, head cross country coach and assistant track coach. He served as Florida State's coach for 11 of 14 seasons of cross country. In his two previous years at the Seminole helm, Roberts has accumulated a 33-7 dual meet record while capturing the inaugural Metro indoor and two consecutive Metro outdoor titles. Also to the mentors credit are 12 All-Americans, two NCAA Champions and the honor of serving as the President of the Metro Conference Track Coaches Association.

JOHN BROGLE, Cross Country Coach



This season marks John Brogle's third season on the Florida State track staff, but he by no means is a stranger to the Tallahassee campus.

Brogle, a former FSU student who obtained his physical education degree in 1966, served as captain of former coach Mike Long's track squad. He put his name in the record books that same year with a clocking of 1:52.2 in the 880.

Brogle began his coaching career on the staff of Clear-

water's Oak Grove Junior High School where he remained three years before moving across county to St. Petersburg's Bishop Barry.

Brogle's coaching record at his alma mater is nothing short of phenomenal. His cross country teams won state championships in 1969, 1972, 1973 and 1975 and never finished lower than third in the state meet during his eight years at the Class 3A school.

His track and field performances have been just as impressive. Brogle coached squads finished either second or third in the state meet between 1971-74 and won the state crown in 1970.

In his first season as mentor of the FSU cross country team. Brogle did not disappoint the Seminole faithful. His squad captured the Tribe's first ever Metro Conference cross country title and finished tenth in tough District III competition.

In addition to his job as cross country coach, Brogle assists head track coach Dick Roberts in the distance and middle-distance events.

The easy-going coach obtained a master's in physical education from the University of South Florida and served as assistant professor of physical education in addition to his coaching duties. He and his wife Margie have two children, Kimberly Ann, 12, and John Mark Jr., 6.

SEASON'S OUTLOOK

While last season's Florida State cross country team began a new chapter of distance running excellence at FSU, this year's squad promises to revise the book and add a new chapter of its own.

This season's team returns eight of nine lettermen who last year captured the Seminoles first ever Metro Conference cross country title and finished tenth in tough District III competition. Six of the eight returnees are sophomores, but bring with them a year of experience which should put the team in an advantageous position to defend the Metro crown.

Leading the squad is sophomore Herb Wills. Wills, a Tallahassee native, captured the prestigious National Junior AAU 10,000 meter championship this past summer to add to his National Junior AAU and Metro titles from last season. Flanking Wills and forming the nucleus of this season's team is senior and 1978 team captain Tom Herron. Herron, the oldest member on the squad is expected to have his best season in a Seminole uniform.

Also sophomores, the Tribe returns Larry Greene, John Hodge and Doug Overfelt, all fresh off success in both cross country and track and field.

New additions to the roster include former high school All-American Brett Hoffman and last season's 4A Florida high school cross country champion Marcus Trigg, both from St. Petersburg.

Others capable of challenging for a spot in the first seven are returnees Paul Askea, Robb Gomez, Bobby Shackleford and incoming freshman Paul Hodge.

"If anything this squad should be stronger than last year's team," Brogle said. "Hopefully we should be able to match last year's success in Metro and improve in Districts. This should be a very exciting team to be a part of."
