


JIMMY JORDAN-Quarterback, 6-1, 185, Senior, Tallahassee, Fla.

It's impossible to describe one Florida State quarterback without

also detailing the other.

Listen to head coach Bobby Bowden: "We don't have two quarterbacks at Florida State. Wally Woodham and Jimmy Jordan are THE quarterback. We will use them as we see situations where each should be used. I am convinced that we can't get along without both of them. They complement each other so well."

Thus, in the last two seasons the Tallahassee natives have shared playing time while passing for better than 5,600 yards. Last year



JIMMY JORDAN will begin '79 campaign as the backup, the same role he had in the closing four games of 1978 . . . has twice named the ABC-TV "Chevrolet Offensive Player of the Game" ... those awards came following his 1977 performance vs. Florida and 1978 game against Navy . . . threw four touchdown passes in the second half of the Navy contest . . . thus far in his career has thrown for an even 3,000 yards on 211 completions . . . Jordan about unique OB situation at FSU: "There's no resentment as far as I'm concerned. He's (Wally) my friend" ... was named SPORTS IL-LUSTRATED Offensive Player of the Week following Seminoles' 38-20 win over Oklahoma State last fall where he completed 17 of 28 passes for 231 yards and three touchdowns . . . was co-most valuable player for Seminole offense last season with—you guessed it—Woodham ... seems to have his best outings in relief roles . . . against Florida in 1977 he completed 13 of 19 passes for 240 yards and three touchdowns. . .vs. Navy last season he completed 15 of 27 for 280 yards and four scores



WALLY WOODHAM—Quarterback, 5-11, 180, Senior, Tallahassee, Fla.


alone they tossed for 2,749 which caused SI staff writer Mike Del Nargo to dub this two-headed quarterback Wally Jim Jordham.

No head coach in the country enjoys the problem that confronts Bowden and his staff. In two seasons, the quarterbacks have alternated from starting and relief roles. And, if one conclusion can be drawn from the puzzle it might be that Woodham is the better starter of the two, having compiled an 11-1 record over two seasons when cast in the opening role. But, he has needed the aid of Jordan in more than one game.

WALLY WOODHAM carries the nickname of "Surgeon" because of his ability to cut up an opposition defense . . . best game of his career thus far came last season vs. Florida where he directed Seminoles to a 38-21 victory while completing 16 of 24 passes for 179 yards and one touchdown . . . that performance earned him honors as the Associated Press Southeastern Back of the Week . . . Wally about unique QB situation at FSU: "We don't even talk about it, it's so ridiculous. Heck, I want us to be friends for a long, long time. Why spoil it over this when we're only going to be here one more year" . . . Wally is 390 yards behind Iordan in career passing vards but the difference came in their freshman years where Wally had one completion for 18 yards and Jimmy completed 23 for 434 yards ... Wally could have already graduated from FSU, but he was red-shirted during the 1976 campaign ... as a high school senior Woodham set a scholastic passing record of 3,560 yards only to have it broken (4,098) the following season by Jordan . . . was the starter in final four games of '78 season . . .

SIMMONS, RON—Noseguard, 6-1, 235, Junior, Warner Robins, Ga.—Description of TAMPA TRIBUNE Sports Editor Tom McEwen: "Simmons wasn't born. He was chiseled of brown Georgia granite, had the wings of Mercury attached to his ankles and had life breathed into him by whatever saint is assigned to Bobby Bowden. He is 6-foot-1 and 235, has bench-pressed 525 pounds and could tomorrow win a position as stand-in for the Incredible Hulk."

Florida State has never had a freshman or sophomore gain the recognition that Simmons has in his first two Seminole seasons. He has been a freshman and sophomore All-American and in his rookie year was picked as the "Freshman Defensive Lineman of the Year" by FOOTBALL NEWS.

He seems to perform best when the Seminoles appear on television. Last year in a pair of ABC-TV regional appearances vs. Miami and Navy he was selected the "Chevrolet Defensive Player of the Game" by the announce crew on the broadcast. In the Miami game he blocked a punt that led to the Seminoles' first score.

This is a youngster of incredible strength and desire. He was the team leader in the weightlifting portion of the "Superstars" competition last spring. Yet, he also displays exceptional speed, running the 40 in an amazing 4.56.

Simmons proved his desire to become the very best player in college football during the recently completed spring drills. In those 20 days of grueling workouts he was judged by the coaching staff as the "Outstanding Player" of spring practice.

The Simmons' awards in the first two years have been many. In addition to the previously mentioned freshman and sophomore honors he was a unanimous choice last fall for the Associated Press Southern Independent squad which earned him an honorable mention berth on that wire service All-American squad.





ADAMS, LEE-Offensive Guard, 6-4, 245, Junior, Ruskin, Fla.—the Seminole coaching staff anxiously awaits the start of fall practice to analyze this brawny junior . . . Lee will be coming back from knee surgery of last season that prevented him from participating in spring drills ... the injury came early in the season after Lee had earned himself a starting berth . . . he still had enough playing time to win a varsity letter ... came to Florida State after a freshman season

at Georgia Tech . . . an outstanding baseball prospect coming out of high school he played briefly in the Cincinnati chain . . . born Octo-

ber 23, 1957 . . . parents: Mr. and Mrs. R.D. Adams.





BONASORTE, FRANCIS (MONK)—Defensive Back, 6-1, 177, Junior, Pittsburgh, Pa.—Seminole defensive coaches voted Monk the "Most Improved Defensive player of 1978" and that best describes his year . . . when fall practice started in '78 the coaching staff was hoping to give Bonasorte a "red-shirt" season . . . he wasn't even listed on the two-deep . . . but hard work plus a succession of injuries and resignations in the secondary put "Monk" in a starting role at weak

safety . . . his best outing was at Pitt where he led Seminoles in tackles and assists with his family in the stands . . . missed spring practice while recovering from knee surgery . . . sustained the knee injury in regional TV victory over Navy . . . born March 11, 1957 . . . parents: Mr. and Mrs. Charles Bonasorte.

BURNEY, KELLY—Offensive Back, 5-9, 180, Sophomore, Miami, Fla.—showed during the spring that despite his size he has tools to be a fine college running back . . . in spring game while running for Garnet he gained 21 yards in five carries and scored one touchdown . . . in high school (Miami Jackson) he gained 1,357 yards as a senior enroute to All-American honors . . . born April 1, 1960 . . . parents: Mr. and Mrs. James Burney.



BUTLER, BOBBY—Defensive Back, 5-11, 185, Junior Delray Beach, Fla.—is cut out of the same competitive mold as linebacker Reggie Herring—they give 100 percent all the time . . . has become a kick-blocking specialist, knocking down four in his first two seasons . . . last season Bobby was hampered by a bad ankle that forced him to wear high top shoes, a la ex-Baltimore Colt quarterback Johnny Unitas . . . had two interceptions last season with returns netting 40 yards

... is the quicket player on team running the 40 in 4.49 ... among the defensive backs he ranked third in last spring's "Super Star" competition ... as a high school senior he was picked Player of the Year by FORT LAUDERDALE SUN-SENTINEL ... born May 28, 1959 ... parents: Rev. and Mrs. Richard Butler.



CAPECE, BILL—Kicking Specialist, 5-7, 160, Junior, Miami, Fla.—has lettered the last two seasons as kickoff specialist . . . consistently puts ball into endzone which allows for minimal return . . . has tried four field goals in two years but is still looking for his first three points . . . all the field goal attempts have been from beyond the 40-yard range, however . . . coaching staff believes Bill has a stronger leg than Davy Cappelen, but lacks the accuracy . . . still has not attempted a PAT

assists and one caused fumble . . . born February 2, 1959 . . . parent: Mrs. Miamee Gilbert.







majoring in criminology . . . born January 2, 1957 . . . parents: Mr. and Mrs. James Love.





HERRING, REGGIE—Linebacker, 6-1, 210, Junior, Titusville, Fla.—if such an award would have been given at conclusion of '78 campaign Reggie would have been Seminoles' Rookie of the Year...he came from back of the pack to win starting honors... wasn't even listed on the linebacker three deep at start of fall practice after spending previous spring in defensive backfield... Reggie's final defensive statistics tell his season story...he led team in tackles with 137, nine

more than Ron Simmons who finished second ... Herring's totals included 70 unassisted and 67 assisted hits ... he was also credited with one interception and two caused fumbles ... an intense player he required seven stitches prior to a game after splitting his chin in pre-game warmups ... among his group in team Superstars he was the winner ... born July 3, 1959 ... parents: Mr. and Mrs. Bill Herring.

end Sam Childers and wide receiver Kurt Unglaub are the only non-QBs on Garnet and Gold from Leon . . . led squad in interceptions as a junior with four . . . those are the only thefts of career . . . also in junior season he returned a blocked punt 19 yards vs. North Texas State for a TD . . . a speech communications major . . . born July 8, 1957.





FSU coaches named him their "Defensive Player of the Week" following 38-6 upset victory over Navy... is re-
