

#31 ALLEN, BILLY Runningback 6-0, 200, Sophomore Cleveland, Ohio

—his path to Florida State was the subject of stories by many state

scribes last season . . . came to FSU as a walkon for spring practice in '81 after an Air Force stint in Europe where he played service ball ... caught the eye of Bowden when the Seminole mentor was speaking at clinics there during the 1980 summer . . . presently, Billy's name isn't on the depth chart at tailback because he missed so much spring practice . . . he was absent due to a shoulder injury and duties with the FSU track team . . . experimented with at the fullback position but now he is back at tailback . . . got off to a great start last season before his fumbling tendencies limited his playing time to returning kickoffs and spot duty at the tailback position . . . led the team in rushing in the first two games—89 yards vs. Louisville and 91 yards vs. Memphis State in his only start . . . had a 50-yard TD run vs. the Cardinals . . . finished with 222 yards in 43 attempts . . . his 5.2 average per tote tied him for second among rushers . . . returned a kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown vs. LSU . . . like Herschel Walker, another tailback with dimensions of a fullback, Allen has tremendous speed (4.48 40 yards) and runs the anchor 100-meter leg on FSU's 400 meter relay . . . that relay participated in the NCAA Championships last June ... Billy is involved with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and serves as that organization's vice president . . . when the Seminoles play Southern Mississippi on Sept. 25, Billy will be celebrating his 24th birthday . . . that makes him the oldest player on the squad.

#26 ALLEN, GREG Runningback 5-11, 200, Sophomore Milton, Florida

 although this young man is listed as a second string tailback, bet

that he will be the mainstay of the runningback corps in the fall . . . Greg didn't participate full-time in spring practice—he also had duties with the track and field team . . . he and Ricky Williams will continue to battle it out for starting honors . . . did it all as a freshman in '81 . . . season totals showed 888 yards in 139 carries, a

6.4 average . . . that average is the highest ever for a Seminole ball carrier . . . also scored three TDs . . . picked second team All-South Independent and Football News chose him to its freshman All-American team ... Bowden brought him along slowly until he exploded for 202 yards vs. LSU in his first collegiate start . . . took the game's opening handoff around left end for a 66-yard gain . . . those 202 yards were the most ever by a Seminole and was the first time a runner had eclipsed the 200-yard mark . . . for that performance Associated Press named him Back of the Week and ESPN picked him as its Amateur Athlete of the Week . . . the college football world found out who he was the following week vs. Western Carolina . . . his 322 yards in 32 carries was the most in NCAA history by a freshman and was also the highest yardage total of the '81 season, outdistancing USC's Marcus Allen's best of 289 . . . Greg added a 95-yard touchdown on a kickoff return that gave him 417 all-purpose rushing yards, another NCAA mark . . . honors for that game came from both AP and United Press International and Sports Illustrated named him its Offensive Player of the Week . . . received the ABC-TV Chevrolet MVP Award for his 109 yards vs. Miami . . . before Greg became a starter, he played in the Seminoles' first JV game, running for 202 yards and two TDs . . . runs the fastest 40-yard dash on the squad (4.36) . . . many believe his speed has been improved as a result of training with the track and field team . . . on that squad, he also long jumps and finished the season with a best of 24 feet, five inches . . . ran for over 2,000 yards as a high school senior . . . born June 4, 1963.




#23 ASHLEY, TRACY Defensive Back 5-10, 185, Sophomore Cochran, Georgia

is the third son to have played for his father . . . the other boys, Tommy and Terry, played for Dad at West Virginia and are now on the Seminole coaching staff . . . Tommy is a part-time assistant who works with the tight ends and Terry, who just graduated from the FSU Law School, is a volunteer coach . . . Jeff was not a scholarship athlete at first but has now earned one . . . although limited in size, Jeff is a competitor and it has earned him a frequent spot on the travel squad . . . earned a letter in 1980 but did not see enough playing time in 1981 . . . like brother Tommy, Jeff is a wide receiver . . . he also participates on the specialty teams . . . born December 30, 1959.



#20 BURNETT, KEN Fullback
5-11, 200, Senior
Brandon, Florida

—although small for a fullback, Ken makes up for his lack of size with

hard work and smart play . . . shows great leadership and is as consistent as any player on the Seminole squad . . . after serving as Michael Whiting's backup for two years, the position is his . . . it doesn't look like he's about to let anyone move him out . . . most recognized for his blocking abilities . . . gained 109 yards on 21 carries last fall for a 5.2 average . . . a closer look will show Ken lost only one yard the entire season . . . his two career touchdowns came in 1980 . . . has good hands and is considered a good receiver though he has caught just three passes in his career . . . a former high school quarterback . . . his brother Mike was a defensive back at Tampa in the 70s and now coaches in the Tampa area . . . born January 29, 1961.

-quietly joined the Seminole program last year as a transfer and

earned a scholarship ... had a good spring and is listed as Ken Burnett's backup at fullback ... saw limited varsity time last year in the backfield and never carried the ball . . . he did see considerable action on the JV squad, gaining 110 yards in 31 attempts and scoring three touchdowns . . . also caught the longest pass of that four-game schedule, a 72-yarder from Eric Thomas . . . may be the best all-around athlete on the squad . . . has won the Seminoles' Superstar competition two years in a row . . . to appreciate how good an athlete he is, look at some of those Superstar marks ... he can bench press 425 pounds, squat press 515 pounds and yet runs a 4.58 40-yard dash ... the bench press tied him with two others for the best on the squad . . . when Southern Illinois and FSU meet for the Seminoles' homecoming game, Manny will be celebrating his 22nd birthday.



76 CARREKER, ALPHONSO Defensive Tackle 6-6, 250 Junior Columbus, Ohio

—was a starting defensive tackle last year and again will be provid-

ing the bulk of the experience on the defensive line . . . didn't have as good a spring as coaches would have liked him to . . . the staff hopes he can live up to expectations starting in the fall . . . credited with 52

tackles last season . . . that figure included three quarterback sacks and two other tackles behind the line of scrimmage ... also had an interception and recovered a fumble ... high tackle game was Memphis State (15) as the FSU defense didn't give up a touchdown . . . lettered and saw much playing time as a freshman . . . was in on close to half the plays that year ... when the Seminoles play Ohio State, Alphonso will be playing in his hometown for the second straight year . . . comes from the same high school that produced former Seminole offensive tackle Ken Lanier, now with the Denver Broncos . . . nicknamed "Chub" by his mother and it has carried on with Tribe players and coaches . . . born May 25, 1962.

Lenny was also runnerup in his weight class on the squad in the "Superstars" competition which scores performances in ten skills ... was the state's heavyweight weight lifting champ-

—he is the veteran of the defensive backfield . . . in fact, Harvey is the

only true four-year senior on the entire defense . . . as a starting cornerback in '81, had 50 tackles and led the team in interceptions (5), passes broken up (10) and shared the lead with two others in fumble recoveries (2) . . . prior to becoming a starter, Harvey spent two years as a backup to Bobby Butler, who now starts for the Atlanta Falcons . . . he also spent much time on the special teams those years ... although small for a defensive back, Harvey is an excellent athlete ... evidence of that is his 40-yard time (4.48) and his vertical jump (31 3/4) that is best on the squad . . . had an interception with 17 seconds left in '81 Notre Dame game that sealed a 19-13 win . . . also had the longest interception return of the year, 48 yards, although it did not go for a TD . . . defensive coordinator Jack Stanton on Harvey: "has all the ability in the world and is a good cover man . . , if he matures, could be one of the best defensive backs in the country" . . . born April 4,

the depth chart ... a dropback passer with good knowledge of defensive coverages . . . Bob was redshirted last year, so he has three years of playing left like fellow quarterback Taylor, Davis played for his father in high school ... his father also coached former FSU consensus All-American Ron Simmons at Warner Robins High School . . . made a brief appearance in the spring game but did not complete a pass in four attempts . . . born February 17, 1962.



DOWELL, J.D. Offensive Tackle 6-2, 240, Sophomore Tampa, Florida

-was making progress in spring practice until an injury took him to

the sidelines . . . had been working at the tight guard position ... still ended second on the depth chart behind Bob Merson . . . all his playing time as a frosh came on the JV squad . . . Seminoles' tradition of redshirting second year linemen will probably hold true here . . . for those who were wondering, "J.D." stands for Jeremy Denton . . . born November 28, 1962.



In 1977, the inframural team "The Untouchables," made up of football players Larry Key, Nat Terry, Greg Ramsey and Gary Woolford won the 440-yard relay, breaking the existing national inframural record.



#37 FEAGIN, JOHN Defensive Back 6-0, 170, Freshman Tallahassee, Florida

—received a medical redshirt last season so he has an opportunity to

play four more seasons at Florida State . . . broke his foot before fall practice had geared up . . . was also hurt during spring practice and didn't play enough for coaches to evaluate him . . . still a year away and needs the extra time to develop . . . has added 10 pounds to his frame since reporting last fall . . . like Jeff Bowden and Blair Williams, John is a native of Tallahassee . . . born March 10, 1963.



FLASHER, TIM Defensive End 6-6, 205, Sophomore Hollywood, Florida

—this is a new position for him . . . was switched from the offensive

line to the end position . . . still has a lot to learn but has good speed and quickness . . . he also needs to increase his playing weight . . . not in the Seminoles' immediate plans but instead will use this year to mature in the position . . . born October 22, 1962.



OFFOJTIK, BRAD Offensive Tackle 6-5, 240, Junior Auburndale, Florida

-after playing defensive end since he arrived at Florida State, Brad's

junior year will find him at a split tackle position ... never played offense before, so much of his spring he was learning the position ... missed the middle weeks of spring ball with an injury but came back at the end to play well in the Garnet and Gold game ... he's currently listed at a second team tackle position behind Jim Thompson ... this is the fourth season that Brad has been at FSU but he received a redshirt in 1980 which will permit him to play through the '83 season ... did have two tackles in a defensive role last year ... finished first in his weight class in the spring "Superstars" competition ... born September 17, 1961.



#65 GRAY, DARRYL Defensive End 6-1, 235, Sophomore Lake Wales, Florida

—coaches were pleased with the play of Darryl during spring work-

outs . . . as a result, he will enter the fall as a starting defensive end . . . will have to fight off junior Allen Dale Campbell for the job . . . has good size and speed for

the position, which is really an outside linebacker with pass coverage duties . . . showed some of that speed and quickness in the spring game where he had a quarterback sack and another tackle behind the line of scrimmage . . . born August 4, 1963.



hanna, warren Defensive Back 5-11, 170, Senior Hollywood, Florida

—had a great spring and enters fall practice number one at the corner-

back position along with Harvey Clayton . . . Bowden on Hanna: "had the best spring of any defensive back we've got and was also the most improved . . . Warren improved in every area . . . if he comes back with the same attitude, he'll be a good one for us" . . . came to FSU as a transfer and earned a letter last season mainly for his play on special teams . . . blocked a punt vs. LSU and returned it 35 yards to the LSU 15-yard line . . . 12 seconds later the Seminole offense converted it to six points . . . he did serve as the "nickle" back when the Tribe went with a five defensive back scheme . . . in spring game, made eight tackles and blocked a kick . . . has good speed . . . born July 17, 1961.

—is expected to be in the starting lineup at the safety position when

the Seminoles play Cincinnati for the season opener ... was on the first team at the beginning of the '81 season but lost his position until late in the year when he recaptured it ... after playing runningback his freshman season, Seminoles asked him to learn the defensive back position when three starters graduated following the '80 season . . . position coach Jack Stanton: "Larry has all the tools to be an outstanding defensive back . . . he tackles well and plays an aggressive game" . . . fifth in tackles last season with 83 . . also credited with a fumble recovery and picked off three passes . . . leading tackler vs. Southern Miss (17) and had 12 tackles vs. Ohio State . . . intercepted a pass against Memphis State on last drive of game to save a 10-5 victory . . . as a frosh, gained 52 yards in 19 carries before being sidelined with a knee injury . . . has 4.55 speed in the 40 yard dash . . . his hometown is the home of the University of Florida . . . born September 11, 1961.

can play either safety position though ... a fine '81 spring practice gave Gary the starting job after serving as FSU's nickle back his first three years . . . however, he did not play the '81 season and is trying to regain his confidence and sharpness . . . was not up to his old form in the Seminoles' most recent spring but most onlookers figured it would take him a while . . . it would be a plus for the defensive coaches to have the old Gary Henry back . . . if that would happen, the secondary would be strengthened immensely . . . in three years as the nickle back, had 26 tackles and two interceptions . . . most remember him more as a punt returner in the 11-0 1979 season when he returned two for TDs . . . one was for 66 yards vs. Southern Miss and another for 57 vs. Miami . . . punt return career shows 53 returns for 421 yards, an average of nearly eight yards per return . . . born May 15, 1960.

55 yards . . . named to the Parade All-American team as a high school senior . . . born January 21, 1963.

receiver ... most of his playing time came on the JV squad and never found the statistical column as a varsity player ... he was redshirted last season, so he has two more to go ... in the spring was shifted to defensive back because of the depth at the wide receiver position ... listed at second team cornerback behind Warren Hanna ... coaches are hoping his speed will allow him to become a good backup at the position ... those associated with the football program are more apt to refer to Cliff as "Butch" ... born March 6, 1961.

—has switched from linebacker to defensive end after a redshirt year,

the same course followed by Brian Williams . . . listed at second team at one of the end positions behind freshman Garth Jax . . . new position won't be entirely foreign to him since the FSU defensive ends have pass coverage duties . . . coaches like his intensity and say he knows one speed and that's full speed . . . earned a letter as a freshman after impressing with his play on the specialty teams . . . born September 10, 1962.

—probably needs a redshirt year as the coaching staff likes to red-

shirt linemen in their second seasons . . . the lack of depth on the defensive line may dictate otherwise . . . currently Mike is listed as a second string tackle behind David Ponder . . . his playing time last year came on the JV squad . . . involved in the FSU Fellowship of Christian Athletes organization . . . father is a Florida highway patrolman . . . born July 27, 1963.



JOHNSON, TONY Wide Receiver

6-1, 180, Junior Dothan, Alabama

—has developed into the Seminoles' most consistent receiver . . .

nailed down a starting job at the flanker position midway through last season and held on to it through spring practice . . . runs good patterns and catches the ball well in a crowd . . . caught 13 passes for 207 yards and three touchdowns in 1981 . . . only caught two passes in the first five games but then hauled in 11 over the next four . . . he didn't catch a pass in the final two Seminole contests . . . was redshirted during the 1980 season so he has two more seasons of eligibility left . . . along with Harvey Clayton, has the best vertical jump on the team—32 inches . . . he and offensive guard Ricky Render both played their high school football at Wicksburg (Ala.) High School . . . born November 4, 1959.

offense and special teams . . . netted 86 yards on 21 carries and scored two TDs as a tailback . . . late in the season, lined up as a wide receiver and caught a 16-yard pass . . . also found duty as a kickoff and punt returner . . . a look at the FSU stat sheet would also convince he was a backup quarterback . . . completed two of five passes for 52 yards . . . in a switch of roles, Jones fired a 14-yard pass to quarterback Rick Stockstill as part of an FSU scoring drive in 19-13 upset of Notre Dame ... coaches have moved him to fullback where he can see more duty since the tailback position is stacked . . . an ankle injury in spring practice slowed his progress but coaches feel he will adapt ... has powerful thighs-he can squat press 525 pounds-tops on the squad ... teammate of Eric Thomas at high school that won the Georgia state championship . . . born February 18, 1963.

#12 LOWREY, KELLY Quarterback 6-1, 225, Junior Lake City, Florida

-will open fall camp as the number three quarterback on the

depth chart . . . started out as the Tribe's number two signal caller at the conclusion of the 1980 season, but was switched briefly to defensive end prior to spring practice in 1981 ... he did return to quarterback to play the '81 season where he completed just two of four passes for 12 yards . . . Kelly has additional duties as the team's holder for all field goal and extra point tries ... scored a touchdown last year on a broken field goal attempt vs. Ohio State . . . was his second collegiate touchdown ... saw much specialty team duty and was credited with the block that led to Billy Allen's 97 yard touchdown return vs. LSU . . . was 8-12 for 147 yards and two touchdowns as a reserve QB for the Garnet squad in FSU's spring game . . . this is his fourth season at FSU but is only a junior eligibility-wise ... was redshirted as a freshman after sustaining a knee injury in a pre-season practice . . . born June 18,






