AGNE, ROGER Offensive Line 6-4, 260, Sophomore Jacksonville, Florida

—tough and determined secondyear player . . . coaches say he is

one of the hardest workers on the team ... will be trying to crack FSU's top 10 offensive linemen group ... if he does he'll see playing time ... most of his work last year came on the JV squad . . . played defensive line in high school . . . also impresses off the field with his excellent Rodney Dangerfield impersonations . . . born April 22, 1964.



### ALLEN, BILLY Running Back/Def. Back 6-1, 205, Junior Cleveland, Ohio

—just where this athlete will play is up in the air . . . if you're betting on

it, the safe odds might be the offense ... after two years at tailback, Billy was moved to defense to shore up an unstable backfield . . . his great speed (4.34 in the 40 yards for a 200-pound man) and size were attractive to defensive coaches . . . played well in the spring game at cornerback but was asked to move over to the offense and help out on a few downs there, too . . . responded with 142 yards and a touchdown in 14 carries ... Bowden was so impressed he nicknamed him "the 60-minute man" . . . the main problem here is that Allen wants to play-anywhere . . . he hasn't seen much time at tailback over the last two years because of the depth there but he's too valuable to be sitting on the bench ... how well FSU's newcomers at tailback do in the fall may dictate exactly where he'll play . . . carried the ball 29 times for 119 yards last season and returned six kickoffs for 194 yards, an average of 32.3 yards per return . . . set a Gator Bowl record with a 95-yard touchdown return . . . that wasn't the first TD he scored on a return—he did it as a freshman against LSU for 97 yards . . . led the team in rushing in the first two games as a frosh but finished with just 222 yards on a 5.2 average after fumbling problems limited his carries to 43 ... 89 yards in his first collegiate game against Louisville included a 50-yard touchdown run . . . came to FSU as a 22-year old walk-on out of the Air Force . . . Bowden had seen him play in Europe on a service team and invited him to look at FSU ... also participates on FSU's track team where he runs the 100 and 200 meters as well as anchoring the 400 meter relay . . . oldest member of the football team, Billy will be 25 on September 25th.

ALLEN, GREG Tailback 6-0, 200, Junior Milton, Florida

—Mr. Touchdown . . . after two years at Florida State Allen is al-

ready the top running back to pass through Tallahassee ... tremendous all-purpose runner who is best known for getting the ball into the endzone . . . led the nation in scoring and set every Florida State record in that category last year with 21 total TDs for 126 points ... 20 of those came by land and one by the air ... had a net of 776 yards rushing although he never started a game . . . continued to build on his already incredible all-purpose yard total with 515 more on kickoff returns and 233 on 16 pass receptions . . . was responsible for 1,524 yards in 1982—a figure that was 11th best in the country . . . his kickoff return average of 25.7 ranked seventh in the country . . . best day of 1982 was 173 yards on 25 carries and four touchdowns vs. Louisville . . . also scored four touchdowns against South Carolina ... burst upon the college scene as a freshman in '81 with a 202-yard rushing day against LSU . . . came back the next week as a starter to shatter two NCAA records in rushing for a freshman record 322 yards and another record 417 all-purpose yards vs. Western Carolina ... has six career 100-or-better yard games to his credit . . . the last one came in the Gator Bowl when he ran for 138 yards and the Bowl's MVP award . . . ran for 888 yards as a freshman and his two-year total of 1,664 yards already has him in fourth place on the FSU career list ... the list of honors is endless ... in 1982: AP honorable mention All-American, All-South Independent, WTBS-Chevrolet MVP vs. Louisville, Football News All-Bowl team, Gator Bowl MVP . . . in 1981: AP honorable mention All-American, All-South Independent, Football News Freshman All-American . . . hindering him from obtaining that goal ... currently he's behind Pat Milligan at strong safety . . . coaching staff would like to see improvement from him to firm up what is a weak area in the defense . . . has played a part-time role since his arrival as a freshman at FSU ... had 29 tackles in his initial season but dipped to just seven as a sophomore . . . did get one interception in 1982 ... one of just eight freshmen earning letters in 1981 . . . runs a 4.55 40-yard dash . . . born January 24, 1962.

CARREKER, ALPHONSO **Defensive Tackle** 6-6, 260, Senior Columbus, Ohio

—"one of the best defensive tackles in the country" says line coach

Chuck Amato . . . certainly has the credentials—97 tackles a year ago with two fumble recoveries, five tackles for losses, eight quarterback sacks and a blocked kick . . . that doesn't even include the Gator Bowl where he blocked a field goal five minutes into the game that would have given West Virginia a 3-0 lead . . . also had a quarterback sack and a tackle for no gain in the 31-12 rout . . . was in WVU quarterbacks' faces all day . . . more from Amato: "not only may he be as good as there is in America but he may be the best tackle to have ever played at Florida State" . . top tackle game came against East Carolina with 12 ... graded out to 70 percent or better in every game ... honored as Associated Press honorable mention All-American and first team' All-South Independent choices following the season . . . also was outstanding as a sophomore . . . had 52 tackles and three sacks that year . . . lettered and got in on half the plays as a freshman . . . will end his career with the satisfaction that FSU beat his hometown Ohio State twice in Columbus . . . from the same high school that produced former FSU star Ken Lanier, now with the Denver Broncos . . . still carries the nickname "Chub" that was given to him by his mother . . . born May 25, 1962.

DUKES, JAMIE offensive Guard 6-0, 290, Sophomore Orlando, Florida

-Florida State's only 11-game freshman starter in 1982 ...

coaches were so impressed with him that Bowden hints that he may be the best offensive guard to play here before his four-year career is over . . . along with Ken Lanier—now a Denver Bronco—Dukes is the only other freshman to start in his first season on the offensive line under Bowden . . . quickness is his trademark and has all the physical tools for all-star honors ... excellent pulling guard and good pass protector . . . played every down without relief in his first collegiate game vs. Cincinnati . . . later FSU coaches rotated the line but Dukes still played most of the way ... has bench pressed 450 pounds . . . wears a size 56 sports jacket . . . born June 14, 1964.



FLASHER, TIM Center 6-6, 220, Sophomore Hollywood, Florida

-he's played about every position there is . . . was signed as an offen-

sive lineman but then switched to the defensive end position at the start of fall drills last year . . . after sitting out the 1982 season as a redshirt candidate, he worked out at tight end during spring practice . . . next he moved to offensive guard before settling into center ... very lean but according to coaches can run with any lineman in the country . . . could be a good one before he graduates . . . when Seminoles meet Louisville October 22, Tim will be turning 20 years old.



FOJTIK, BRAD Noseguard 6-5, 250, Senior Auburndale, Florida

-coaches happened upon his natural position almost by accident

... after spending the year as a starting defensive
