### FLORIDA STATE 38, CINCINNATI 31

TALLAHASSEE, FLA., SEPT. 4—Greg Allen rushed for three touchdowns and Manny Carballo made a game-saving tackle to lead Florida State to a 38-31 season opening win over Cincinnati.

Allen, a sophomore, finished the night with 90 yards on 20 carries. He scored on runs of one. one and nine vards.

Cincinnati grabbed a quick 14-0 lead in the game, taking advantage of two costly Florida State turnovers. FSU answered back quickly, scoring three unanswered touchdowns to take a 21-14 lead.

Ricky Williams put FSU's first points on the board with a 20-yard touchdown run, before Allen capped off a pair of drives with short touchdown runs.

Cincinnati struck back with one score before halftime, but FSU took a 28-21 lead into the locker room as Blair Williams hit Tony Johnson on a 12-yard pass with 2:45 remaining on the clock.

The two teams exchanged touchdowns and field goals in the second half, before Manny Carballo. made the critical play of the game.

With time running out, Cincinnati's Antonia Gibson intercepted a Blair Williams pass and appeared headed for the winning touchdown when Carballo came from the pack to run Gibson down at the FSU 19. The Seminole defense stiffened and Florida State took over on downs.

## PITTSBURGH 37, FLORIDA STATE 17

TALLAHASSEE, FLA., SEPT. 18—Pitt, which came into the game ranked first nationally, scored 20 unanswered points in the second half to pull out a 37-17 win over upset minded Florida State before a rain soaked crowd of 56,236 at Doak Campbell Stadium.

Behind the quick passes of Blair Williams, Florida State built a 10-0 lead in the game. FSU scored on two long drives as Greg Allen finished one with a three-yard run and Phil Hall capped off the other with a 29-yard field goal.

The Panthers struck back to take a 17-10 lead as Marlon McIntyre scored on two short runs and Eric Shubert added a 39-yard field goal,

At this time, Florida State went to the option play for the first time in a number of years. Running backs Greg Allen and Ricky Williams worked the options with FSU quarterback Kelly Lowrey to perfection-with Williams scoring on a one yard plunge to give FSU a 17-17 halftime tie.

A driving rainstorm and a stingy Pitt defense took Florida State out of its game plan in the second half. Art Lowery picked up a blocked Florida State punt and returned it five yards for the go ahead touchdown and Danny Marino fired two fourth-quarter touchdown passes to seal Florida State's fate.

After gaining 237 yards in the first half, Pitt and the rain held Florida State offense to just 117 total yards in the second half.

### FLORIDA STATE 24, SO. MISSISSIPPI 17

HATTIESBURG, MISS., SEPT. 25—Kelly Lowrey ran two yards with a fake field goal attempt and a stiff FSU defense thwarted a last-minute drive as Florida State ran its record to 2-1 with a 24-17 win over Southern Mississippi.

The victory avenged a 59-14 pounding USM gave the Seminoles last season at Doak Campbell

Making his first start as a Seminole, Lowrey completed 22 of 35 passes for two touchdowns and 286 yards. But it was Lowrey's running ability that put the final margin of victory on the board for FSU. With the score tied at 17-17 with just over five minutes remaining, the Seminoles faced a fourth and goal from the Southern Miss two. Placekicker Phil Hall lined up for the field goal attempt, but Lowrey picked up the ball and slanted into the endzone for the game winning score.

Southern Miss made one last charge in the game. Starting from his own 29, quarterback Reggie Collier led the Golden Eagles to the FSU 35, where it was first and ten with a minute remaining. Florida State's defense rose to the occasion, however, and held USM to just seven yards on four

plays. Sam DeJarnette had a big day for the Eagles—rushing for a school record 304 yards on 43

### FLORIDA STATE 34, OHIO STATE 17

COLUMBUS, OHIO, OCT. 2-Ricky Williams and Jessie Hester each scored fourth quarter touchdowns and Florida State's offense rolled up 476 yards in total offense as FSU shocked Ohio State for the second year in a row-34-17.

Trailing 7-0, quarterback Kelly Lowrey became the first Seminole to run for, pass for and receive a touchdown when he took a halfback option pass from Cedric Jones for an 11-yard score.

After falling behind 10-7, FSU added two quick touchdowns to take a 21-10 lead-stunning Ohio State's record crowd of 89,491.

A Brent Offenbacher touchdown pass of 34 yards to Tim Spencer cut the lead to four at the half-but FSU's defense shut down the Buckeye attack for the rest of the game.

Hester then scored on a nine-yard pass from Blair Williams and Ricky Williams added a 10-yard scoring run as the Seminoles completed the upset.

For the game, Lowrey led the air attack with a 14 of 23 showing for 130 yards and Greg Allen rushed for 104 yards on just 18 carries.

### FLORIDA STATE 59, SOUTHERN ILLINOIS 8

TALLAHASSEE, FLA. OCT. 9-Kelly Lowrey and Blair Williams each fired a pair of touchdown passes to lead Florida State to a 59-8 homecoming win over the Southern Illinois Salukis.

Following a slow start, in which the Seminoles managed only a 3-0 lead on the strength of a 21-yard Phil Hall field goal, FSU broke the game wide open in the second period-scoring four touchdowns to take a 31-0 halftime lead.

Lowrey started the scoring spurt with a one-yard touchdown run on the second play of the stanza to make it 10-0. Two consecutive SIU fumbles led to two more touchdowns before Jessie Hester closed out the scoring in the half with a 20-yard touchdown reception from Williams.

FSU added two touchdowns in both the third and fourth frame to complete the rout. For the game, Williams and Lowrey had an outstanding night-completing 19 of 32 passes for 361 yards. Hester, enjoying his biggest night in a Seminole uniform, hauled in four of the passes for 94 vards and two scores.

A crowd of 51,233 looked on at Doak Campbell Stadium.

TALLAHASSEE, FLA., OCT. 16—Greg Allen scored four touchdowns and Florida State rolled up a school record 706 yards as the Seminoles ripped East Carolina 56-17.

Allen scored on runs of 1, 5 and 1 yards and added a 24-yard touchdown reception for the game. Despite facing a defense that was ranked in the top 20 nationally, FSU had little trouble moving the ball all night-gaining 456 yards through the air and 250 on the ground.

Reserve fullback Cedric Jones led all FSU ball carriers with 77 yards on just 12 attempts. Both Kelly Lowrey and Blair Williams passed for over 200 yards and flanker Jessie Hester grabbed four passes for 138 yards to lead the Seminoles offensively.

FSU jumped out to a 35-3 halftime lead in the game and was never seriously challenged by the

### FLORIDA STATE 24, MIAMI 7

MIAMI, FLA., OCT. 30-Playing perhaps its best defensive game in two years, Florida State totally dominated Miami 24-7 in a game played before 54,962 in the Orange Bowl as well as a regional television audience.

Miami, who came into the game planning to run the ball against FSU, was held to just 91 rushing yards by a fired up Florida State defense.

Phil Hall booted a 36-yard field goal and Greg Allen scored on a three-yard run to give the Seminoles a 10-0 halftime lead but a Keith Griffin touchdown made it 10-7 at the end of three.

An Orson Mobley 24-yard touchdown reception and another short scoring run by Allen in the fourth quarter gave the Seminoles their final margin of victory

The key defensive plays came in the second quarter when FSU held Miami out of the endzone on four consecutive tries from inside the six yard line.

Three third-quarter touchdowns iced the game for FSU. Two touchdown passes, including an 83-yard pass from Blair Williams to Dennis McKinnon, and a 28-yard touchdown on a blocked punt by Warren Hanna highlighted the rout.

FSU's second team defense gave up two late South Carolina touchdowns to account for the final

### FLORIDA STATE 49. LOUISVILLE 14

TALLAHASSEE, FLA., NOV. 17-Greg Allen and Ricky Williams each rushed for over 100 yards as Florida State upped its record to 8-1 on the season with a 49-14 win over Louisville in a game witnessed by 51,233 fans at Doak Campbell Stadium and a national TV audience on superstation

Allen, who had earlier set an FSU single season touchdown mark, upped his total to 20 by scoring on runs of 1, 7, 1 and 3 yards. Allen finished the day with 173 yards; while Williams added 140 yards on just 10 attempts.

Florida State never trailed in the game, jumping out to a 14-0 first quarter lead and coasting from there. Kelly Lowrey gave FSU its first lead with a two-yard touchdown plunge and Gary Henry added the second score by returning a blocked punt 42 yards for a score.

For the contest, Florida State piled up an impressive 615 yards of total offense-including a season high of 465 yards on the ground.

After trading touchdowns in each of the first two quarters, LSU took the lead for good with under a minute to go on the half as Dalton Hilliard scored on a two-yard run. LSU recovered a muffed kickoff and Tiger quarterback Alan Risher hit Eric Martin on a 34-yard scoring toss on the next play to give LSU a 28-14 halftime lead.

Hilliard took over in the second half, piling up yardage on his way to a 183-yard, four touchdown

Risher completed eight of 12 passes for 212 yards and three touchdowns to lead the air attack. Blair Williams and Kelly Lowrey combined for 307 yards passing and two scores to provide FSU's lone bright spot.

The Seminoles accepted a Gator Bowl bid after the defeat.

TALLAHASSEE, FLA., DEC. 4—Jim Gainey booted two second half field goals and a slubborn Gator defense stopped a last minute Florida State drive as Florida upset the Seminoles 13-10.

FSU used a one-yard touchdown by Greg Allen and Phil Hall's 37-yard field goal to grab a 10-0 lead in the game, but Florida closed to within three at the half as quarterback Bob Hewko scored on a 10-yard draw to make it 10-7 at the half.

In the second half, both defenses took over with the only scoring coming on Gainey's field goals of 23 and 22 yards. A 26-yard fourth quarter field goal by Phil Hall went wide and a last minute drive by Florida State stalled on the Gator 31 yard line as the Seminoles lost their last regular season game to finish at 8-3.
