



Individual Records

MEDIA INFORMATION

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS: All requests for working press, radio, television, photographer or scouting credentials should be directed to Sports Information Director Wayne Hogan no later than one week prior to the game. Requests for season credentials should be made two weeks prior to the first game.

Space for the working press, radio, television and scouts is allocated by the Sports Information Office.

Florida State's press box is located on the west side of Doak Campbell Stadium with elevator service to all levels. Media representatives and scouts should enter through the press gate, located north of the elevator. The Will Call booth, where media can pick up credentials three hours prior to kickoff on game days, is located outside the gate at the base of the elevator. Will Call credentials will also be available in the Sports Information Office on Fridays prior to games or at the Ramada Inn-North hospitality room until three hours prior to kickoff.

PRESS POLICIES: Working press will be admitted to Level 5, where approximately 90 seats are available. Credentials are issued by FSU according to the following criteria:

(a) Local Newspapers, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponents' area and student newspapers from FSU and opponents' schools.

(b) Other daily newspapers with preference to those which regularly cover FSU.

(c) Scouts.

(d) Non-daily newspapers, with preference to those which have regularly covered FSU.

 (e) Radio and television personnel not actually broadcasting, but considered reporting (seats will be provided in the stands).

RADIO-TV: The sixth level of the press box is designated for use by radio and television broadcasting crews and home and visiting coaches. Each booth is fully enclosed and sound proof.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Only accredited photographers or freelance photographers shooting for the FSU Sports Information Office will be issued working credentials.

The press box catwalk, or photo deck, offers an unobstructed view for TV and movie cameras. Holders of
a photo deck pass will be assigned space in that area.
Still photographers will not be admitted to the press box
and may have access to the sidelines only. Those
holding a still photography credential should report to
the gate specified on the pass where they will be issued
an armband, a set of rosters and a box lunch. A
photographers' lounge area with tables and chairs will
be made available.

Special requests for photographers whose assignments warrant shooting from the photo deck may be made to Sports Information Director Wayne Hogan.

PRESS PARKING: Parking is limited and passes will be issued on a priority basis within the same guidelines as working credentials. The press lot is located on the southwest corner of Doak Campbell Stadium. Access to the lot should be made from Stadium Drive.

STATISTICAL SERVICES: Play-by-play, half-time and complete statistics will be provided. Post-game quotes from FSU head coach Bobby Bowden and the visiting coach will also be available.

REFRESHMENTS: A light pre-game meal will be served on Level 6 of the press box approximately one hour before kickoff. Refreshments will also be made available throughout the game.

TELEPHONES: Telephone service for the FSU press box should be secured directly through Centel Telephone Company of Florida in Tallahassee (904/681-6600). Have them contact the Sports Information Office for location. Due to deregulation, media members must bring their own phones. Centel will provide lines only. When contacting Centel, please be specific

TO THE MEDIA AND FANS -

We are fortunate at Florida State University to have the resources to develop this multi-purpose 1988 Football Guide. No school in this decade has consistently produced publications that rank as high as Florida State's.

I hope that you enjoy this guide and that it will provide interesting insight into the 1988 Seminoles. If you are a member of the media covering FSU, I think that you will find the pertinent information well-organized and easily accessible.

Additional requests by accredited media representatives for items such as feature materials, photographs, slides and video tapes should be directed to the sports information office. We are always standing by ready to serve you.

MID-WEEK INTERVIEWS: Media interviews with all FSU players should be arranged through the Sports Information Office. For phone interviews, the SID office will fill out a card informing the player to return the call. All player calls to the media will be made collect.

Anyone wishing to schedule an interview with head coach Bobby Bowden should contact his secretary, Sue Hall, at (904) 644-1465.

BREAKFAST WITH BOBBY: Following each and every Seminole home game, head coach Bobby Bowden will join the media Sunday morning for breakfast at the Ramada Inn-North (press headquarters). Breakfast will be served at 8:30 a.m. with a question and answer session beginning at 8:45 a.m.

CONFERENCE CALL: Media members may contact Bowden for follow-up material via a Sunday conference call on road game weekends. Contact a member of the Sports Information Office for further information.

POST-GAME INTERVIEW POLICY

Florida State University's athletic staff is well aware of the importance of media coverage and is briefed continually on the role of the media insofar as it interacts with their respective duties. At no time is this cooperation more important than in our post-game interview and locker room procedures. To insure the most workable situation for members of the media and for the FSU staff the following procedures must be observed:

Entrance to the Florida State locker room can be made only through the second floor interview room. All members of the media will be directed to this room by the FSU Sports Information staff immediately at the conclusion of the game. It is most helpful if all media personnel assemble at the tunnel entrance in the north end zone immediately at game's end. You will not be allowed access to the locker room through the players' entrance so follow closely.

Florida State coach Bobby Bowden will be brought directly to the interview room as soon as he dismisses the team and declares the locker room open.

When Coach Bowden makes his appearance in the interview room, those media members wishing to go to the locker room will be instructed as to the proper route. Down one flight of stairs leads directly into the player dressing area.

FLORIDA STATE'S LOCKER ROOM IS OPEN TO ALL MEDIA MEMBERS, MALE AND FEMALE, HOWEVER; IT IS IMPERA-TIVE THAT FEMALE REPORTERS INFORM FSU SPORTS IN-FORMATION PERSONNEL DURING THE GAME THAT THEY WILL NEED LOCKER ROOM ACCESS. (FSU players have been assured that they will be told on a game-by-game basis when there will be female reporters in the locker room - a courtesy we feel must be extended.)

Exit from the locker room and access back to the press box can be made through the players' entrance to the stadium.

It is our desire at Florida State to make the post-game procedures as painless as possible for both the media and our staff. Remember, both groups have important tasks and are under extreme pressure.

The Florida State Athletic Department cannot and will not be responsible for problems incurred by any media member not following the above procedure. Security personnel will facilitate only those following the proper guidelines. If, however, you encounter a problem while following this procedure from any member of our staff or security, please inform a sports information staff member immediately.





t was February and head coach Bobby Bowden was addressing a banquet crowd that had gathered to celebrate his squad's 11-1 season and Fiesta Bowl victory over Nebraska just a month earlier. Bowden waited until the applause had

slowed, and he began to speak.

"The 1987 group didn't leave a lot of room for improvement," he said, looking toward the cluster of tables where his underclassmen were seated. "But they did leave a little." Bowden now shifted his focus to the back of the room where his alumni and fans were seated. "Maybe if these boys can come back with the same attitude they had last year, maybe next year we'll be back here celebrating a national championship."

Of course, the idea was seconded by the crowd with a rousing round of applause,

Now, Bowden and his coaches have spent the spring and a good part of the summer putting together their 1988 team that must be a point better than its predecessor.


"The point" in question was a failed two-point conversion try against Miami in the 1987 College Game of the Year as FSU fell 26-25—a point that stood in the way of a perfect season. The positives far outweigh the negatives in Seminole country, and the return of 43 lettermen and 13 starters (7 on offense, 6 on defense) are the reason for the splendid outlook. Florida State also has a foursome of talented players who are all arguably the best at their positions in the country. On offense, Heisman Trophy candidate Sammie Smith's running will depend on a line led by All-American tackle Pat Tomberlin; on defense noseguard Odell Haggins is a terror up front while Jim Thorpe Award finalist Deion Sanders leads the defense in the open field.

The major areas of concern were addressed and worked on in spring practice, yet there still remains a few questions that Bowden and his staff cannot answer until the first snap in Miami on September 3. That's the day that the Seminoles have been looking forward to for a long year.

Bowden's team must answer questions at quarterback, at both inside linebacker positions, in the overall depth of the defense and the offensive line. The kicking game will also be scrutinized.

Will senior quarterback Chip Ferguson become the solid replacement for 1987 field general Danny McManus? That seems to

be the major question on offense as Florida State looks to the fall campaign. Ferguson won the job in spring practice after losing it briefly to junior Peter Tom Willis, and his performance against Miami will be a key one.

Another goal for the offense is to stabilize the offensive line and develop some depth along the way. Spring practice yielded the squad's major position change—All-South Independent guard Jason Kulpers was moved to center—but tackles Tomberlin (6-4, 303) and Joey Ionata and guards Tony Yeomans and John Brown are all experienced. Offensive coordinator Wayne McDuffie feels that he has a line he can work but backup help is crucial. He will be looking to a line-dominated freshman class for immediate help in the trenches.

Florida State must also replace NFL second round draft pick Pat Carter at tight end, but three returning letterwinners—senior Tom O'Malley and sophomores Reggie Johnson and David Roberts—will make the position solid.

The Seminole running game is a potent weapon with Smith, the 6-2, 220 pound speedster in the backfield. He'll rotate with fellow junior Dexter Carter and senior Victor Floyd. There's more talent behind those three at tailback, too. At fullback, it's more of the same news. The biggest question is who to start—sophomore Edgar Bennett, senior Dayne Williams or junior Marion Butte?

Ferguson has a good group of receivers to throw to, led by junior allstar candidate Ronald Lewis, who had 23 catches a year ago and nabbed the winning touchdown in the Fiesta Bowl. Terry Anthony, Lawrence Dawsey and Bruce LaSane are others who will be heard from most often.

First on the defensive checklist is replacing both inside linebackers, including Butkus Award winner Paul

McGowan. "Our biggest losses were at linebacker," says Bowden. "That's the biggest gap we've got to close."

Junior Keith Carter and sophomore Kelvin Smith came out of the spring with the starting positions. In the fall, however, Carter will be challenged by senior Felton Hayes for that job. Beyond the three, there is no experience and the freshman class is going to have to help out here.

Across the front FSU is stable with a healthy battle going on at one of the outside linebacker positions. Junior Shelton Thompson has one outside linebacker position nailed down but junior Kevin Grant and senior John Hadley are even at the other. The tackles will be big Eric Hayes (6-3, 279) on the left side, a player who was a key in 1987 and should be even better in '88, and senior Steve Gabbard. Hag-

gins is a dominating player at noseguard, though he is slightly undersized at 6-2, 252.

A concern here is backup help at the defensive tackle positions—no other player has any game experience. FSU will need some youngsters to step forward, maybe from the incoming freshman class.

The secondary is long on talent but short in experience in several positions. "The lack of experience concerns you when you've got to start with Miami who has one of the top three or four sophisticated passing games in the country," says Bowden.

Start with Deion Sanders, the 6-0, 195 pound senior who makes it as tough on opponent receivers as he does on SID types trying to find new adjectives to describe his immense talent. Sanders and three-year starting strong safety Stan Shiver will be the leaders in the backfield. Juniors Dedrick Dodge and LeRoy Butler will lessen the impact of a graduated Greg Newell's absence at free safety but filling the second cornerback slot will be a key issue come fall. The loss of Eric Williams and Martin Mayhew, co-starters for the last four years, is a big one. That position is up for grabs with sophomore Corian Freeman and senior Tracy Sanders the leading candidates.

Sophomore Richie Andrews is expected to take over the kicking duties, but he has big shoes to fill with the departure of Derek Schmidt, the NCAA's all-time leading scorer. Local walk-on Bill Mason is still challenging Andrews. The punting chores are expected to fall to incoming freshman John Wimberly, provided he recovers from knee surgery.

OFFENSE

QUARTERBACK


There are some pluses here, but then again so many of the offense's questions surround the Seminole field general. The most obvious question is "who will be the quarterback?" Senior Chip Ferguson, MVP of the Gator Bowl in 1985 as a freshman and an early-season

starter in 1986, goes into the fall with his name first on the depth chart. Junior Peter Tom Willis is right on his heels. Both players have plenty of game experience in their careers—but neither has jumped very far ahead of the other. Then again, that could be a positive situation. If the two veterans can't do the job, then Bowden will turn to a pair of freshman redshirts. Local product Casey Weldon has had more practice time than two-sport athlete Brad Johnson, but both have plenty of potential.

TAILBACK

Bobby Bowden has always seemed to have a problem at this position but the problem has always been a good one. Bowden can never find enough playing time for the talented runners he's had on his rosters in this decade. Heading the 1988 group is Heisman Trophy candidate Sammie Smith. Not much needs to be said about him-at 6-2, 220 and with speed to boot, there aren't many tailbacks who have his talents. Smith also produced to the tune of 1,230 yards in 10 games in 1988. Multi-talented junior Dexter Carter would be the star at most schools but he has to take a back seat to Smithyet because of his pass catching abilities, he's too valuable to sit. He'll rotate series with Smith . Ah, there's more. Third teamer Victor Floyd is the 10th leading rusher in FSU history (Smith is eighth) and he's caught a ton of passes in his career out of the backfield. Somewhere, somehow, this fellow has got to play. He was tried at wide receiver in the spring and can also contribute there. Two others also figure: senior Keith Ross and redshirt freshman Chris Parker. Ross has simply gotten caught up in the numbers game, yet he is talented in his own right. Parker has big play capabilities but his real time is in the future. Injuries? The Seminoles can deal with those.


FULLBACK

Throw three names in the bag, toss it up and choose one. FSU's starting fullback will come from a group that includes sophomore Edgar Bennett, who is listed at first team going into fall drills, senior Dayne Williams and junior Marion Butts. Williams is the incumbent starter and scored 15 touchdowns a year ago. He's the workhorse; the kind of player who is consistent, won't get you beat and can pick up the tough yard. Bennett is the flashiest and has some tailback in him. Both players have the ability to catch passes out of the backfield. Butts is the masher of the group; big and strong, he's the most devastating blocker and he, too, catches well. Fourth teamer Paul Moore, a redshirt freshman, is the prototype fullback for FSU. He's young, and while he'll contribute, he'll have to wait his turn. The fullback position is well stocked and heavily experienced.

WIDE RECEIVER

Florida State returns all but two of its receivers from a year ago. Herb Gainer, who has gone the free agent route with the Pittsburgh Steelers, will be missed for his consistency and experience, but talent remains on this 1988 club. The star of the group is junior Ronald Lewis, a big-play receiver who was third on the team with 23 catches in 1987. He's the flanker and the player opponents will have to stop. At split end, junior and two-year letterman Terry Anthony will step in for Gainer. Lewis' backups at flanker are sophomore Lawrence Dawsey, a player with some experience, and redshirt sophomore Felton Cook, who must overcome academic battles over

the summer. Backing up Anthony is junior Bruce LaSane, a player who has big-time potential written all over him, and consistent Scott DiMare. There's not a senior in this group. Lewis is the star, and there's plenty of experience and talent at this position.

TIGHT END

You're tight end coach Brad Scott and you've just lost four-year starter and All-American Pat Carter to the NFL. What do you do? "Now everyone is going to see what kind of a coach I am," Scott jokes. Actually, Scott is not worried although he knows that a player like Carter comes around once in a career. Scott has three lettermen returning and a very competitive situation going on at the position. Senior Tom O'Malley has played in Carter's shadow for four years, and the job is his if he can withstand a challenge from sophomore Reggie Johnson in the fall. Johnson's play caused excitement last spring - he has the most talent and speed of all the tight ends. Third teamer David Roberts lettered a year ago and will also see action. Because the Seminoles travel with four tight ends, Scott will be looking for one of three players to step forward. They include Johnny Clower, a 6-5 Pat Carter-type prospect who sat out '87 because of Proposition 48, and incoming freshmen Eric McGill and Carl Simpson.

OFFENSIVE TACKLE

Both starters return, but once again, it's the backup situation that offensive coordinator Wayne McDuffie will be looking to improve. Huge 6-4, 303 pound senior All-American Pat Tomberlin handles the chores at tight tackle; Tomberlin doesn't usually need a backup anyway. On the split side is senior Joe Ionata, a steady two-year starter. Backups include sophomores Eric Luallen and Scott Schilbrack on the tight side and redshirt freshman Reggie Dixon on the split side. McDuffie makes no bones about the fact that he's looking for backup help from the incoming freshman class.

OFFENSIVE GUARD

The top three players from a year ago return, but offensive coordinator Wayne McDuffie has had to do some scrambling here. Jason Kuipers, a two-year starter, has vacated his tight guard position to move to center. If a freshman comes through at center, Kuipers could rotate back here. Also returning are juniors Tony Yeomans and John Brown, a pair who shared the split guard duties a year ago. McDuffie has Brown penciled in as the starter at that position for '88 and has moved Yeomans over to Kuiper's slot. Promising sophomore Hayward Haynes is behind Yeomans and another player with super potential, redshirt freshman Mike Morris, is behind Brown. Throw in Ron Byrom as a backup at either side. Again, a few question marks and the lack of stability is the trademark of this position.

CENTER

This position, along with quarterback, will be the biggest question mark in the fall. Kuipers has moved over here to replace the graduated Mark Salva and there is really no experience whatsoever. Offensive coordinator Wayne McDuffie tried several players at the position last spring, including converted linebacker Chris Nicolas, guard Tony Yeomans and redshirt freshman Jim Bekas. McDuffie will be looking for an incoming freshman to step in here; otherwise he'll go with Kuipers until a young player has time to develop. Coaches will be looking to get right to the heart of this matter once fall practice begins.

THE DEFENSE

OUTSIDE LINEBACKER

There's as much talent at outside linebacker in 1988 as there's been in all of Bobby Bowden's years at Florida State. Position coach Jim Gladden has five players who can contribute. Part-time '87 starters Shelton Thompson and Kevin Grant appear to be the frontrunners again in 1988, but the emergence of former defensive back John Hadley is a definite plus. Hadley is giving Grant quite a challenge at the one slot for starting rights, while Anthony Moss is an able and experienced backup on the other side. A fifth player, former walkon Phil Carollo, could also see some plays. Perhaps the biggest surprise of the spring was redshirt freshman Howard Dinkins, a player who Gladden calls "the quickest outside linebacker I've ever coached." Dinkins is still undisciplined, but he could make headway into some playing time. Talent and experience at this position spell an improved defense.

Hayes is a big-play guy and coaches are expecting to see more of the same statistics in 1988 as he showed in '87: six tackles for loss, four sacks, six passes broken up, three fumbles caused and three recoveries. At the right side is senior Steve Gabbard, a consistent type who was sidelined with some injuries a year ago. Behind those two stalwarts is youth, inexperience, and concern for position coach Chuck Amato. Someone in a group of four redshirt freshmen—Henry and Joe Ostaszewski, Gene Houpe or Corey Senior—will have to step to the forefront. 
NOSEGUARD

A year ago this position had question marks attached; now it is a definite bonus position. The ability of junior Odell Haggins to convert to the position last year and turn in the best statistics since All-American Ron Simmons' seasons in the late 70s was a key to the successes in 1987. Now, Haggins is an All-American candidate who will have to prove that he's one of the nation's best. His 1987 statistics surely bear out his talent—73 tackles, eight sacks, four tackles for loss, etc., etc. Behind Haggins there's a two-man race for the backup slot between 1987 backup Magdi El Shahawy and redshirt frosh Frank Romeo. El Shahawy has a slight edge based on experience.

INSIDE LINEBACKER

Last year he coached the Butkus Award winner, but this year he is flat out worried. Linebacker coach Wally Burnham must not only replace Paul McGowan, but twin starter David Palmer as well. Burnham has also lost young players he had been grooming—Odell Haggins to noseguard and John Eaford to an automobile accident a year ago.

So let's start over. Junior Keith Carter and sophomore Kelvin Smith have the inside track on the two starting positions after last spring's workouts. Phillip Ferrell, a true freshman who enrolled in January, lines up behind Carter and Hayes but he's not ready to play. Walkon John Merna is also available. Burnham will be asking for help from the freshman class, and the return of Eaford, provided he gets medical clearance, could be a bonus. SAFETY

Says defensive coordinator Mickey Andrews: "If you're going to war, you want those two with you." At free safety, FSU lost three years of irreplaceable game experience in Greg Newell, but understudy Dedrick Dodge has been groomed to take over the position. Behind Dodge is the gifted LeRoy Butler, who should challenge in the fall. Sophomore Bill Ragans will be a backup at strong safety, unless John Wyche (broken leg) can return this year. If that is the case, Ragans will switch back to free safety.

On one side, Florida State returns the best athlete who has ever graced the FSU campus—Deion Sanders—but on the other side the Seminoles lost seven to eight years of starting experience with the departure of co-starters Eric Williams and Martin Mayhew. Sanders, of course, is everybody's All-American, and will become FSU's highest draft pick ever when the '88 season is over. Enemy quarterbacks avoid him like the plague. On the right side, there's not much game experience to speak of. Senior Tracy Sanders has been at the position for a little over a year, but he doesn't have a lot of repetitions under his belt. And, he's not even the projected starter going into the fall. Corian Freeman, a redshirt freshman with no game experience is the starter, but Sanders (Tracy, that is) will have a chance to win the position. The backups are converted quarterback Alan Stewart and sophomore redshirt Ray Gibson, provided his studies have rebounded by the fall campaign.

THE KICKING GAME

THE KICKERS

Gone from Seminole Land is Derek Schmidt, the NCAA's all-time leading scorer in Division I college football history and one of the top field goal kickers in the nation in 1987. Also departed is punter Rick Tuten, who had a poor senior year after a pre-season sickness that sapped his strength. Schmidt's understudy, sophomore Richie Andrews, used a year of eligibility in 1987 while he handled kickoffs. Andrews certainly has the credentials from high school but has yet to be tested on this level. His leg is strong and he can kick the long ones. Should his consistency in close be a problem, coaches can turn to sophomore Bill Mason, a recruited walkon from Tallahassee. Incoming freshman John Wimberly was to take over the punting

responsibilities but his availability is in question; unfortunately he tore up a knee in the off-season but doctors think his rehab is on schedule. Should Wimberly not be able to punt, FSU will look to walkons to fullfill this need.—Tim Corlew heads that list of prospects. Florida State has a lot of uncertainty in the kicking area, but if potential produces the outlook will be very bright.


THE KICK RETURNERS

Plenty of excitement once again! FSU returns both its punt returner and a pair of successful kickoff returners. Start with Deion Sanders on punt returns—he owns the FSU season and career yardage records and is one of the most dazzling performers at any level of football in America. He has returned two punts for TDs in his career and last year's average of 11.90 was the 14th best in college football. While those statistics aren't THAT amazing, consider that Sanders usually returns punts without any blockers since FSU emphasizes the punt block play. The combination of Keith Ross and Dexter Carter returns on the kickoff team for their third year together—Ross was listed in NCAA return stats as a freshman and sophomore before injuries limited his playing time a year ago. The two teamed up to return one 100 yards vs. Miami in 1986.

SEMINOLES TO RETIRE RON SIMMONS' NUMBER

Florida State has retired two numbers in its 41-year history of football and will retire a third this fall. RON SIMMONS' #50 will join FRED BILETNIKOFF's #25 and RON SELLERS' #34 as numbers that will never be worn again. Current Seminole offensive guard John Brown, a junior, will be the last player to wear Simmons' jersey number.

Simmons was the first big-name player recruited to Florida State by Bobby Bowden when he arrived in 1977. He made the biggest impact that any freshman at Florida State has ever made -- 12 sacks and 13 tackles for loss were among his tackle stats in his initial year. Against North Texas State, Simmons had 19 tackles, including five sacks. Football News tabbed him its Freshman Defensive Lineman of the Year. By his junior and senior years in 1979 and 1980, he was a consensus All-American and it is not a coincidental fact that the Seminoles played in their first two New Year's Day games -- both Orange Bowls -- in those seasons. In 1979, playing with a wrist injury, he had 81 total hits; six were quarterback sacks and 17 were tackles for loss. As a senior playing with an ankle injury, he led the FSU defense to its highest ranking ever. A look at Simmons' career marks will bear out his greatness — he still holds the FSU record for tackles for loss (44) and quarterback sacks (25) in a career. His 483 tackles are second on the all-time Seminole list. Simmons never lost to the University of Florida and he is a member of FSU's Hall of Fame.
