NOSEGUARD 6-2, 268, Senior Bartow, Florida (Bartow High School)


Top noseguard in the nation heading into 1989...a preseason first team All-America selection by Don Heinrich's College Football...also tabbed by College & Pro Football Newsweekly as a preseason All-American...second team All-America choice his junior year...most dominating Seminole nosequard since two-time All-America Ron Simmons in 1979-80...has literally grown into the position, gaining 38 pounds since making the switch from linebacker two seasons ago...showed his value to the team in several situations last season, especially in Clemson and Georgia Southern games...played with pain throughout the year and underwent knee surgery between Florida and Sugar Bowl games...coaches laud his leadership qualities as well as his playing abilities...has tremendous knack for fighting off blocks to make tackles...his presence in the middle of the Florida State defense improves the play of the entire line...ranked third on the team in tackles last season...unusual for a noseguard to make so many stops...spent part of the spring running with the track team to increase quickness...called back to spring practice with other fifthyear seniors, which was key to defensive progress...one of four All-America candidates for Florida State last season, he's the only one on this year's team...needs to avoid disabling injuries to knees and ankles which limited his playing time last season...has 11 career sacks and 178 tackles in three seasons...1988: the combination of Haggins on the line and Deion Sanders in the secondary was too much for most offenses to handle...made 68 tackles and totalled three quarterback sacks as a second team All-America choice...also earned honorable mention All-America honors from The Sporting News and All-South Independent recognition...began the year by leading FSU in tackles against Miami, despite spraining an ankle...gave extremely "gutsy" performance in Clemson game as he played with excruciating pain...trainers tried to hold him out of the game, but when it got close in the fourth quarter, he was in there...credited with eight tackles in the contest...ankle problems hampered his playing time in next three games...against Georgia Southern, he dressed but did not start...with FSU down 10-7 in the fourth quarter and the Eagles pinned deep in their own territory, he entered the game for one series...in for five plays, he made three tackles, forcing GSC to punt...Florida State scored on its next possession to take the lead for good...came back in the next game against East Carolina and compiled a team-leading 13 tackles...credited with 16 tackles against South Carolina in his top performance of '88... intercepted a tipped pass and returned it 11 yards for a touchdown against Florida...first touchdown of his football career, stretching back to his pre-high school days...played well in the Sugar Bowl with seven tackles, although he was coming back from knee surgery... 1987: led the defense to its best ranking since 1980 and made several all-star teams...a second-team All-South Independent choice and honorable mention Associated Press All-American...left '87 spring drills as a starter at inside linebacker, but was told in fall he would be the starting noseguard instead...wanted to return to linebacker at the conclusion of the season, but played so well he's never gone back...totalled 73 tackles, fourth best on the team...turned in great performances against Michigan State and Auburn...credited with 14 tackles, two tackles for loss, two sacks and a caused fumble against MSU...in Auburn game, broke through for three quarterback sacks and a tackle for loss among eight tackles...named co-most improved player along with Eric Hayes by the coaching staff following the season... 1986: in backup duty at linebacker, made 37 tackles, including three for loss...broke up four passes...showed signs of great things to come with a team-high 10 tackles and a fumble recovery vs. Wichita State...also made nine stops vs. Southern Miss and eight against Michigan...1985: played on FSU's scout team while being redshirted...named defensive scout team Player of the Year... High School: a third team all-state selection as a senior at Bartow...played both inside and outside linebacker...former teammate of offensive lineman Hayward Haynes...Personal Notes: has put on 38 pounds since his freshman season...increased his bench press 130 pounds, to 420 since his arrival...majoring in criminology...born February 27, 1967...

Used a redshirt year in 1989 to gain size and speed...lacks experience but should get plenty of work in preseason drills...needs to work on mobility and flexibility...comes from same high school as last year's strong safety, Stan Shiver...coaches describe him as a "faster Shiver"...good speed and ability to hit with authority make him prime safety material...should continue to improve in back-up role to Bill Ragans...1988: redshirted as a true freshman...High School: named to first team 4A all-state team as picked by the Atlanta Constitution...had 80 tackles and four interceptions as a senior...played in the Florida-Georgia All-Star game...Personal Notes: born on the same day as Tommy Henry (November 4, 1969)...

Begins fall drills listed behind Bill Ragans and John Wyche at strong safety...could contribute at that position and also on special teams...lacks great speed but plays well against the run...quick first steps make him a natural for punt block duty...physical tackler...strong player with good knowledge of position... 1988: walked on to the team and earned a starting position on the punt block unit when injuries hit...only true walk-on to letter in '88...in on four tackles on the season...recovered a fumble on the opening kickoff of the Michigan State game...one of the mainstays of the punt block team...High School: starred at Georgia's Lassiter High at defensive back...Personal Notes: a movement science/physical education major...born April 9, 1968...

5-11, 197, Freshman Moore Haven, Florida (Moore Haven High School)

Enters the fall as third team strong safety behind Dedrick Dodge and Leon Fowler...needs to gain experience at defensive back on the college level...all the physical skills are there...good speed and excellent size make him good safety material...coaches feel he will show considerable improvement in '89 after redshirt season...beginning to make instinctive reactions necessary to be an effective defensive back...excels against the run...likes to hit...should push Fowler for reserve duty...1988: redshirted as a pure freshman...High School: named to first team all-state (Class A) squad as a utility back...an option quarterback in high school...first noticed at the Bobby Bowden Football Camp...led basketball team to final four in state playoffs...Personal Notes: plans to major in computer science...born September 19, 1969...

LeROY BUTLER

CORNERBACK 6-0, 194, Senior Jacksonville, Florida (Lee High School)

Among Florida State's most recognized players because of his role in the "Puntrooskie" play which put FSU in position to beat Clemson last year...made a switch from free safety to cornerback in the spring...enters fall practice as first team right cornerback...coaches are pleased with his transition to the corner and feel his speed and physical style will make him a solid pass defender...played nickel back in pass situations and showed ability to break on the ball once it's in the air...excellent tackler with great nose for the football... 1988: split time with Dedrick Dodge at free safety...led the secondary in tackles last year with 59...his 42 solo stops and 17 assists ranked fourth on the squad in total tackles...collected 10 or more tackles in three games (Clemson -10, Georgia Southern -11, and East Carolina -10)...his role in "the play" made him famous...FSU faced fourth down and four on its own 21-yard line with the scored knotted at 21 when the Seminoles went into punt formation...the ball was snapped to up-back Dayne Williams, who placed the ball between Butler's legs...Butler hesitated while his teammates ran right, then raced 78 yards down the left sideline before being pulled down at the one...

broke knuckle during the Louisiana Tech game...after surgery, played the last five contests with a soft cast for protection...made four tackles and broke up a pass in the Sugar Bowl win over Auburn...broke up five passes and intercepted two during his junior campaign...returned an interception 26 yards for a touchdown in the win over Michigan State...the play broke open a 16-7 game...returned his other INT 37 yards against South Carolina...made a season-high 11 tackles against Georgia Southern, including six solo drops...took over punt return duties when All-America Deion Sanders injured his knee...had four punt returns for 52 yards, averaging 13.0 for the season.... 1987: made major contributions on the special teams while playing a limited role in the secondary...compiled 41 tackles and broke up a pass as a sophomore...best game of the year came against Furman when he totalled eight tackles...had six stops against both Memphis State and Louisville...returned four kickoffs for an average of 23.0 yards early in the year as a substitute for an injured Keith Ross... 1986: used a year of ineligibility to get solid academic footing as a freshman...High School: probably the most honored player FSU signed in 1986...named to the Bally and Adidas All-America teams...scout Joe Terranova listed Butler on his top 100 recruits...a Super 24 Senior, he ended his career by playing in the Florida-Georgia All-Star game...made 139 tackles and five interceptions as a senior...also carried the ball 31 times, averaging 15.3 yards per carry...Personal Notes: one of the leaders of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes organization on campus...majoring in social science...born July 19, 1968...




Begins fall drills as the man to beat at weak side linebacker...excellent fundamentals and technique make up for lack of size...aggressive player who is a seasoned college linebacker, although only a sophomore...1988: one of only four members of last year's recruiting class who was not redshirted...ended season as the Tribe's fifth leading tackler with 50...led the Seminoles with 10 tackles against Michigan State, his hometown school...backed up Felton Hayes at linebacker during his freshman year...earned starting duties when Hayes injured an ankle in midseason...made 27 solo stops among his 50 tackles...credited with 10 tackles against both Michigan State and Southern Miss...caused a fumble and made a tackle for loss against Southern Miss...registered seven stops and

broke up a pass against Louisiana Tech...had 11 tackles over final two regular season games...High School: an honorable mention USA Today All-American...made 115 tackles and seven interceptions as a senior...also caught 44 passes for 670 yards...made two all-state teams as a tight end and three as a linebacker...picked for 22-member Michigan "Dream Team" and was league's defensive player of the year...Personal Notes: grew up in the shadows of Michigan State...father coached five years with MSU Head Coach George Perles under the legendary Duffy Daugherty...Perles was best man in Kirk's father's wedding...brought better than a 3.2 grade point average to FSU, where he plans to major in business and minor in communication...has two brothers who played football for Central Michigan...born July 15, 1970...





Slated to back up All-America candidate Odell Haggins at noseguard in 1989...classic noseguard build with short, powerful frame...hard worker with an intense attitude on the field...strong athlete who will improve once he masters technique...solid back-up player along the defensive front which allows coaches to rest Haggins...impressive freshman year foretells good things in the future...1988: surprised coaching staff with his abilities and saw considerable playing time...played well in substitute role when Haggins was injured...saw his first action in game five against Tulane ...made a pair of tackles in the contest...registered 13 tackles during freshman year, including five solo stops...his best game came against Georgia Southern when he had six tackles...one of only four members of last year's freshman class who was not redshirted...High School: earned first team 4A all-state honors as a senior...had 83 tackles, four fumble recoveries and four sacks...also played fullback and punted in high school...benched 430 pounds in high school, and is among FSU's strongest players....Personal Notes: outstanding student whose mother is dean of students at his former high school...born November 6, 1970...


DEFENSIVE TACKLE 6-3, 250, Freshman Winter Garden, Florida (West Orange High School)

Impressed coaches during the fall of his freshman year and had worked his way up the depth chart until a serious elbow injury sidelined him...worked hard in weight room to make up for strength loss during injury...if he can regain physical skills in time for preseason workouts, he will compete for a reserve role at defensive tackle... 1988: redshirted with an elbow injury...High School: USA Today named Deondri one of the nation's top 100 high school seniors...the Orlando Touchdown Club's Defensive Player of the Year...named to Orlando Sentinel's All-South squad...many considered him the top defensive line prospect in the state...played in Florida-Georgia All-Star game...first team 4A all-state selection...Personal Notes: plans to major in criminal justice...born February 25, 1970...



Begins redshirt freshman year in the heat of the battle for a reserve role at weak side linebacker...excellent physical specimen who used rookie season to increase strength...performance in preseason drills will determine his place in 1989...needs experience at inside linebacker spot...1988: redshirted as a true freshman...increased playing weight by 20 pounds during redshirt season... High School: one of the most heavily recruited athletes in the state as a senior...first team 4A all-state selection...made 144 tackles, including 95 solo...Personal Notes: cousin of former FSU All-America, and current Detroit Lions tight end, Pat Carter...president of the Melbourne student body as a senior...plans to major in electrical engineering...born January 29, 1970...

Under Bobby Bowden, Florida State teams have been successful on artificial turf as well as on grass. The Tribe is 20-11 since 1976 on astroturf and has won six straight on the surface. The total includes a pair of bowl game wins, the 1986 All-American Bowl and the 1989 Sugar Bowl. Four of those games were played at the Superdome in New Orleans, where FSU has a 3-1 record on the field. In 1989, Florida State sees the artificial turf twice, once inside and once outside. The Seminoles go on the road to play Syracuse at the Carrier Dome and play Florida in the season-ender on Florida Field. Both feature artificial surfaces.



Returns to compete for the starting position at the "bandit" outside linebacker spot...tremendous speed makes him the most elusive of FSU's defensive front...speed also makes him dangerous to opposing backs...coaches feel increased strength and size will make him one of the Seminoles' top pass rushers in 1989...needs only experience and improved decision-making habits to become an impact player...will play in many second and third down situations and on nickel defense...can cover backs or go for the sack...plays much bigger than listed size...player to watch for 1989...1988: during the regular season, ranked second to Anthony Moss in sacks with four...came through with possibly the biggest sack of the season in the Sugar Bowl game...dropped Auburn QB Reggie Slack for an 11yard loss as the Tigers were driving for the game-winning touchdown...gave Auburn fits in their pass blocking all night long...also among team leaders in passes broken up with six last year...credited with 27 tackles as a freshman, 18 solo stops...blocked a Louisiana Tech punt out of the end zone for a Florida State safety...six tackles against Georgia Southern proved season high...notched two sacks each in Michigan State and Tulane games...1987: redshirted as a freshman, but made impression on coaching staff with three sacks in 1988 spring game...High School: joined Ribault graduates Corey Senior, Kelvin Smith and Reggie Dixon in signing with FSU...missed most of his senior season with a broken leg...Personal Notes: born April 26, 1969...




Returns to starting role at free safety in 1989 after making six interceptions from that position last season...will be the only returning defensive back with experience at his position this year...split time with LeRoy Butler last season, but Butler is now one of FSU's starting cornerbacks...must assume leadership role in secondary...will

be called on to make defensive adjustments on the field...savvy player who uses technique to his advantage...adept at making adjustments to thrown ball while on coverage, enabling him to get in position to make the pickoff...1988: tied All-America Deion Sanders for the team lead in interceptions with five during the regular season...played an important role in the Sugar Bowl victory with an interception and two passes broken up...returned one of his thefts 33 yards for a score against Louisiana Tech...only defensive back to grab two interceptions in a game, nabbing a pair against Tulane...compiled 31 tackles...his season high total of six tackles came against Southern Miss...knee injury limited his playing time early in the season...started last five games for the Tribe... 1987: started the Texas Tech game and was Greg Newell's back-up in all the others...played primarily on special teams and on the nickel defense...totalled 24 tackles and two interceptions along with four pass breakups...pass thefts came against East Carolina and Auburn... 1986: made 30 tackles while playing on nickel defense and special teams...returned one of his two interceptions 47 yards for a touchdown against Southern Miss... 1985: redshirted as a true freshman... High School: earned first team (Class 2A) all-state status as a receiver at Mulberry High...caught 52 passes for 617 yards and had 12 interceptions...shoulder surgery cut his senior year short...Personal Notes: born Dedrick Allen, he changed his name as a high school senior after he was legally adopted by Richmond and Ann Dodge...nicknamed "The Blade" ... a criminology major...born June 14, 1967...

Had surgery to injured shoulder during the off-season and should be 100 percent by fall...excellent worker with great potential...carries his weight easily and should get bigger and stronger with time...height makes him great defensive line prospect...maintained good work habits during shoulder rehabilitation...1988: redshirted along with almost all the members of his recruiting class...used redshirt year to build up physical strength...increased his vertical leap over five inches in one year...also increased bench press 15 pounds despite shoulder injury... Scheduled to back up Dedrick Dodge at free safety...LeRoy Butler's move to cornerback allowed him to move quickly up the depth chart this spring...went out for baseball last January and was late beginning spring drills...great size and improving strength make him a solid candidate for playing time in the secondary...possesses good speed and natural abilities in pass coverage...needs experience and discipline to reach potential...1988: redshirted along with most of his class...probably got as much work against first team offense in practice as any redshirt...should benefit from the year spent learning from some of the top secondary players in FSU history...High School: option quarterback and defensive back at Ft. Myers High...named to Florida Super 24 team...played in Florida-Georgia All-Star game...completed 38 of 78 passes for 524 yards...also intercepted five passes...high school teammate of FSU classmate Robbie Baker...Personal Notes: born May 16, 1970...

CORNERBACK 6-4, 221, Junior Jacksonville, Florida (Terry Parker High School)

Steps into a starting role at the cornerback spot vacated by Deion Sanders...emerged from spring drills as the man to beat, although coaches expect a battle in the fall before the starter is announced...one of the biggest cornerbacks in the nation...has speed to stay with smaller receivers...physical player whose primary weakness lies in lack of experience...needs to eliminate mental mistakes to be an exceptional talent... 1988: spent his sophomore year as a back-up to both Sanders' at cornerback...started against Tulane and Georgia Southern when Deion Sanders injured his knee...made 23 tackles on the year, including 14 solo stops...knocked away four passes...best performance came against Southern Miss when he was in on five tackles...exceptional special teams player who served as wedge breaker on kickoff team... 1987: filled the role of "hit man" on punt and kickoff teams...had 19 tackles and recovered a fumble, playing in all 11 games...named co-MVP, along with John Wyche, of the kickoff team for the season... 1986: injured his knee and underwent arthroscopic surgery during redshirt year...High School: second team all-state after a senior year where he had 55 tackles and three interceptions...Personal Notes: has run times of 4.52 and 4.53 in the 40...born August 16, 1968...

Impressed coaches with excellent attitude and leadership qualities...could see considerable playing time during rookie year...possesses great athletic ability and desire...needs experience to become an impact player...physical player whose performance during preseason drills will determine his role...provides valuable depth to talented linebacking corps...1988: redshirted as a true

freshman...gained 15 pounds and increased his bench press 50 pounds since coming to Florida State... High School: second team Class 3A all-state choice...played both defensive end and tight end as a prep...injured late in his senior season...also participated on track team that won back-to-back state championships... Personal Notes: plans to major in criminology...born May 8, 1970...



Appeared headed for a banner junior year, but broke his leg in practice after the Miami game and was sidelined for the rest of the season...redshirted earlier in career, so the injury cost him a year of eligibility...already a veteran outside linebacker, he provides needed experience at the position...a good coverage man with good speed...broken right arm left him weakened going into last fall, but increased his upper body strength while mending the leg... 1988: made six tackles, one for a loss, in season opener against Miami...1987: started three games (Memphis State, Michigan State and Miami) and saw time at both outside linebacking positions...credited with 43 tackles, including a season high eight vs. Louisville...totalled three quarterback sacks and caused three fumbles as a sophomore...1986: played in spot situations at outside linebacker and contributed on special teams...in on 24 tackles...led the FSU defense with a career high 11 tackles against Southern Miss...injured a knee in spring workouts following his freshman year...1985: redshirted as a pure freshman...High School: earned all-conference honors as a senior at Forest High...played running back, defensive end and linebacker during his career...Personal Notes: an economics and computer science major...born July 26, 1967...


