

KIRK CARRUTHERS Inside Linebacker 6-2, 212, Junior East Lansing, MI (East Lansing HS)

The top linebacker in collegiate football...has the ability to dominate a game from his weak side linebacking spot...the leader of Florida State's 1990 defense...led FSU in tackles as a sophomore with 145, 45 more than the next player...consistent performer who shines in big games...not very big, but has great desire to get to the ball...also uses good fundamentals and technique to make up for a lack of size...aggressive player with good linebacking instincts...can put on a big hit as well...excellent pursuit man...when Florida State needed a big defensive play in 1989, Carruthers was there...improved against the pass and it showed as he ranked second on the team with three interceptions last season...strong against the run with the ability to weed through blockers and make the stop...has improved every year since his arrival at Florida State...only a junior, he is one of the most experienced players on the FSU defense...lone inside linebacker with more than one season of work at the position...accumulated 195 career tackles in his twoyear career, including 104 solo...nearly tripled his tackle total between freshman and sophomore seasons...has potential to become one of FSU's top defenders ever...without an experienced defensive line, his job will be tougher in 1990...1989: in addition to impressive tackle total, credited with four tackles for loss and four quarterback sacks...a first team All-South Independent choice by the Associated Press...FSU's leading tackler in every game except Clemson and LSU...hit double figures in tackles in nine regular season contests and the Fiesta Bowl...only Seminole to make 16 tackles in a game...reached that number three times, against Auburn, Miami and South Carolina...broke up five passes and snared three interceptions on the year...caused a pair of fumbles and recovered one...expected to share time with Kelvin Smith, but Smith's playing time was limited by injuries before a cervical sprain sidelined





West Virginia 28, East Carolina 14 1970 him for good...starred in the biggest game of the year vs. Miami...made 16 tackles, intercepted two passes and recovered a UM fumble at the FSU one-yard line to prevent a Hurricane touchdown that would have given Miami the lead...earned ESPN player of the game recognition...named national player of the week by both Sports Illustrated and The Sporting News following that performance...broke through for sacks against Virginia Tech, Syracuse and Clemson ...recorded 11 unassisted tackles, a tackle for loss and a sack in FSU's Fiesta Bowl victory over Nebraska...lone bright spot for Florida State in season-opening loss to Southern Miss...made 15 tackles and returned an interception 18 yards...ranked second on the team in interceptions and third in passes broken up...1988: one of only four players from the 1988 recruiting class who was not redshirted...ended the year as the Tribe's fifth leading tackler with 50...led the Seminoles with 10 tackles against Michigan State, his hometown school...spent

most of the year as the back-up to Felton Hayes on the weak side...earned starting duties when Hayes injured an ankle in midseason...counted 27 solo stops among his 50 tackles...credited with 10 tackles against both Michigan State and Southern Miss...caused a fumble and made a tackle for loss against USM...registered seven stops and broke up a pass against Louisiana Tech...High School: an honorable mention USA Today All-American...made 115 tackles and grabbed seven interceptions as a senior...also caught 44 passes for 670 yards...made two all-state teams as a tight end and three as a linebacker...picked for the 22-member Michigan "Dream Team"...Personal Notes: grew up in the shadows of Michigan State...father coached five years with MSU Head Coach George Perles under the legendary Duffy Daugherty...Perles was the best man in Kirk's father's wedding...a business major with a minor in communication...two brothers played football for Central Michigan...born July 15,

LAWRENCE DAWSEY

Wide Receiver 6-1, 195, Senior Dothan, AL (Northview HS)

One of the top receivers in the nation heading into 1990...ready to put up All-America numbers as the only remaining member of 1989's "Fabulous Four" ...proved to be the top member of that FSU receiving group last season, even though he was the only underclassman of the bunch...possesses all the qualities of a top receiver, but toughness may be his most outstanding attribute...the undisputed leader of the Florida State offense...fights for every catch and for every yard...hates to be tackled, even in practice, and is hard to bring down...if he's near the ball, he'll catch it...clutch receiver who looks to get the ball in crucial situations...also the man coaches want to have the ball in those conditions...runs precise routes and will sacrifice his body to make a catch...an excellent downfield blocker...provides example to the entire team with his hard work and positive attitude...will spend time teaching FSU's new group of receivers in his senior season...loves the physical aspect of football nearly as much as catching passes...practice player with a competitive attitude..."blue-collar" receiver who is not super fast or flashy, just gets the job done...also a threat on the reverse...will probably surrender kickoff return duties in 1990 to save himself for offensive play... brings a 21-game consecutive reception streak into the 1990 season...has caught at least one pass in 21 straight games, dating back to the 1988 Clemson contest...has ability to get to the end zone after making a catch with 13 TD grabs in his career...ranks eighth on the Seminole career touchdown receptions list...needs to score five TDs receiving this season to reach fourth place on the all-time career chart and pass former FSU greats like Fred Biletnikoff and Hassan Jones...also will climb onto the career charts for receptions and receiving yardage in 1990...ex-cused from most of spring drills as a fifth-year senior...1989: surpassed his senior comrades, Ronald Lewis, Terry Anthony and Bruce LaSane, to lead FSU in receiving although listed as the second team flanker...earned first team All-South Independent recognition from the Associated Press...big numbers were due to consistency throughout the season...led the Tribe in receiving in only three games...only FSU

player to catch at least one pass in every game...grabbed four TD passes in 1989, including a 56-yarder against Tulane...totalled 38 catches for 683 yards on the season...no Seminole player had caught that many passes in a season since 1984, when Jessie Hester grabbed 42...recorded a pair of 100yard receiving days, against Clemson and Tulane...was the Seminole offense against the Tigers with seven catches for 106 yards...snared only three passes against Tulane, but totalled 107 yards and a pair of TDs...caught four passes for 66 yards against Nebraska in FSU's Fiesta Bowl victory...rushed four times on the reverse during the year and picked up 21 yards...a reliable kick returner who handled kickoffs for 342 yards, a 20.1 average...best return was a 49-yarder against Memphis State...returned four kicks for 79 yards against Auburn...1988: led Florida State with 10 touchdowns (nine receiving, one on the reverse) as a sophomore...unlikely candidate for that distinction as the back-up flanker ...highest average per catch among Seminole receivers with 20.3 mark...made the longest reception of the season, a 93-yard touchdown grab against Southern Miss...it is the third longest scoring pass in FSU history...reached the end zone in eight of 11 regular season games...top game came at South Carolina with five catches for 99 yards and a pair of rushes for 65 yards, including a 40-yard reverse...FSU's leading rusher in the game...put the Tribe's first score on the board in the Michigan State, Georgia Southern and Florida games...made a great play against Florida by grabbing a pass, eluding tacklers and halfrunning, half-stumbling into the end zone...started the Sugar Bowl game with Lewis sidelined...1987: caught seven passes for 82 yards, an 11.7 average...started at Michigan State and ran 23 yards on the reverse on FSU's first offensive play...made three catches for 34 yards against Southern Miss...1986: spent a season as a redshirt wide receiver which now makes him the lone senior receiver...named FSU's most improved player following spring workouts...High School: played five different positions for his high school team and earned first team all-state honors in Class 6A...the top receiver in the state of Alabama and an all-South choice by Lindy's...rushed for 925 yards while playing with a broken arm most of the year...Personal Notes: ran the 40 in 4.57 seconds...raised his vertical jump eight inches to 35 since his arrival at FSU...member of the FCA organization on campus...an economics major...born November 16, 1967.



Inside Linebacker 6-0, 215, Sophomore Tifton, GA (Tift County HS)

Enters fall drills in a head-to-head battle with Sterling Palmer for first team strong side linebacker spot...made successful transition from strong safety to inside linebacker during spring drills...coaches were impressed with his natural ability and big hit capability during spring...somewhat hampered by a knee problem, but logged enough time to convince coaches he's sound...while knee was hurt, made great gains in upper body strength...1989: played extensively in third-and-long situations...came into the game on obvious passing downs...played most downs from strong safety spot although he did line up on the inside some...made 20 tackles, including eight solo, in 1989...also broke up a pass and intercepted another...interception came in the third quarter of the Tulane game...took the ball on the TU 20 and returned it 12 yards to the eight, setting up an FSU touchdown two plays later...made a season high four tackles against Miami...credited with half a sack against Virginia Tech...a member of the punt and kickoff coverage units...1988: redshirted as a true freshman...High School: named to first team 4A allstate squad as picked by the Atlanta Constitution ...made 80 tackles and four interceptions as a senior...played in the Florida-Georgia All-Star game...Personal Notes: gained 15 pounds since his arrival at FSU...born on the same day as Tommy Henry (November 4, 1969)...one of a handful of married Seminoles.

Missed spring drills while rehabilitating his knee solid reserve after surgery...a safety...punishing tackler with good football instincts...needs more seasoning in secondary in passing situations...plays the run extremely well...aggressive defender...runs like a safety, hits like a linebacker...1989: in on 15 tackles as a redshirt freshman...nailed 10 ballcarriers by himself last season...caused a fumble and had a solo stop in win over Memphis State...best game came against Southern Mississippi with three tackles (two solo)...played extensively on special teams for the Tribe...lived up to hard-hitting reputation that preceded his arrival at FSU...saw spot duty in passing situations...1988: redshirted as a true freshman... Cornerback Return Specialist 5-10, 175, Sophomore Pascagoula, MS (Pascagoula HS)

Named the most dominant player in spring drills...shuffled between his career as an outfielder on the baseball team and his football duties...won over coaches with hard work on the field and in the film room...has become a student of the game...great speed and agility make him a tenacious one-on-one defender...elusive moves and quick acceleration give him kick returning talents...returned an interception 48 yards for a touchdown in the spring game...another in a long line of outstanding Seminole defensive backs...1989: one of only a few 1989 signees to see action in his rookie season...ranked ninth in the nation in punt returns as a first-year freshman...averaged 14.2 yards per return with 313 yards on 22 returns...scored his first collegiate touchdown on a memorable 69-yard punt return against Syracuse...froze the Orange defenders when he pretended to have called a fair catch...then took off down the left side for a touchdown, leaving SU defenders in his wake...in all, returned three punts for 88 yards in the game...compiled the same numbers against Clemson, which included a 46-yard return...ran 49 yards with a return against Tulane...picked up where 1988 All-America Deion Sanders left off...also saw a lot of action at cornerback...backed up Errol McCorvey on the left side, but played the nickel back as well...picked off three passes, two against Memphis State and another against Tulane to rank second on the team in that category...returned them 44 yards, also the second highest total on the squad...had a 39-yard INT return against the Tigers...made 24 tackles, including 17 solo stops on the year...broke up five passes to rank third on the team behind the two starting CBs...caused a fumble...top tackling game came against Nebraska in the Fiesta Bowl with six solo stops...High School: rated among the top high school defensive backs in the nation as a senior...only player in Mississippi to earn 5A all-state honors as a junior and senior...honorable mention member of the Orlando Sentinel's Dixie Dozen squad... intercepted 10 passes and returned seven for TDs during his senior year...made 80 tackles, 50 solo, his final season...averaged better than 30 yards per punt return and returned seven for TDs...nabbed a school record 30 interceptions during prep career...also an all-state baseball player...Personal Notes: drafted in the 15th round of the professional baseball draft, but turned down the money to come to FSU...saw limited playing time in the outfield for the Seminole baseball team in 1990...used as a pinchrunner...enrolled in FSU's undergraduate studies program...born June 7, 1971.

Will battle Joe Ostaszewski for starting duties at noseguard...missed the entire spring while recovering from ankle surgery...backed up All-America noseguard Odell Haggins last season...possesses classic noseguard build with short, powerful frame...hard worker with an intense attitude...strong athlete whose game has improved with adjustment to technique...played impressively when healthy during his FSU career...1989: provided strong back-up for FSU's powerful defensive front...benefitted from a year playing behind All-America Odell Haggins...registered 13 tackles, four solo, during his sophomore year...hampered by ankle injury during most of the season...had his best game in the FSU rout of Tulane with five tackles, one solo...made three tackles in win over Tulane with five stops, one solo...made three tackles in win over Memphis State...credited with a tackle for loss in Fiesta Bowl...1988: surprised coaching staff with his abilities and saw considerable playing time as a first-year freshman...played well in a substitute role when Haggins was injured...saw his first action in game five against Tulane...made a pair of tackles in the contest...registered 13 tackles during freshman year, including five solo stops...his best game came against Georgia Southern when he made six tackles...one of only four members of his freshman class to letter...High School: earned first team 4A all-state honors as a senior...compiled 83 tackles, four fumble recoveries and four sacks...also played fullback and punted in high school...benched 430 pounds in high school, and is among FSU's strongest players with a current bench press of 450 pounds...Personal Notes: outstanding student whose mother is dean of students at his former high school...born November 6, 1970.

Free Safety 6-2, 205, Sophomore Pahokee, FL (Pahokee HS)

Enters the fall locked in a battle with Leon Fowler for starting duties at free safety...intense competitor whose bone-jarring tackles have become a regular part of Seminole practices...excellent speed and bighit abilities make him a natural at free safety...an intimidating defender...one of the leaders of a young Seminole defense...one of six members of last year's freshman class to earn a letter...mature player with great team attitude...also an important member of FSU's special teams squads...key man on the punt block unit who finally broke through for a block against Nebraska in the Fiesta Bowl...had come close to blocking several punts prior to that game...1989: one of only two defensive freshmen (the other was Terrell Buckley) to letter last season...saw most of his playing time on special teams...his 1989 highlight came in the third quarter of the Fiesta Bowl game when he blocked a punt, giving FSU the ball at the Nebraska 8...the Seminoles scored on the next play to take a 34-10 lead...it was only the second blocked kick of the year for FSU...credited with 11 tackles, four solo, as a first-year player...his best game came against Memphis State with three tackles, an interception and a fumble recovery...played well against Tulane with six stops, one solo... High School: a USA Today and Super Prep All-America choice...rated the best high school safety in the nation by some recruiting analysts...all-state selection...named to Lindy's all-South first team...made 21 career INTs, including six his senior year...credited with 87 tackles, three quarterback sacks and two fumble recoveries...punted for Pahokee and averaged 40 yards per punt...played basketball and averaged as many as 12 points and 11 rebounds per game...a long jumper on the track...a participant in the 1989 Florida-Georgia All-Star game...Personal Notes: lowered his time in the 40 from 4.98 to 4.73 during his freshman year...would like to go to pharmacy school eventually...born February 12, 1971.

Outside Linebacker 6-2, 220, Junior Jacksonville, FL (Ribault HS)

Finished spring drills as the starter at the "bandit" outside linebacker spot...tremendous speed makes him the most elusive of FSU's defensive front ..excellent pass rusher with speed to run around a block...is quick when rushing the passer...totalled seven sacks in his two-year career...his presence in the game gives coaches a lot of stunt options...showed a penchant for the big play during his sophomore season...increased size and strength make him a better run defender...natural talent combined with experience make him one of FSU's top defensive weapons this year...1989: saw action as reserve outside linebacker and pass rushing specialist... played second team OLB behind Kevin Grant at the bandit side most of the year...inserted in passing situations, and came through with 45 tackles...made 24 solo stops and added three tackles for loss and three quarterback sacks...accounted for seven stops against both Southern Miss and Syracuse for his top games of the year...added five solo tackles, including one for a loss, versus Nebraska in the Fiesta Bowl...against Memphis State, recorded two tackles for loss and a sack...1988: during the regular season, ranked second to Anthony Moss in sacks with four...came through with one of the biggest sacks of the season in the Sugar Bowl game...dropped Auburn QB Reggie Slack for an 11-yard loss as the Tigers drove for a possible game-winning touchdown...gave Auburn fits in their pass blocking all night long...among team leaders in passes broken up with six...credited with 27 tackles as a freshman, including 18 solo...blocked a Louisiana Tech punt out of the end zone for a Florida State safety...six tackles against Georgia Southern proved season high...notched two sacks each in Michigan State and Tulane games...1987: redshirted as a freshman, but made impression on coaching staff with three sacks in 1988 spring game...High School: joined Ribault graduates Kelvin Smith and Reggie Dixon in signing with FSU...missed most of his senior season with a broken leg...Personal Notes: gained 23 pounds since April 1989 and increased his bench press 45 pounds, to 365...still possesses speed, though, as he has run a 4.5 in the 40...born April 26, 1969.

Gained experience during spring drills despite knee injury that held him out of contact work...needs to continue to develop upper body and improve pass rushing technique before becoming a consistent contributor...has the physical frame to be a fine defensive end...good attitude and desire make him a good practice player...needs to gain experience to vie for early playing time...could contend for a spot on FSU's special teams...listed behind six players with more experience at OLB...1989: redshirted during freshman year...High School: first player to commit to FSU in 1989...a first team all-Big Bend choice...caught 20 passes for 436 yards and five TDs...good blocking tight end as well...on defense, credited with 98 tackles, 44 solo...also had nine sacks, two interceptions and six passes broken up...in basketball, averaged 15 points per game...Personal Notes: plans to major in criminology...raised body weight 25 pounds and upped his top bench press mark 50 pounds in one season...lowered his 40 mark to 4.75 from 4.9...born March 26, 1971.


DB, 6-1, 190 Rickards High School Tallahassee, Fla.

PATRICK McNEIL


OL, 6-3, 275 Manatee High School Bradenton, Fla.
