Candidate for all-star honors in 1993...enters fall as FSU's starter at right cornerback...dependable player who rarely gets caught out of position...has improved every year...great cover man...teams with Corey Sawyer to give FSU the best starting cornerback duo in the country...compact player who likes to hit...displays smooth stride and ability to commit at last second...reads quarterbacks well...shows good discipline...hard worker with intense desire to succeed...adjusts well to the ball in flight...has proven big play potential on special teams...one of the best punt blockers at Florida State in several years with three blocked kicks in his career...1992: Started nearly every game at right cornerback as a sophomore...in on 48 tackles, 36 solo and 12 assists...broke up nine passes to tie Leon Fowler and Corey Sawyer for the team lead...pulled in three interceptions...broke up a season high four passes against Miami...interfered with three more a week later vs. North Carolina...recorded two touchdowns and two interceptions against Tulane...scored on an 18-yard return of his own blocked punt and added a 32-yard interception return...named ACC defensive back of the week after that performance...also picked off a pass against Virginia...set up an FSU touchdown against Duke with a blocked punt...returned a Clemson fumble 51 yards to set up a Florida State touchdown that gave the Seminoles a 17-13 lead...recovered a fumble at the FSU 22-yard line to thwart a Miami drive...caused two fumbles and made three tackles for loss on the year...1991: Saw action in 12 of FSU's 13 games...battled Corey Fuller for playing time behind Errol McCorvey...tallied 10 solo stops on the season...made two tackles for loss...intercepted passes in the Syracuse and Louisville games...also saw action on the punt return squad...blocked a punt against Middle Tennessee State...recovered a fumble in the Cotton Bowl before his hornetown fans...1990: Redshirted...High School: A Parade All-America teams...chose FSU over Miami Baylor and Texas A&





Since 1988, 26 Parade All-Americans, 21 USA Today All-Americans, and 22 Super Prep All-Americans have arrived at Florida State. This year's class alone includes 11 All-Americans, as named by one or more of the three publications.

THE ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE

The Tradition

Consistency. It's the mark of true excellence in any endeavor.

In today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now in its 41st year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed a reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the

numbers support it

Since the league's inception in 1953, Atlantic Coast Conference schools have captured 47 NCAA and AIAW champion-ships, including 26 in men's competition and 21 in women's. In addition, 76 men and 25 women have earned the coveted title of NCAA champion.

The ACC had an

The ACC had an immediate impact on the national college football scene in the fall of 1953 when the University of Maryland captured the first of what would eventually be three national football championships by league members.

The nine schools that take to the field this fall under the ACC banner have produced 288 first or second team gridfron All-Americans and 45 first team academic All-Americans. ACC schools have had 1,235 players selected in the annual professional football draft, including 72 first round choices.

If success is best measured in terms of wins and losses, then the ACC has proven itself among the elite in Division 1-A football. The nine ACC teams are a combined 68-57-5 (.542) in bowl games — a winning percentage second only to the PAC-10's .545 success rate.

Georgia Tech, with a 17-8 (.680) post-season mark, is No. 1 among Division 1-A teams in bowl winning percentage. The

Yellow Jackets lead a list of three ACC teams that rank in the top seven all-time. Florida State is sixth with a 12-7-2 (.619) record and Clemson is seventh at 11-7 (.611)

(.611). The ACC also stands at the forefront of intercollegiate athletics in terms of academic accomplishments of its' student athletes. That accomplishment is nowhere better reflected than in the CFA Academic Achievement Award, given annually to the CFA member institution with the highest graduation rate among members of its football team. Seven times over the past 13 years, an ACC member school has claimed the award. Since

soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, wrestling, baseball, tennis, golf and lacrosse.

and lacrosse. Women's sports were initiated in 1977 with the first championship held in tennis at Wake Forest University, October 6-8. Conference championships for women are currently conducted in cross country, volleyball, field hockey, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, tennis, golf and softball.

1992-93 In Review

The ACC enjoyed another productive year in 1992-93 as conference teams captured four national championships, sent four football teams to bowl

games, saw league football champ Florida State finish second in the nation, and won over 73 percent of their games against non-conference opponents in all sports.

ence opponents in all sports.

North Carolina made it three men's basketball national titles in a row for

the ACC by defeating Michigan 77-71 in the championship game. The Tar Heels maintained a Top 10 ranking throughout the course of the season en route to a 34-4

record and the league's seventh crown since 1953.

Virginia's men's soccer team claimed its third national title in four years, and the sixth for the ACC in nine years. On the women's side of the ledger, North Carolina captured its seventh straight NCAA crown and 10th

Virginia's women's lacrosse team capped off the year by garnering the ACC's fourth and last national championship of 1992-93.

In conference competition, North Carolina led all schools by capturing seven ACC championships. Duke was second with four league crowns, followed by Clemson with three, Florida State, Georgia Tech, N.C. State and Virginia with two titles each and Maryland with one.
