

Kicker, 5-11, 205, Sr. Aurora, CO (Overland)





Returns for his senior season as a four-year starter at kicker for the Seminoles...shared kicking duties over his sophomore season with Dan Mowrey, but has been the top field goal and extra point kicker for the majority of the past three years...comes off an excellent junior season that saw him set the FSU and ACC record with 67 extra points over the 1995 season with only two misses...already ranks as FSU's fourth all-time leading scorer with 231 points...made the biggest kick in FSU history when he drilled a 22-yard field goal with 21 seconds left to give the Seminoles a win over Nebraska in the 1994 Orange Bowl and the 1993 National Championship...also hit a pressure packed extra point that capped the NCAA record 28-point comeback against Florida in 1994 that tied the game at 31...excellent athlete who will be FSU's third team quarterback when fall drills begin...played most of the spring game at quarterback for both teams when Thad Busby and Dan Kendra were injured...threw for 89 yards, including a 40-yard touchdown pass to Andre





FSU took the opening drive of the Tennessee Tech game on September 13th for a touchdown and Prinzi ran it in beating the other national games by just minutes. The '58 rule change allowed two points for a pass or run in the endzone and just one point for a kick through the "uprights."

Cornerback, 6-1, 194, Sr. Marietta, GA (Wheeler)



One of Florida State's four returning starters in the secondary...returns to his boundary cornerback position for his senior season...effective cover man especially in man-to-man situations...the Seminoles' most consistent performer in the secondary last year...expected to contend for All-ACC honors...has good size and outstanding speed...a punishing hitter who likes to step-up and stop the run...impressed coaches with leadership and work ethic during spring, while also running track...earned All-America honors as the anchor of the Seminole 4x100 relay team along with Warrick

Dunn and Phillip Riley this summer...steps into spotlight after spending first half of career backing-up FSU cornerbacks now playing in the NFL...has been a consistent special teams contributor during his career...1995: Started every game and finished seventh on the team in total tackles with 59...his 44 solo tackles ranked second on the team...earned second team All-ACC honors...improved rapidly during season and had excellent second half of the year...led the team with eight passes broken up...also tallied two interceptions, two caused fumbles and one fumble recovery...earned Victor's Club honors in seven games...had his best game at Virginia with nine tackles, seven solo, one interception, two passes broken up and one caused fumble...grabbed his second career interception one week later at North Carolina...also had big game against Clemson with eight solo stops and 11 total tackles...1994: Backed-up Corey Fuller at the boundary corner...played in 11 games...gained the coaches confidence with steady play in pressure situations...registered nine tackles, five solo and four assists...also broke up two passes...a valuable special teams player...named to the Victor's Club for the N.C.
