Tailback, 6-0, 200, Sophomore Lake Wales FL (Lake Wales)





Wide Receiver, 6-1, 195, Junior Jacksonville, FL (Ribault)

nters his junior campaign as the starter at split end...exceptional talent who should get the ball more often in 1998...expected to have a breakout season despite coming off a fractured right ankle in the spring game...returned to full strength in June...appeared in every game last season and made 21 receptions for 384 yards ...lone TD of the season came on a 48-yard hookup from Dan Kendra versus Georgia Tech...made at least one catch in nine of 12 games...earned the distinction of being Florida State's fastest man

after being clocked at 4.19 in the 40 during spring testing...that time bested Deion Sanders' 4.21 mark as the fastest in school history...played both tailback and wide receiver as a freshman in 1996...experience as a running back makes him extremely dangerous after the catch...possesses ideal mix of size and speed...game breaker who can get behind the defense or turn a short pass into a long gain...coaches are expecting big things from him...also excels as a kickoff return man and as a bullet on Florida State's punt team...1997: Played in all 12 games ...started, along with E.G.
