

OUTLOOK

outh is everywhere on the 26th edition of Florida State football under Bobby Bowden, but nowhere is it more obvious than at quarterback. Bowden and FSU have had practice in replacing a Heisman Trophy winner who won a national championship before, but what they've not experienced is replacing a three-year starter. Chris Weinke was the first to start three years at quarterback at FSU under Bowden and that is the position that will get the most scrutiny heading into preseason drills. But there are plenty of places to look for new faces. Offensively, the Seminoles must replace five starters in addition to Weinke. Mickey Andrews and the defensive staff must replace seven starters, including finding someone to fill the shoes of Lombardi Award winning defensive end Jamal Reynolds.

Not only must the Seminole offense adjust to a new quarterback, but the entire staff must adjust to a new offensive coordiBoldin. I think both of them are going to be very effective at the position. We came out of spring the same way we came in with Rix at No. 1 and Boldin running second team, but I think they showed us they could both play winning football.

"We are determined to run the football better this year. I thought our inability to run the ball cost us at times last year particularly against Oklahoma. We spent a lot of time on it during the spring and I think we've got the talent up front on the offensive line to run the football. We're sure not going to abandon the passing game, but we've got to be able to make yards on the ground.

"Defensively, we've got a lot of work to do as well. We are very young on both sides of the ball, but I saw a lot of improvement on defense over the spring drills. We should be solid up the middle with both tackles returning. Bradley Jennings in the middle and Chris Hope at free safety.

nator and new quarterbacks coach. Players and coaches are familiar with Jeff Bowden who will continue to coach the wide receivers in addition to taking over as offensive coordinator replacing Georgia's new head coach Mark Richt. When it became clear that Bobby Bowden would need a new quarterback coach for the first time in 15 years, he wasted little time in naming Daryl Dickey, who he's had his eye on ever since he served as a graduate assistant at FSU. On the field, the Seminoles must find a replacement for four-year starting tailback Travis Minor, two starting wide receivers, tight end and three offensive line positions.

The Seminole defensive coaching staff remains intact and that is the best news as they must find replacements for three of the four starters in the secondary, two of the three linebackers and both defensive ends. However, the optimism and enthusiasm on the defensive practice fields was strong all spring and coaches were very excited by the way the younger players on the FSU roster have responded with playing time dangling within reach.

"We have a long way to go as a football team, but we've come a long way after a very productive spring," said Bobby Bowden. "We've lost a great deal of experience from last year's football team and I think what we discovered most during the spring is that we've got a lot of talent on this football team. They were eager to learn, eager to compete in spring and if you've got that along with some talent then you can have a good football team.

"Quarterback was a big concern of course with the loss of Weinke. I was very pleased with the progress of both Chris Rix and Anguan

"Our schedule is very difficult once again and always will be with Miami and Florida on there. We've got four new head coaches in the ACC so we really don't have much to go on with those four teams. Miami has a new head coach as well, so we'll have to see what he changes. We play all five of the teams with new coaches in a row right in the middle of our schedule so it will be interesting.

"I'm very excited about this season. We've got a lot of challenges ahead and we'll go into it with a little different

attitude than we have in the past couple of years."

QUARTERBACK

The race will be heated and closely watched in August as redshirt freshman Chris Rix and junior Anquan Boldin battle for starting honors at quarterback. The good news for FSU coaches is that both have performed well enough to make them optimistic, but the fact remains that it will be a rookie taking snaps in the

opener for the Seminoles.

While Rix has not played a down in a college game, he made good use of his redshirt freshman season as a mainstay in the FSU film rooms. Rix has done all the playbook work needed to be the starter at FSU, now he must concentrate on putting his skills in motion. Coaches were pleased with his ability to throw the deep ball during spring practice and his poise under pressure. Rix completed 13 of 23 passes in the spring game for 186 yards and two touchdowns. An excellent athlete, Rix is not afraid to pull the ball down and take off if there is nothing open down field.

Boldin has already proven to be the consummate team player. A first team *USA Today* All-America quarterback in high school, Boldin asked coaches to move to wide receiver just three days into practice as a freshman because he saw a chance to help the team sooner at the position. Boldin could turn into one of the biggest stories in college football if he earns playing time at quarterback. He moved from starting wide receiver, where he would have been FSU's top returning receiver with 41 receptions, to quarterback to give the Seminoles the best chance to win. He spent most of the spring regaining his touch as a passer, but dazzled coaches and defensive teammates when he decided to keep the ball on his own. He completed eight of 17 passes for 101 yards while working with the second team offense in the spring game.

RUNNING BACKS

FSU running backs coach Billy Sexton threw both his positions wide open in the spring and his stable of talent seemed to answer. The tailback position opened out of necessity when four-year starter Travis Minor graduated, but William McCray used the spring to win his starting job again at fullback after

injuries limited him over the last two seasons.

With FSU's commitment to the running game, the race to win starting tailback honors was even more heated than usual. The Seminoles will enter the fall with three players who the coaches feel very comfortable with and who all bring a different style to the game. Nick Maddox emerged from spring drills as the man to beat as the starter. A highly acclaimed running back in high school, Maddox has played both tailback and wide receiver for the Seminoles. He has big play capability and great hands coming out of the backfield. He rushed for a team-high 77 yards on just seven carries in the spring game.


Pushing Maddox will be talented senior Davy Ford who's biggest enemy has been injuries. He has overcome surgeries on both knees and is still one of the fastest Seminoles. Ford is determined to make the most of every chance he gets in 2001. He termined for 258 yards on 38 carries and scored three touchdowns last year while playing behind Minor and Jeff Chaney. Also in the mix as fall practice begins is sophomore Greg Jones who brings the coveted blend of power and speed. At 6-1, 235, Jones

gives FSU coaches the physical back they have not had for several seasons and he could make the decision by the coaches difficult with a strong preseason camp.


McCray will certainly look different at fullback this fall as he switched from No. 36 to No. 15 and coaches are pleased with his continued progress as a blocker. McCray has great hands and running ability, but will need to be more consistent as a blocker to hold his spot. McCray scored eight touchdowns as a junior last season. Pushing McCray is former walk-on Chad Maeder who has excelled as a punishing run blocker. If FSU is going to run the ball more, Maeder's ability to move the pile inside will be invaluable.

RECEIVERS

Offensive coordinator Jeff Bowden knew he was robbing Peter to pay Paul when he allowed starting wide receiver Anquan Boldin to move to quarterback where he will compete for the starting job. The good news is that the move made his offensive backfield much better, the bad news was that it depleted an already thin group

routine passes to be a regular in the lineup. Gardner grabbed 12 catches for 198 yards last year. Also pushing for immediate playing time will be senior Javon Walker who had 20 receptions for 313 yards and three touchdowns last year. Walker was coming on strong early last year until a foot injury suffered against Georgia Tech threw him off for the rest of the year. He has great size and tremendous speed and a good preseason camp may mean a lot of playing time for him. Devard Darling must be medically cleared to play after the death of his twin brother Devaughn this spring. If he is cleared to play, he will be a factor on the receiving corps once he catches up after missing the workouts. Walk-on Joey Kaleikini used the thin receiving corps this past spring to make a name for himself. He was FSU's top receiver in the spring game with three catches for 82 yards and will be a valuable backup in the fall.

OFFENSIVE LINE

The 2001 offensive line will be built around outstanding returning starters Brett Williams and Montrae Holland. Williams, a junior, has established himself as one of the finest offensive lineman in the ACC and he should contend for All-America honors this year. He returns at split tackle where he will be starting for the third straight year and will provide the Seminoles' with an experienced leader along the front. Holland returns at tight guard where he has been a dominating force when healthy. He will also contend for all-conference honors, but coaches hope he can stay away from the training room for an entire season. With those two positions set, Coach Jimmy Heggins' first order of business this spring was finding replacements for departing starters Jarad Moon (center), Justin Amman (guard) and Char-ron Dorsey/ Tarlos Thomas (tackle).


Junior Antoine Mirambeau has impressed coaches on the practice field with his exceptional strength and athletic ability in a reserve role at center over the last two years and he won the starting job coming out of spring. He will be pushed by redshirt freshman David Castillo and senior Josh Baggs at the crucial position. FSU's use of both conventional shotgun formations require centers to be adept at several snapping techniques, in addition, the center calls out the blocking schemes at the line of scrimmage.

Junior Todd Williams was one of the most pleasant surprises among all the Seminoles this spring as he took home the most outstanding player award on offense for his workout throughout spring drills. Coaches had hoped that Williams would step up and take over the tight tackle position and he did just that when he was able to channel his considerable talent within the FSU system. Williams will still have to play at a high level in the fall to ward off redshirt freshman Ray Willis who also had an outstanding spring and hopes to see playing time early this year.

Split guard is another position that will be a battle in preseason camp. Junior college transfer Milford Brown just edged veteran Ron Boldin at the end of spring camp to be listed at No. 1 on the roster going into the fall. Both players have great

split tackle will be redshirt freshman Alex Barron who continues to rehabilitate the knee he injured on the very first day of fall practice last year.

Veteran Otis Duhart enters the fall as the backup to Holland at tight guard, but he has experience as a starter at guard last year and will certainly see plenty of playing time this fall. Redshirt freshman Bobby Meeks hopes that another productive fall will put him into the picture for playing time at the position.

TIGHT ENDS

Carver Donaldson steps in as a senior to take over as the starter at tight end. Donaldson played a great deal over the last two years on both special teams and goal line situations. An exceptional run blocker, Donaldson must be consistent as a receiver to become a part of the passing game. Junior Patrick Hughes will push Donaldson and will likely see considerable playing time after redshirting last year with a leg injury. Hughes will use the preseason to show coaches that he has developed the overall game needed to win the starting job.

OUTLOOK ON THE DEFENSE

Florida State's defense underwent a crucial spring in 2001 with the goal of replacing consensus All-Americans Jamal Reynolds and Tay Cody, along with All-ACC stars Tommy Polley, Derrick Gibson and sensational linebacker Brian Allen. The Tribe will count on the production and leadership of returning starters Chris Hope (FS), Bradley Jennings (LB), Darnell Dockett (DT) and Jeff Womble (NG) and a bevy of talented newcomers.

"We've got seven starters to replace and all of them were outstanding players," said defensive coordinator Mickey Andrews. "We lost two outside linebackers, two defensive ends, two corners and one safety. Each one had a lot to do with the success we've had around here for the last four of five years.

"So, we've got to come up with seven people to fill those spots, and we've got to find some people who can grow up in a hurry. We play a lot of guys during the season, and one reason for that is to gain some game experience for the younger guys. We try to teach them how to raise their level of play when the

game is not on the line. "In addition to the need to find the new starters, we've got to make sure the four returning starters keep improving. We are returning the down the middle guys and in baseball they talk about being solid up the middle what we must make sure we have. We return both our starting tackles, our middle linebacker and the free safety. But they've got to play better than they have at any time in their careers. We won't allow them to just take off this spring and fall and come out with a starting job.

"Our task this fall will be to determine our best starting 11 and then find the second best 11 as we head into the season. When our freshmen come in in August, we'll see if some of them can fit in. It (the recruiting class) appears to be a very talented group and we are expecting them to help in the fall. We'll take them as fast as they can go.

"We've got some talented players, they are just not as experienced as we've had recently. We've just got to fight, and scratch, and claw to get better every day.


DEFENSIVE LINE

Darnell Dockett returns at defensive tackle where he earned first team freshman All-America honors as a redshirt last year. He had an exceptional spring and has the talent to give FSU an inside pass rush like few in the country. While he does not have Corey Simon's size, he possesses the quickness and pass rushing skills that make him look like a linebacker once he breaks the line of scrimmage. He teams with classmate Jeff Womble to give the Seminoles both talent and experience in the middle of the line. Womble had a very solid season last year and showed coaches in the spring that he was ready for an even better junior season. Talented youngsters Travis Johnson, Tony Benford and Chris Woods are expected to push them all the way.

The play of the interior defensive line may be especially important as the Seminoles will not have a proven star at defensive end as they have had over the last five or six years. Sophomore Kevin Emanuel moves from defensive tackle to left defensive end where he is penciled in as the starter. He must stay ahead of senior Eric Powell and sophomore Charles Howard during the fall to keep his starting position. Junior Alonzo Jackson saw considerable playing time at left end last year and will be the starter at right end heading into the fall. He is quickly emerging as one of the leaders of the defense, but he will also be pushed in the preseason by O.J. Jackson who had five sacks in the spring game alone. Howard will backup at right end as well.

LINEBACKER

The linebacking corps will be built around three-year starter Bradley Jennings at middle linebacker who should contend for All-America honors as a senior. Jennings has played extremely well over the last two years as the Tribe's primary run stopper

and his leadership skills were more evident this spring with the absence of Tommy Polley and Brian Allen. Backing up Jennings will be Jerel Hudson who has the speed to play linebacker and the size to be a down lineman. Sophomore Cornelius Collier had an excellent spring and appears to have found a position at middle linebacker.

Sophomore Kendyll Pope proved he would be a good player as a freshman last year and coaches are excited about his potential at weakside linebacker. Pope has excellent football instincts and the speed to run down anything out of the backfield. He has played enough at FSU for coaches to be happy with his experience. Former walk-on Allen Augustin continues to improve and he is a solid backup to Pope and will likely see a lot of playing time on special teams and in the nickel package. Senior Brandon Myers moves from safety to linebacker where he also provides experience and depth.

Michael Boulware used the kickoff team as a true freshman last year to show coaches that he could be a special player. His ability to make jarring open field tackles as a freshman convinced coaches that he could be successful at linebacker. Boulware moved into the spot during spring and will use fall drills to get even more comfortable at the position. Freshman Ray Piquion graduated from high school less than a year ago, but enrolled early at FSU and went through spring drills. He will begin as Boulware's backup. Junior Lee Weaver will also push for playing time after a season as one of FSU's top special teams

players.

SECONDARY

Academic All-American Chris Hope returns at free safety where he should contend for All-America honors, but he must also anchor a secondary that is sure to be very young. Hope is a proven performer who has shown a penchant for the big-play over the last two years. His leadership will be crucial to the success of the defensive backfield in 2001. Backing up Hope will be senior Gennaro Jackson who will see considerable playing time. Sophomore Yohance Buchanan and redshirt freshman B.J. Ward will be counting on productive fall practices to move up the depth chart.

Senior Abdual Howard played a great deal last year and should be the starter at rover taking over for three-year starter Derrick Gibson, who was a first round draft pick by the Oakland Raiders. Talented redshirt freshman Claudius Osei will also get a chance for playing time here in the fall as will junior Patrick

Aside from quarterback, the battles at both cornerback positions should draw the most attention in preseason practice. Sophomore Stanford Samuels edged classmate Rufus Brown to enter the fall drills listed at No. 1 at right cornerback, but the two should push each other all season. Junior Malcom Tatum, who missed most of last year with a stress fracture in his lower back, won the starting honors at left cornerback during spring, but will also be pushed in the fall. Redshirt freshman Bryant McFadden had an excellent spring and should see a lot of playing time right away. Freshman Leroy Smith also redshirted last year and hopes to make a run in preseason practice.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Brett Cimorelli returns as the Seminole placekicker, but he will have to fight off true freshman Xavier Beitia and walk-on Jesse Stein, who will get a chance to be the starting kicker as

well, Cimorelli settled down halfway through his rookie season to have a good year as the kicker. He connected on 23 of 24 extra point attempts and hit six of nine field goals. Beitia among the nation's most heralded recruits and brings impressive credentials to the FSU program. Stein transferred from the Air Force Academy and kicked well enough in spring practice to make it a battle in the fall. Chance Gwaltney must punt well in the preseason to insure his status as the new punter for FSU. Whoever wins the job will have a tough time following the career of fouryear starter Keith Cottrell. Brian Sawyer returns for his sophomore season after an outstanding rookie season where he handled all the special teams snapping chores.






