



Junior Year (2000): Saw limited action due to a shoulder niury.



2000: Redshirted due to a knee injury he suffered during preseason workouts.

High School: A standout offensive lineman with both size and quickness...PrepStar and Football News All-American ...named to PrepStar's 1999 Top 100 (No. 3 offensive lineman) Dream Team...listed as the No. 5 prospect in the Atlantic Region by PrepStar...named to the Orlando Sentinel's All-South team ...SuperPrep's No. 15 offensive lineman...rated as the No. 19 offensive lineman in the nation by Rivals 100.com...G&W's No. 3 ACC-area prospect...Jeff Whitaker's Deep South Football Recruiting Guide South Carolina Player of the Year...1st team All-South by Fox Sports Net...Orlando Sentinel's Top 100 National Player...graded out at better than 92 percent and had 61 pancake blocks as a senior...also played basketball in high school...reported a 320-pound bench press and a time of 5.1 in the 40-yard dash...chose FSU over Notre Dame, South Carolina, Georgia Tech, and Georgia.

At Florida State: Enters his senior season as the Seminoles' top returning receiver with 10 touchdown receptions and 675 yards last season...begins preseason practice listed at No. 1 at flanker with Talman Gardner...caught five passes for 49 yards in the Garnet and Gold game...recruited as a walk-on in 1997 and earned a scholarship one week into practice.

Junior Year (2000): Had a breakout year with 10 touchdown catches which was second best on the team and tied for eighth on the FSU single season touchdowns list...had just four touchdown catches coming into the season...played in all 13 games...led Florida State with seven receptions for 137 yards in the national title game against Oklahoma...recorded 675 receiving yards which ranked second on the team and more than tripled his total yardage from the two previous years combined (222)...led the team in scoring, along with Marvin Minnis, with 66 points...ranked fourth on the team with 37 receptions and averaged 18.2 yards per catch...recorded three games of 100+ yards ...best performance was a career-high and team-leading 146 yards at Miami on six catches...had six receptions for 111 yards in the Clemson game...had three catches for 96 yards and two touchdowns vs. North Carolina...had two scores in the Maryland and Duke games...had at least one catch in all 13 games and scored touchdowns in seven of them...averaged 56.2 yards per game, good for second on the team and sixth in the ACC...had a career-long 48-yard catch in the Duke game...also had a rushing touchdown.

Sophomore Year (1999): Finished fifth on the team with 202 yards and sixth with 14 receptions...averaged 14.4 yards per catch...ranked second behind only Peter Warrick with four touchdown receptions...recorded his first career TD in 42-10 win at North Carolina, a 35-yarder from Chris Weinke just

before halftime...pulled down scoring catches of 12 and nine yards in FSU's 33-10 Homecoming win over Wake Forest ...season-long reception was a 30-yard touchdown from Weinke in the home finale vs. Maryland.

Freshman Year (1998): Reserve at flanker who appeared in eight games...backed up All-American Peter Warrick...caught two passes for 18 yards on the year...first catch of his career was a 10-yarder from Chris Weinke in the Seminoles' 26-14 win at Miami...also had an eight-yard reception in the win over North Carolina.

1997: Originally came to the program as a walk-on but was awarded a scholarship one week into fall practice...sat out the season as a redshirt.

High School: One of the state's top all-around players at Lee High School...played quarterback his final three seasons and passed for more than 3,100 yards...also rushed for over 2,000 yards during his career...led his team to the state semifinals as both a junior and senior...earned All-First Coast honors at quarterback...selected to play for the North team in the Florida Shrine Bowl...chose to walk-on at FSU despite receiving scholarship offers from Indiana and Marshall.

At Florida State: Moves from defensive tackle to noseguard this year as the backup to returning starter Jeff Womble...tallied one unassisted tackle in the spring game...was fifth on the returning defensive line in career tackles (36) last year.

Sophomore Year (2000): Appeared in nine games... recorded two tackles for loss and two quarterback hurries... credited with 24 tackles on the season including 15 unassisted tackles...most productive game of the season came against Duke when he recorded a game-high seven total tackles and two tackles for loss...finished the season ranked 19th on the squad's defense in total tackles.

Freshman Year (1999): Played in eight games...recorded sacks against Duke, North Carolina and Wake Forest...finished season with 12 total tackles, five solo tackles and four tackles for loss...had his best game against Duke by recording a season-high four tackles, a sack and a third-down stop.



At Florida State: Enters the fall locked in a battle with Chris Rix for the starting job at quarterback for the 2001 Seminoles...started at wide receiver and played in all 13 games last year, but could be one of the biggest stories in college football this year if he wins the job vacated by Heisman Trophy winner Chris Weinke...made great progress over 20 spring practices after not playing quarterback since an outstanding career at the position in high school...listed at second team behind redshirt freshman Chris Rix as preseason drills begin...instinctive quarterback who seemed to become more and more at ease over the spring...worked out with Peter Warrick over the summer to improve his passing skills...very fast and elusive with a strong arm...USA Today first team All-America quarterback as a high school senior and the Player of the Year in Florida.

Sophomore Year (2000): Ranked third on the team with 41 catches and six touchdowns...was also third on the team with 664 receiving yards which was nearly six times the yardage he had in his freshman campaign...played in all 13 games as the Seminoles played in their third straight national title game...had his first career 100-yard game on three catches against Georgia Tech...had six catches for a career-high 108 yards and two touchdowns at Miami ...snared a career-high seven receptions for 69 yards in the win over Florida...totaled at least two receptions in all 13 games...averaged 16.2 yards per catch and 55.3 yards receiving per game...scored touchdowns in four games...season-long reception was a 60-yarder in the Virginia game.


Freshman Year (1999): One of three true freshman to see playing time along with Nick Maddox and Alonzo Jackson... played in 10 games and started against Wake Forest when FSU opened in a four receiver set...made an immediate impact in his first college game, catching two touchdown passes against Louisiana Tech in the season opener...scored FSU's first touchdown of the season against Tech on a four-yard strike from Chris Weinke and later caught another for a 29-yard touchdown ...finished the season with 12 catches for 115 yards and two touchdowns...also scored one rushing TD when he lined up at quarterback against Wake Forest and ran two yards on a QB draw...finished with four rushes for 33 yards and three kickoff returns for 55 yards.

High School: Regarded as one of the top prospects in the country by nearly every recruiting publication...a USA Today first-team selection and the Florida Player of the Year...a first-team Class 3A all-state player who was named Florida's Mr. Football...SuperPrep's No. 1 skilled athlete and No. 1 prospect nationally...Gatorade Circle of Champions High School Football Player of the Year for Florida (overall athletic and academic excellence)...rated the top player in the state by the St. Petersburg Times, Tampa Tribune and Gainesville Sun...named to the PrepStar Dream Team and listed as the No. 2 athlete in the nation...completed 133 of 233 passes for 2,482 yards and 36 touchdowns as a senior at Pahokee...also rushed for 1,497 yards and 20 touchdowns...nabbed four interceptions on defense...set a state of Florida record with 11,433 total yards in his career... selected FSU over Florida and Miami.

Personal: Cousin of FSU offensive lineman Ronald Boldin...majoring in criminology...born October 3, 1980.

At Florida State: Will battle newcomer Milford Brown for starting honors at split guard this season...moved over from the defensive line following his freshman season and provided much needed depth on the offensive line...has gradually worked his way into more time on the field...enters fall practice No. 2 on the depth chart at the split guard position...has been a mainstay on FSU special teams.

Junior Year (2000): Backed up starter Justin Amman at the split guard position...first year with full-time duty on the offensive line after playing mostly special teams as a sophomore...did not allow a quarterback sack...had a season-high three intimidations against Clemson as Florida State won at home 54-7...had at least one intimidation in each game for a season total of 18...one of 16 players to earn his degree prior to

Sophomore Year (1999): Saw most of his playing time on Seminole special teams as a sophomore...played at both tackle positions.

Freshman Year (1998): Did not see any action during the season...slowed by his transition from the defensive line during preseason practice...worked with the Seminole scout units.

Freshman Year (1997): Redshirted.





Sophomore Michael Boulware, who saw extensive playing time as a true freshman in 2000, will be wearing No. 58 this season after wearing No. 57 last year. The No. 58 jersey with Boulware on the back will be a familiar one for Seminole fans as Michael's brother, Peter, wore that number from 1994-96. Peter was a consensus All-American in 1996, setting a school record with 19 sacks on the season. A first round NFL Draft pick in 1997, Peter is currently a member of the Super Bowl Champion Baltimore Ravens. Michael, who is slated to start at linebacker this year for the Tribe, made the trip down to Tampa in January to watch his brother's squad defeat the New York Giants for the World Champion-Peter Boulware



At Florida State: Will battle Stanford Samuels for the starting job at the right cornerback position that was held for the last four years by consensus All-American and NFL draftee Tay Cody...carned playing time in all 13 games including the National Championship game against Oklahoma as a backup to Clevan Thomas at left cornerback...also played extensively on special teams in each game...returned his first career interception against Duke for a 28-yard touchdown...earned the award for most improved defensive back following spring drills in 1999...is one of the top students on the team who has twice earned the academic award for his class.

Freshman Year (2000): Recorded 18 total tackles (12 unassisted and six assisted) as he earned playing time at cornerback and on special teams...moved into a backup position at the cornerback position behind Clevan Thomas following the back injury to Malcolm Tatum...gained valuable playing time while Tatum was out...recorded a career-high three unassisted tackles in the Seminoles' victory over Duke...also returned an interception 28-yards for a touchdown against the Blue Devils...earned Victor's Club honors and Tomahawk Player of the Week honors from the coaching staff for his performance against Duke...his interception return for a touchdown was of three during the 2000 season for the Seminoles...also totaled a career-high tying three total tackles against North Carolina and Florida...recorded two tackles each against Georgia Tech, Maryland, Virginia, and NC State.

1999: Sat out the season as a redshirt.



Freshman Year (2000): Enjoyed a solid rookie season...was one of seven true freshmen who earned playing time during the season...totaled six tackles (three unassisted and three assisted) while playing in eight games...a single-game career-high four tackles came against Duke as the Seminoles defeated the Blue Devils at home...earned Victor's Club accolades for his performance against Duke...earned playing time for the first time during his career in the second game of the season against Georgia Tech...recorded his first career tackle against Miami... also added a tackle against Virginia.


Freshman Year (1999): Recorded 16 total tackles and



to a lack of depth at linebacker.



TOUGH AGAINST THE RUSH IN 2000...

Florida State opponents averaged only 73.9 yards per game on the ground last season, a total of only 887 total yards in 12 games. The Seminoles have allowed less than an average of 100 yards rushing per game in each of the last five seasons. During the last five seasons, the Seminoles have limited their opponents to just over two yards per carry. Florida State led the ACC and ranked 10th in the nation in rush defense in 1999, and again led the league and ranked second nationally against the run in 2000.


