


# **All-America Candidates**

# Christian Williams, Senior, Spartanburg, S.C.

All-America candidate Christian Williams has been aspiring to excel in both golf and the classroom since his freshman year at Florida State. With seven Top 20 finishes last season and a spot on the golf coaches Academic All-America list, FSU's lone senior has succeeded in both arenas.

His junior year yielded a 74.1 stroke average. Coming off a redshirt season in 1988, Williams' junior year was highlighted by a pair of ninth place finishes, in the Florida Intercollegiate Golf Championship and the Metro Conference Championship. He placed 13th in the LSU Invitational with a final score of 222. To finish



this impressive season, Williams tied for 15th in the NCAA East Regional Tournament and tied for 87th in the NCAA Championships.

As a double major in Economics and Political Science, Christian has upheld his role as a leader in academics as well with a grade point average above 3.5.

## Dustin Phillips, Junior, Deerfield Beach, Fla.

Junior Dustin Phillips' outstanding play in his sophomore season gave a considerable boost to a team that achieved its highest national ranking ever with fifth place. With a good season in 1990-91, Phillips will place himself among the nation's best.

Last year, Phillips played in nine tournaments, placing in the top 20 in four of them. His stroke average was a 74.5, with a low round of 67 in the NCAA East Regional Tournament. His top finishes included that tournament, where he tied for seventh, a tie for 11th in the Florida Southern/ImperiaLakes Golf Classic, where the



team won the championship, a tie for 20th in the Jerry Pate Intercollegiate Invitational, and a sixth place finish in the Metro Conference Golf Championship, also a team title.

The most memorable moment in his college career occurred last year at the Florida Southern/ImperiaLakes Golf Classic. "I was amazed at the performance Christian gave with his injury," Phillips said. "It really was inspiring to me. Winning the tournament was an added bonus."

Dustin is a junior majoring in criminology.

# Head Coach Verlyn Giles

For the past 13 years, Florida State University Head Golf Coach Verlyn Giles has led his teams to victory and has aided the team in the goal of becoming a successful, consistent, and academically-acclaimed squad.



During the 1989-90 season, Giles guided the men's team to 10 Top Ten finishes, including two first place victories -- at the Florida Southern/ImperiaLakes Golf Classic and the Metro Conference Golf Championship. In the NCAA East Regional Tournament, Giles' FSU team placed second in a field of 25. In the NCAA Championships in Tarpon Springs, Florida, the Seminoles placed eighth, after finishing 16th the previous season.

In 1987, Giles directed the Seminoles to one of their most successful years ever, winning four tournament championships. That year, Giles also coached the 1987 NCAA individual runner-up, Nolan Henke, who had 26 top 10 finishes and eight tournament championships during his FSU career. Giles' work with the 1990 Seminole golf team not only earned FSU its first NCAA bid since 1983, it also

gave Giles District III Coach of the Year honors. Florida State's success on the national level is coupled with success in the Metro Conference. Under Giles, Florida State University has won Metro Conference titles in 11 of the last 12 seasons and FSU individuals have won the individual title eight times.

Giles' success is nothing new. He began coaching the FSU women's golf team in 1978, and in 1981 led the Lady Seminoles to victory at the AIAW National Championship. The team surprised the golf world by upsetting Georgia by three strokes on the Lady Bulldogs' home course to win the title. From that team alone came three current mainstays on the LPGA tour: Lisa Young, Barb Bunkowsky, and Jane Geddes. Geddes, the 1986 U.S. Open medalist, currently is a leader on the LPGA money list. Giles, in fact, heads a Florida State program that boasts many leading money winners on both the LPGA and the PGA tours, like former Seminole Paul Azinger, who ended 1989 at the top of the men's tour money list.

Before coming to Florida State, Giles was no stranger to the program. He graduated from FSU in 1961 and earned his master's



degree in 1963. He then coached at Leon and Palmetto high schools before managing the Seminole Golf Course from 1972-84. In 1978, Giles became the head coach of the women's golf team and in 1983 added duties as director of the men's program. Giles and his wife have three daughters.

## 1990-91 Outlook

After an outstanding 1989-90 season, the Seminoles continue to strive for the ultimate goal of winning the NCAA Championship. At the completion of the 1989-90 season, the Seminoles finished eighth at the NCAA Championships in Tarpon Springs, Florida. It was the second-highest NCAA finish in FSU history for the men's team.

The Seminoles have some superb golfers on the 1990-91 squad, but the talent is young. With hard work and experience, this will be a rebuilding as well as a reloading year. The team is composed of 12 freshmen, three of whom will be redshirted, one sophomore, two juniors, and two seniors. The goal of the team is to continually improve throughout the year to be a surprise in the nationals.

Senior Christian Williams, an All-America candidate, is a dominant force on the 1990-91 team. His influence will be dramatically felt because of his experience on the courses and his vast knowledge of the game. The coaches are expecting a superb finish to his career. Anthony Ballestero, the other senior, will be expected to compete for a spot among the top five players. Another All-America candidate, junior Dustin Phillips, adds strength and experience with his strong play.

Keith Rick, a freshman, is expected to be in the starting line-up in 1991. His abilities have improved over a redshirt season and he is expected to be one of the top players on the squad this year. Bobby Cochran, a redshirt freshman, will be in the starting line-up as well. His talents improved over his redshirt year and he will be a strong contributor to the team this season.

Overall, the young team will look to gain experience with each tournament. The talent of the young players along with the leadership of golfers Williams and Phillips will allow the squad to develop confidence and strength as the season progresses, believes Head Coach Verlyn Giles.

"I think we will be extremely strong during the late season," Giles said. "I would like to again qualify for the East Regional Tournament, get to the nationals, and by that time continue our Cinderella approach and become a Top 10 competitor."


Jason Doyle Freshman Boca Raton, Florida
