# THIS IS FSU

From its beginning as "The Seminary West of the Suwannee" in 1857, Florida State University has grown to stretch across 347 acres of rolling oak and pine-covered hills to comprise a campus which has educated millions of students over the last century.

Florida State University has boasted a heritage of service and scholarship since the beginning when the legislature passed an act authorizing two state colleges — one east (now University of Florida) and one west of the meandering Suwannee River.

Starting with a 130-member coed enrollment in 1857, the Seminary survived the Civil War, reconstruction, radical social changes, and a variety of name changes to emerge in 1909 as the Florida State College for Women.

It was helped back into coed status in 1947 by a legislature anxious to open up the state's educational resources to thousands of degree-seeking ex-GI's from World War II. It also was granted a new name "Florida State University." The university's expanse and complexity today contrast vividly with its beginning. Sixteen schools and colleges within the University serve more than 28,300 students who are enrolled in the 276 graduate and undergraduate degree programs and live and work among 1,300 faculty and 2,600 staff members. About 5,000 degrees are awarded every year.



In the past several years, the University has joined an elite group of universities in the United States which produce more than 200 doctoral graduates annually. Emphasis on graduate research and study at the University continues to grow, and today more than 4,000 graduate students pursue a variety of degrees.

Student life at Florida State University also offers young people ample opportunity to acquire leadership skills and to apply their classroom learning in student government, residence hall government, Greek social organizations, honors programs, departmental organizations and more than 200 other registered student organizations active on campus. The FSU Artist Series, the Distinguished Lecture Series and outstanding music, theater and dance production provide enjoyable evenings for the entire community.

Being a student at Florida State University means stepping into a tradition of more than 130 years of higher education. From its Flying High Circus to its Supercomputer Computations Research, Florida State provides a panorama of excitement, blending the educational and social sides of campus life.



# WOLF OUT

The 1993-94 season is a year of great expectations for Florida State golf. After a couple of rebuilding years, Coach Ernie Lanford has every reason to expect great things of the 1993-94 men's golf team. After all, the team returns six seniors and a bevy of underclassmen with collegiate tournament experience. This year's squad boasts quite a contingent of All-American candidates.


The 1992-93 year proved to be a transitional season for the Seminoles. Coach Lanford's team recorded five top-five finishes, including a victory in the Southeastern Intercollegiate, in which the team edged out the eventual NCAA Champion Florida Gators by five strokes.

Individually, Bobby Cochran became the first Florida State golfer to capture an individual title since 1989. He fired rounds of 68, 69, and 70 to claim a win in the ImperiaLakes Golf Classic. Cochran, Christian Raynor, Ryan Perna, Keith Rick, and Jason Williams combined to produce strong results. From these five starters came a total of twelve top-ten individual finishes.

Over the summer, Florida State golfers made their mark in the amateur ranks, signalling greater maturity and a readiness to excel. FSU had four players qualify for the U.S. Amateur, in which Cochran advanced to the semifinals before being eliminated by eventual champion John Harris. Keith Rick finished fifth in the Florida Amateur and captured the Seminole Invitational after posting a tournament record back-to-back 65s. Denny Tymosko exhibited progress, qualifying for the U.S.

Amateur and finishing third in the Northwest Florida Amateur.

Tymosko broke into the lineup as a steady performer in the fall season. However, he has a host of talent at his



heels. Seniors Josh Skivington, Tony Ziegler, and Jason Williams are looking to make an impact, as are juniors Ken Staton, Corey Hamlin, Jason Doyle, and Carl Ste-Marie.

Lanford has begun to build on what this year's team hopes to accomplish by bringing in talent from near and far. Three freshmen will use this year to mature by honing their skills and learning from the experienced upperclassmen. Sean Ashby, Brian Cook, and Jason Pool will provide greater depth and a foundation to build on.

With the conclusion of the fall season, it appears that the Seminoles are well on their way to meeting their goal of making the NCAA Championships. Qualifying rounds produced a talented lineup that proved to be highly competitive, with the team finishing in the top five in three of four fall tournaments. The fall also saw three Seminoles capture individual tournament titles, beginning with Keith Rick in the Tournament of Champions. Cochran won the Dixie Intercollegiate, while Perna followed with a victory in the Country Club of Louisiana Intercollegiate. Raynor recorded a solid top five finish at the Dixie, and looks to play up to his potential in the spring in hopes of becoming the first Seminole to make both All-American and Academic All-American since Roger Winchester accomplished that feat in 1989. Tymosko rounded out the lineup for the fall, contributing heavily to the team's success.

The squad will use the winter to prepare for a challenging spring schedule. After two years of disappointment in ACC Championship play, the team looks to begin climbing the ladder in this year's tournament, held again in Rocky Mount, North Carolina.

Confidence, experience, and maturity are traits it takes time to acquire. Coach Lanford and his team have paid their dues. They have been patient through rebuilding and transition. They are now ready to come to the forefront as one of college golf's finest teams.

Entering his third year as head coach at Florida State, Dr. Ernie Lanford leads an eager group of talented golfers into the 1993-94 season. Under Lanford's guidance the

Seminoles hope to improve upon a season that saw them place in the top-five, five times last year. Coach Lanford carded his first tournament win at FSU when his troop captured the 18-team Southeastern Intercollegiate title last spring.

Lanford arrived in Tallahassee after serving as golf coach at Augusta College from 1982-91. He is credited with putting the Augusta, GA, school on the "golf map." His teams claimed Big South Conference championships in 1985, '86, '87, '90 and '91. His peers selected him NCAA Division I Golf Coach of the Year in 1985, '86, '87, '90 and '91.

From 1982 until 1991, Dr. Lanford served as head golf coach, as well as head basketball coach from 1982-85. In addition to coaching, he taught Kinesiology, Exercise Physiology, Anatomy, Recreation, Fitness for Living, Secondary Methods of P.E., Curriculum, Organization and Administration of Athletics, and Foundations of Physical Education at Augusta College.


Prior to his stint at Augusta College, Lanford was at Flagler College in St. Augustine, FL, holding various positions including: Athletic Director, Physical Education Department Chairman, Assistant Professor, and head Basketball coach. He has also served on the faculties at State University of New York, Brigham Young University, Michigan State University.

While in Augusta, Lanford was active in Augusta area junior golf and directed over 15 tournaments and clinics a year in cooperation with area golf clubs. He raised funds and recruited volunteers in the Augusta areas for these tournaments and oversaw a School Development Program specifically for junior golf program.

Dr. Lanford has continued his involvement in junior golf in Tallahassee. Recently, he spearheaded the establishment of summer camps for junior golfers. Also, he was recently appointed Executive Director of the Big Bend Junior Golf Association.

Florida State is currently enjoying an ongoing relationship with its former players now on tour due to the efforts of Lanford. He maintains contact with them and has created "Seminole Golf Day" to honor past and present players. This will be an annual event in which former players, team members, and Florida State alumni gather to celebrate FSU's rich golf tradition.

Lanford began his academic career at Florida State, receiving his bachelor's degree in business. He completed his masters requirements at Michigan State before going on to Brigham Young for his doctorate. Dr. Lanford brings experience in the field of golf, excellence in education, and a demand for both from his student-athletes.






## *Bobby Cochran* Senior Cordova, TN (Christian Brothers)


## Strength and Conditioning

"The Strong Shall Survive."

It's the motto of Florida State strength and conditioning coach Dave Van Halanger and his staff in the FSU weight room. It's also the philosophy that has made Seminole athletes in all sports among the strongest, fastest, fittest and most flexible anywhere.

Thanks to a recent expansion, Florida State athletes now have a state-of-the-art facility in which to accomplish their goals. The weight room grew to 7,200 square feet but is still conveniently located in the Moore Athletic Center. The carpeted and mirrored room includes exercise systems by Cybex Eagle as well as free weight equipment. A variety of exercise bicycles, rowing machines and Stairmasters incorporate both strength and conditioning and cardiovascular endurance.

FSU strength coach Dave Van Halanger has specially designed a weight program for the men's golf team. The squad, which works out three days a week, do strength work on their legs, backs, stomachs, wrists, and forearms. Van Halanger's well thought out plan helps players on all aspects of their games. He says, "With strength there is added confidence. Also it will help cut down the threat of injuries and give the players a mental edge."



## FSU and the Atlantic Coast Conference

The Atlantic Coast Conference has a rich tradition in men's golf with the first conference championship dating back to 1954. Duke defeated Wake Forest and North Carolina by ten strokes to take home the first championship trophy.

Wake Forest has won the most ACC titles, claiming 18. The Demon Deacons are followed by North Carolina with 8, Duke with 5 and Georgia Tech with 4.

Georgia Tech has been the team to beat in recent years, winning the last three tournaments. Last season, the Yellow Jackets finished second in the NCAA Championships, only one stroke behind the winner, Florida.

ACC institutions have also been victorious in NCAA play. Wake Forest has claimed three national titles and eight players from ACC schools are NCAA Individual Champions.

Florida State's indoctrination into the conference has been a tough one as the Seminoles finished ninth in its first championship in 1992. Last season, FSU was eighth in the tournament.

This year the ACC Championships will be held in Rocky Mount, NC at the Northgreen Country Club on April 15-17.

## FSU's Academics

The golf team, along with every student-athlete at FSU, currently enjoys one of the nation's premier collegiate academic support systems. A full-time staff assists incoming student-athletes adjust to their new campus environment, as well as making sure they are advised throughout their entire academic careers.

Part and parcel of the academic package is a nightly schedule for athletes in the Moore Athletic Center. The academic staff has tutorial services for those athletes who request them. By working closely with FSU faculty, the academic staff has the responsibility of ensuring that all student-athletes are making satisfactory progress toward their educational goals.

The study hall has every advantage conducive to meeting the athlete's study needs - private study carols, computers, reference materials and a quiet atmosphere.

Athletic Director, Bob Goins says, "We want to provide the best opportunity for the student-athlete to achieve both academic and athletic success. Doing that, we'll be setting a precedent of excellence."



# Seminole Golf Course

The Seminole Golf Course, designed by William W. Amick is located approximately two miles west of the university campus. The first nine holes were completed in 1963 and the completion of the additional nine in 1968.

The golf course measures 7,033 yards from the championship tees and is considered an excellent test of golf. The greens, TIFTON 328 (bermuda) are of medium size, approximately 6,200 square feet each. The course rating is 72.0.

The course and practice facilities are considered to be among the best in the country. The Seminole Golf Course is now operated by *Club Consultation and Management*, a private golf course management firm. There have been many improvements made and within the next five years it should prove to be one of the finest courses in the area.

## Endowment Scholarships

There are two former FSU golfers who have endowed scholarships for the golf team, Dr. Don Veller and PGA Famer Hubert Green. Both endowments came from the two men in 1992 and they both cited their confidence in Dr. Ernie Lanford as one of the reasons for the endowment.

"I knew Ernie when I was at Florida State," said Green. "I was glad that he was hired. He's got a good background and he's a good person."

Dr. Veller has the same feelings about the second year golf coach for the Seminoles. "I think it's {golf program} very upbeat and I think the future is going to be really successful. Lanford is very nice, he's business-like and he works hard and has the know-how, and that's a pretty good combination."

The endowed scholarships make it possible for students to ensure the future of Seminole golf. Thanks to both FSU golf greats for their tremendous contributions to the program.

## Florida State in the NCAA Championships

Last season, Florida State finished 16th in the NCAA East Regional held at the Birdwood Golf Course in Charlottesville, VA. The Seminoles were led by Bobby Cochran who tied for 13th after firing a 215 (71-73-71).

Prior to 1993, Florida State's two highest finishes in the NCAA Championship were in 1990 and 1987. At the 1990 NCAA Championships, held at the Island Golf Course in Tarpon Springs, Florida the Seminoles came away with one of the best finishes in school history under the present format of the championship. The Seminoles placed eighth with a four-day total of 1169, one stroke behind the seventh place finishers, North Carolina. Andy Purnell tied for sixth place and was the highest finisher for the Seminoles. Other FSU finishers included: Roger Winchester (tied 17th), Dustin Phillips (tied 61st), Christian Williams (tied 87th), and John Tighe (tied 126th).

Florida State's best-ever finish was in 1987 at the Scarlet Golf Course in Columbus, Ohio. The Seminoles placed seventh that year, led by All-American Nolan Henke who tied for second, six shots behind the leader. The final four day score of the Seminoles was 1191, four strokes behind sixth-place Arkansas.
