





QUALITY LEADERSHIP

When head coach Trey Jones took over Florida State's men's golf program in 2004, the Seminoles were eighth in the ACC and had not made the NCAA tournament since 1998. Under his leadership, Jones morphed the Seminoles into a winning program, leading the team to nine NCAA Tournament appearances, the most ever in Seminole lore. Jones' coaching expertise led the men's golf team to become recognized as a top contender in the conference and across the nation, revamping the perception of the program. The evidence can be found in the 2008 ACC Championship trophy he brought to Tallahassee. In 2012, Florida State finished in a tie for eighth place at the NCAA Championship Finals marking the second time in three seasons the Seminoles finished in the top eight of the national tournament standings.

PRESTIGIOUS PROGRAM

Florida State is known for developing elite talent and that reputation was further sustained when the men's golf team was invited to compete in the NCAA Tournament for their ninth consecutive season in 2014. This would not have been possible without assistance from the Seminoles' superb athletes such as Jack Maguire and Hank Lebioda. The Seminoles have been successful in the ACC with back-to-back ACC Freshmen of the Year honorees, Jack Maguire (2014) and Hank Lebioda (2013), Brooks Koepka being named the 2010 and 2012 ACC Player of the Year, and Jonas Blixt winning the 2008 ACC Championship. The team has had 17 All-ACC Team Selections since 2007 and 8 GCAA/PING All-Americans. Kyle Cobb was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District First Team in 2012.






The Dave Middleton Golf Complex and the Don Veller Seminole Golf Course are home to the PGA Golf Management Program, which is one of only a few programs in the country accredited by the Professional Golfer's Association of America. A 27,000-square-foot clubhouse, the Dave Middleton Golf Complex boasts private technologically advanced Wi-Fi classrooms, study and teaching labs, an internship library, a fully equipped club repair room, a pro shop, locker rooms and the Renegade Grill. The \$7 million facility is a two-building complex, which also includes a multi-directional driving range, a video analysis instructional center with hitting bays for inclement weather, chipping and putting greens, as well as locker rooms, team lounge, auditorium and fitness facility.

The golf course was renovated in 2004 with the reconstruction of all 18 greens, complexes, tee boxes and the state-of-the-art TifEagle Turf was installed on all the putting surfaces. Each year the facility hosts more than 60,000 rounds of golf. The golf course was recently recognized as one of the top 10 golf courses in the country by the National Golf Foundation for customer loyalty and satisfaction.








Including the 1993 PGA Championship won by Paul Azinger, former Florida State golfers have won more than 50 PGA Tour events. Since Hubert Green won the 1971 Houston Champions Invitational, nearly one dozen former Seminoles have earned overwhelming success on the PGA, Senior PGA (Champions Tour), European Challenge Tour, Web.com, and Buy.com Tours. The members of this fraternity have won more than \$60 million in prize money since finishing their Seminole careers. While representing Florida State and the Seminole golf program, the tournaments where they were victorious include U.S. Open (Hubert Green), the PGA Championship (Paul Azinger and Jeff Sluman), and the Buick Southern Open (Kenny Knox). Most recently, 2008 graduate Jonas Blixt won his second PGA Tour tournament at the 2013 Greenbrier Classic.







NOLES IN THE PROS

Paul Azinger

Starting the PGA Tour in 1982, Paul Azinger had 12 wins including the 1993 PGA Championships. After transferring from Brevard Community College, Azinger completed his collegiate career at Florida State in 1981. While at Florida State, Azinger led the Seminole golf team to its highest ranking ever and was named the Metro Conference Champion and the Most Valuable Player in 1981. Azinger was named to the FSU Hall of Fame in 1988.

The Holyoke, Mass., native was a member of the US Ryder Cup four times (1989, 1991, 1993, 2002) and captain of the 2008 team at the Valhalla Golf Club in Louisville, Kentucky. Throughout his career Azinger was passionate about playing in the Ryder Cup and his hard work paid off as he and American's top golfers returned the Ryder Cup to the United States for the first time since 1999.

Azinger got his first win in 1987 as he went on to win the Phoenix Open, Panasonic Las Vegas Invitational and Canon Sammy Davis Jr. Greater Hartford Open. In 1992 he won The Tour Championship and followed up with his best year in 1993. He won the coveted PGA Championship along with the Memorial Tournament and New England Classic. After battling cancer, Azinger came back strong by winning the 2000 Sony Open in Hawaii. He spent almost 300 weeks in the top-10 of the Official World Golf Rankings between 1988 and 1994.



Hubert Green

Seminole golf legend Hubert Green, who won 22 events while playing on the PGA Tour, was inducted into World Golf Hall of Fame in 2007 and was honored at the Induction Ceremony Nov. 12, 2007 at the World Golf Village in St. Augustine, Fla.

Green came to Florida State in 1965 and served as the captain of the golf team in 1968. He led Florida State to a 10th place finish in the NCAA Championship tournament in 1968 and guided the Seminoles to several impressive dual meet victories over many teams in the southeastern United States including Florida during his collegiate career. Green was inducted in the Florida State Athletics Hall of Fame in 1977. He graduated from Florida State and turned professional in 1969.

Green is one of the most successful professional golfers in the history of the sport. He won 19 events while playing on the PGA Tour including the U.S. Open Championship in 1977 and the PGA Championship in 1985. He played on the 1977, 1979 and 1985 U.S. Ryder Cup Teams and is currently playing on the Champions Tour. Green has earned four titles while playing on the Champions Tour with his most recent championship coming in 2002 at the Lightpath Long Island Classic.



Jeff Sluman

Born and raised in Rochester, New York, Jeff Sluman transferred to Florida State in 1978 and became one of the best golfers on the team until he graduated with a finance degree in 1980. While on the PGA Tour, he won six titles including the 1988 PGA Championship. Named to the 1989 Florida State Hall of Fame Class, his time at Florida State was well spent as he led the team to three tournament wins and the NCAA tournament.

Before he arrived in Tallahassee, he won the 1978 New York State Amateur Tournament. Playing on the PGA Tour from 1980-2009, he finished in the top ten 105 times. His first tour victory happened to be the 1988 PGA Championship but he did not win another tournament until the 1997 Tucson Chrysler Classic. He followed up with another win at the 1998 Greater Milwaukee Open and the 1999 Sony Open in Hawaii. In 2001 he won the B.C. Open and had his last PGA Victory with the 2002 Greater Milwaukee Open.

Sluman still plays professional golf on the Champions Tour and already has two top 10 finishes in 2014 including a second place finish in the Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai. He's had five wins since 2008 including the 2013 Liberty Mutual Insurance Legends of Golf, the 2011 Nature Valley First Tee Open at Pebble Beach, the 2009 and 2008 Walmart First Tee Open at Pebble Beach and the 2008 Bank of America Championship.



2014 Tavistock Collegiate Invitational Champions

NUMBER ONE

On October 22, 2014, Florida State reached the top of the GolfStat rankings for the first time in school history. After a victory at the Tavistock Collegiate Invitational, the Seminoles reached the top spot. They finished the fall season ranked No. 2 by Golfweek, No. 2 by GCAA and No. 3 by GolfStat.

TWO TITLES

After starting the season with two second place finishes, the Seminoles made four birdies on the last two holes to overtake No. 12 Vanderbilt and win the Tavistock Collegiate Invitational by two strokes. The 15-team field had 11 teams ranked in the top 50, including No. 1 Illinois and No. 4 Baylor. A week later, the Seminoles traveled to the FGCU Classic in which they posted a 13-stroke victory over Florida. With second place finishes at the Fighting Illini/Olympia Fields Invitational and Jerry Pate National Intercollegiate, Florida State finished the fall 50-2. This fall goes down as the best semester in school history.

10 TOP 10 FINISHES


Florida State had ten top ten individual finishes in four tournaments this fall. Junior Hank Lebioda had three top ten finishes (T2, T2, T7) all during the month of October. Junior Rowin Caron also posted three top ten finishes (T4, T3, 8). Sophomores Jack Maguire (T3, T6) and Josh Lee (T2, T6) were close behind with two apiece.

SPRING SEASON

The Seminoles once again start the spring season at the Gator Invitational where the members of this roster have excelled. Hank Lebioda and Rowin Caron were both in the line-up when the team won the title in 2013. Last season Lebioda tied for first in the individual standings as the team finished in second place.

Florida State is hosting the Seminoles Intercollegiate once again at Southwood Golf Club in Tallahassee from March 13-15. The team finished second last year after winning the title in 2013. The team finishes the regular season at the Gary Koch Intercollegiate in Tampa which the team won in 2013.

The ACC Championship is April 24-26 and is once again at the Old North State Club in Uwharrie Point, N.C. NCAA Regionals are scheduled for May 14-16 while the NCAA Championship will be held at the Concession Golf Club in Bradenton, Fla., from May 29-June 3.





Freshman Season: Spring 2013 - Posted a 72.09 stroke average for the spring to

combine for a 72.31 average for the year...played 22 rounds in all eight of the Seminole tournaments...posted a career low round of 68 in the second round of the Seminole Intercollegiate...tied for first at the Gary Koch Invitational with a 9-under 207...shot a 9-under 207 at the Seminole Intercollegiate as well where he finished fifth...tied for fifth at the snow storm shortened C&F Bank Intercollegiate with a 1-under 69...one of two freshmen in the ACC to win a tournament this year. **Fall 2012** - Posted a 73.50 stroke average in only four rounds of golf in two tournaments...finished tied for 12th in the hurricane canceled Querencia Cabo Collegiate with a 2-over 74.

Before Florida State: Graduated from Regionale Scholengemeenschap 't Rijks in Bergen op Zoom, The Netherlands in 2012... won the National U-16 Stroke Play Championship in 2008...finished in eighth place in the U-17 European Young Masters and was

ranked first in the National U-19 ranking in 2008...finished third in the European Boys Team Championships and seventh in the U-17 European Young Masters Tournament in 2009...ranked second on the National U-22 Ranking in 2009...a fourth place finish came in the US Junior Masters in 2010 and a second place finish came in Zomerwedstrijd (National Men's Tournament) in 2010... was ranked third in the National Men's ranking in 2010 after winning the National Men's Stroke Play Champion-



ship in 2010...won the National U-19 Stroke Play Championship, finished third in the National U-22 Stroke Play Championship in 2011 and won the U-22 Stroke Play in 2012...earned a second place finish in both the Voorjaarswedstrijd and Zomerwedstrijd (National Men's Tournaments) in 2011...won the U-22 National Match Play Championship in 2011...a second place finish came in the French Boys Stroke Play Tournament...earned a third place finish in the Riverwoods Junior Open in 2011...finished in eighth place at the Junior Orange Bowl Tournament in 2011...ranked third in the National Men's ranking in 2011...won the International Men's Championship in 2012.

TREY JONES

DIRECTOR OF GOLF/HEAD COACH

Now in his 12th season as the head men's coach and Director of Golf, Trey Jones has lifted the sport of golf at Florida State to new heights. Top national finishes, All-Americans, professional success and academic achievement have become synonymous with the Florida State men's golf program under Jones.

Under his direction, there is no limit on how high the Seminole programs will go.

Jones is responsible for attracting nationally ranked recruiting classes, upgrading the Seminoles' schedule and creating one of the most functional player development facilities in college golf. Jones continues annually to build on the Seminoles' success in developing the nation's top talent into national contenders and collegiate golf's elite players. Named the 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year as he led the Seminoles to the first conference championship in the sport of golf, Jones is no stranger to competing with the nation's best in one of the top conferences for college golf.

Building championship teams is nothing new to Jones who has earned four conference coach of the year awards and led 13 of his 18 teams at the Division I level to the NCAA Championship tournament. His teams consistently hold prominent places in the national rankings, are adept at winning conference championships and are annually among the top producers of All-American and all-conference performers.

In his first 11 years in Florida State, Jones has become one of the winningest coaches in school history. He is the only coach to lead the Seminoles to eight NCAA Tournament appearances (no other coach has led Florida State to more than five appearances) and he is ranked first with 13 tournament championships (second is nine by Don Veller). The Seminoles have appeared in a school record nine consecutive NCAA Tournaments entering the 2014-15 season.

2014 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State once again returned to the NCAA Championship Finals, but it was with a much different looking team from the previous year. The Seminoles fielded the youngest team in the tournament with two freshmen, two sophomores and a senior and was one of only three schools (in a field of 30), with only one upperclassman in the line-up. Freshman Jack Maguire became the first freshman to be named an All-American at Florida State as he was named to the second team by Golfweek and to the third team but the GCAA. Maguire and sophomore Hank Lebioda were named to the All-ACC team and Maguire was selected as the ACC Freshman of the Year. The Seminoles smashed apart the record book at the USF Invitational as the team posted the lowest round (24-under 264) and lowest three-round tournament score (41-under 823) in school history. Maguire created his mark with the lowest round in school history (10-under 62) and second lowest tournament score (16-under 200).

2013 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State finished in 11th place at the 2013 NCAA Championship Finals at the Capital City Club Crabapple in Atlanta, Ga. The Seminoles are just one of two teams to finish in the top 11 of the NAAs in three or the last four years. Sophomore Daniel Berger led the team at the Championships finishing tied for second with a 6-under 204. Both Berger and Chase Seiffert earned All-American status for the year as Hank Lebioda was named 2013 ACC Freshman of the Year.

2012 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State earned an eighth place national finish at the 2012 NCAA Championship Finals to mark the second time in three seasons the Seminoles finished in the top eight of the standings at the national tournament. The Seminoles entered the championship ranked No. 19 in the nation by GolfStat and finished as one of only two teams ranked outside of the top

eight to finish in the top eight of the final standings.

2010 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State finished in a tie for third place at the 2010 NCAA Championship Finals to earn the best national finish in school history. The Seminoles fell to Augusta State (the 2010 National Champion) in the semifinals of the championship tournament after defeating Texas Tech in the first round of match play. The Seminoles led the stroke play portion of the tournament and finished in second place to earn the No. 2 seed in the match play portion of the event. The third place finish at the NCAA Championship marked the best finish in school history - one better than the Seminoles fourth place national finish in 1957 and tied for fourth place finish in 1958.

2008 ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State, which was led by All-Americans Jonas Blixt and Matt Savage, won its first ever Atlantic Coast Conference championship as it defeated Duke by three strokes at the 2008 ACC Championship at the Old North State Club at Uwharrie Point. The Seminoles defeated Duke as they rallied from a one stroke deficit after two rounds to claim the school's first ever ACC championship in the sport of golf. Each of the five team members contributed to the victory as the Seminoles closed the 54-hole tournament with four players under par. Blixt and Savage led the way with eight-under par 208 scores as they both finished in a tie for third in the individual standings.

BROOKS KOEPKA

Jones coached Brooks Koepka - the school record holder for lowest stroke average in a single season (71.09) and for a career (71.85) - the ACC Golfer of the Year in 2010 and 2012 and a three-time All-ACC selection. Koepka was named the ACC Golfer of the Year twice, the ACC Rookie of the Year in 2009 and earned All-American twice in his career in leading the Seminoles to four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.



es and two top-10 NCAA Championship Finals finishes. As a senior, Koepka tied the school record with a nine under par score of 63 in the third round of the FAU Spring Break Invitational and set the school record with his 199 total for three rounds of the event. Koepka won three events as a senior – at the Brickyard Collegiate Championship, the Seminole Intercollegiate, the FAU Spring Break Invitational. Koepka secured his status on the PGA Tour by tying for fourth place in the 2014 U.S. Open.

JONAS BLIXT

Jones coached one of Florida State's all-time best players - Jonas Blixt - to All-American honors and the first individual ACC Championship in school history. Blixt earned Ping/Division I All-American First Team honors in 2008 and Ping/Division I All-American second team honors in 2007. He is one of only three players in school history to earn All-American First and Second Team honors during his career. Blixt won the ACC individual championship in 2007 to become the first Seminole to win ACC medalist honors. He helped lead Florida State to the 2008 ACC Championship - the first ACC golf championship in school history - and earned All-ACC honors twice during his career. Blixt is currently playing on the PGA Tour with two wins, the 2012 Frys.com Open and 2013 Greenbrier Classic. He finished tied for second in the 2014 Masters Tournament and 4th in the 2013 PGA Championship.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Committed to the academic and athletic success of his student-athletes, Jones has coached 31 members of the ACC Academic Honor Roll, seven members of the ACC Academic Golf Team and two members of the Golf Coaches' Association of America All-American Scholar team. His team was also

nationally recognized in 2010 as one of the few schools in the NCAA to achieve a perfect APR score of 1000 since the inception of the Academic Progress Rate program in 2003. During his tenure at Georgia State, he coached 10 members of the Atlantic Sun All-Academic team and 20 members of the TAAC All-Academic team.

JONES NATIONALLY

Jones has been an active member of the Golf Coaches Association of America since 1993. He is currently a member of the steering committee for the Collegiate Golf Hall of Fame. Jones served the board as the Division I Director for the East Region and served as the chair of the District 3 South Regional NCAA Selection Committee. He was also a representative in the District 3 South NCAA Selection Committee from 1999-2002.

PERSONAL

Jones is married to the former Cathy McVeigh, who is the coordinator of financial aid for student-athletes at Florida State. They are the proud parents of a daughter, Jordan (13) and a son, Drew (9). Jones earned his bachelor's degree in health and physical education with a minor in business administration from North Alabama in 1991. Jones is a 24-year veteran of the collegiate coaching ranks. He was the head men's coach and Director of Golf Operations at Georgia State for eight years (1996-2003) before becoming only the fifth coach in the history of the Seminole program in 2004. Prior to his career at Georgia State, Jones was an assistant coach at Wallace State Junior College (1992-95) and his alma mater North Alabama (1991). Jones developed his teaching, coaching and recruiting philosophies as he helped hone those programs into national contenders.

ROBERT DUCK

ASSISTANT COACH
4th SEASON
AUGUSTA STATE ('01)

In his fourth season as an assistant coach with both the Seminoles' men's and women's programs, Robert Duck has helped Florida State continue its tradition of NCAA appearances, All-American selections and All-ACC performers. He works with both programs at Florida State in the areas of recruiting and player development along with his daily team and individual coaching responsibilities.

Duck has helped coach both programs into the NCAA Tournament in each of his first three years while working with All-Americans and All-ACC honorees on both teams. In his first three seasons at Florida State, the men have produced three All-Americans, seven All-ACC selections, one ACC Golfer of the Year and two ACC Freshmen of the Year while the women have produced two All-Americans and four All-ACC performers.

During his first three seasons, the Seminole men and the Seminole women have appeared in the NCAA Tournament three times each with the men finishing in ninth in the team standings in the 2012 NCAA Championship finals and tied for 11th in the 2013 NCAA Championship finals. In addition, neither team has finished outside of the top five in the ACC Championships as the men have finished in second (twice) and third once and the women have earned two fourth place finishes with Duck as an assistant coach.

Duck's work with Florida State's players has led to incredible individual success in his first three seasons in Tallahassee. His teaching abilities and coaching philosophies have helped accelerate the careers of two of the top men's players in school history - Brooks Koepka and Daniel Berger - as well as three of the top performers on the women's team - Matilda Castren, Maria Salinas and Jessica Negron. Koepka was named the ACC Golfer of the Year in 2012 and was a three-time All-ACC selection while Berger earned All-ACC honors and played for the United States' Palmer

Cup team in 2013. Duck also works with current Seminole sophomore Jack Maguire - who earned All-America honors in 2014, was the 2014 ACC Freshman of the Year, an All-ACC selection and a member of the 2014 United States Palmer Cup Team. Castren earned All-American and All-ACC honors and set the school record for lowest stroke average in 2014, Salinas finished in second place in the NCAA Central Regional and earned All-American honors in 2012 and Negron earned All-ACC honors in 2013.

Duck has helped coach the Florida State men to six tournament championships in his first three seasons. The Seminoles earned tournament championships at the 2012 Seminole Intercollegiate, the 2012 FAU Spring Break Invitational, the 2013 Gator Invitational, the 2013 Seminole Intercollegiate, the 2013 Gary Koch Intercollegiate and the 2014 USF Invitational. He helped the Seminole women win the team championship at the 2014 Web.com/Marsh landing Intercollegiate and advance to the 2012 NCAA Central Regional, 2013 NCAA West Regional and 2014 NCAA East Regional Championships.

The Seminoles - both the men and the women - have been ranked among the nation's top 25 teams throughout his first three seasons at Florida State. The men were ranked as high as No. 13 while the women were ranked as high as No. 22 nationally in 2012. The men finished the 2013 season ranked No. 12 nationally. During the 2014 season, the Seminole man ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation while the women ranked as high as 25th nationally.

COACHING EXPERIENCE

Duck, one of the rising stars in collegiate coaching, is in his fourth season as an assistant coach at Florida State. He was the acting head coach at Augusta State in 2002, served the Jaguars as a volunteer assistant coach during the 2001-02 season and was an assistant coach for the program during the 2002-03 season. During his tenure as the acting coach at Augusta State, the Jaguars were ranked as high as No. 9 nationally.

PERSONAL

Duck is married to the former Michelle Digsby. The couple has two daughters, Annabel (7) and Hannah (4). He earned his bachelor's degree in marketing from Augusta State in 2001. A native of Northampton, England, he represented Great Britain-Ireland as a member of the 1998 Palmer Cup team. Duck played in the 1997 European Amateur Championship and finished tied as the runner-up with Sergio Garcia and Luke Donald.





MATT SAVAGE

ASSISTANT COACH
3rd SEASON
FLORIDA STATE ('09)

In his third season as an assistant coach at Florida State for both the Seminole men's and women's teams, Matt Savage has earned a leadership role on the Seminoles' coaching staff because of his accomplishments as a collegiate player and the success he earned as a professional golfer. Because of his experiences and his incredible ability to relate to the Seminoles' players, he has quickly become one of the nation's hot young assistant coaches.

Savage plays an integral role in the continued success of the Seminoles as he works with each of the players on a daily basis while assisting with the day-to-day administrative responsibilities of each team. Savage works with both programs in the areas of skill development, recruiting, practice planning and match coaching.

While helping the Seminoles earn team success he is adept and working with Florida State's golfers on an individual level. He works with current Seminole sophomore Jack Maguire - who earned All-America honors in 2014, was the 2014 ACC Freshman of the Year, an All-ACC selection and a member of the 2014 United States Palmer Cup Team and Hank Lebioda - the 2013 ACC Freshman of the Year and a two-time All-ACC selection. He also works with Florida State sophomore Matilda Castren who earned All-American and All-ACC honors and set the school record for lowest stroke average in 2014.

Savage is one of the top golfers in Seminole history. He earned All-America honors in 2007, was the first player in school history to earn All-ACC honors three times, played on one NCAA Championship final and four NCAA Regional Championship teams and led the Seminoles to the first ACC Championship in school history in 2008. Savage closed his career in 2009 with a 73.09 scoring average in 44 career tournaments - the fifth best average in school history.

Among Savage's greatest attributes is his ability to communicate with players and coaches alike and concisely teach the sport of golf to the Seminoles' student-athletes. Because of his recent experiences as a player and now as a coach, Savage's ability to relate to today's collegiate golfer allows him to expect the unexpected while creating long team plans and effectively teaching them on a daily basis.

Savage was one of the building blocks of the Seminole men's program under Director of Golf Trey Jones from 2006 through his graduation from Florida State in 2009. The Seminoles were nationally ranked during each of his four seasons and finished the 2008 season ranked 11th after winning the ACC Championship for the first time in school history. The Seminoles were ranked as high as No. 7 nationally and earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA West Regional Championship in 2008.

Savage began his professional career on the NGA Hooters Tour soon after his graduation from Florida State and enjoyed three prosperous years on golf's third largest tour. He won his first event as a professional - the 2009 Kentucky Open - and was among the top money winners on the tour during his three seasons.

OUTSTANDING SUCCESS IN 2014

Savage helped Florida State to outstanding team and individual success in 2014. The men's golf team finished in second place in the ACC championship, fifth in the NCAA Raleigh Regional and played in the NCAA Championship Finals for the third consecutive year. He helped coach All-American Second Team, ACC Freshman of the Year and All-ACC selection Jack Maguire and All-ACC selection Hank Lebioda. The Seminole men won the USF Invitational where they posted the best single round team and tournament score in team history in winning the championship. The Seminole women finished fifth in the ACC Championship and in a tie for 11th place in the NCAA East Regional which was



held at Southwood Golf Club in Tallahassee. He helped coach freshman Matilda Castren who earned All-American Second Team and All-ACC Honors and who was the runner-up for ACC Player and Rookie of the Year honors as well as All-ACC selection Alex Milan.

2008 ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

Savage led Florida State to its first ever Atlantic Coast Conference Championship April 20, 2008 as the Seminoles defeated Duke by three strokes at the 55th Annual ACC Championship at the Old North State Club at Uwharrie Point. The Seminoles defeated the Blue Devils by four strokes in the third round as they rallied from a one stroke deficit after two rounds to claim the school's first ever ACC championship in the sport of golf. Each of the five team members contributed to the victory as the Seminoles closed the 54-hole tournament with four players under par and only one at over par. Savage led the way with an eight-under par 208 score and finished in a tie for third place in the individual standings.





AMY BOND

WOMEN'S HEAD COACH
5th SEASON
FLORIDA STATE ('99)

With her student-athlete first approach, her love of the game of golf, her unbridled enthusiasm for Florida State and her knack for recruiting top-level talent, Amy Bond is constantly working to take the Seminole women's golf program to a higher level. That higher level is in the classroom, in her relationships with her players, on the golf course and in her role as the President of the Women's Golf Coaches Association.

In her fifth season as the Seminoles' head coach, Bond continues to build a team that will consistently qualify for the NCAA Championship Tournament, compete for ACC and national championships, produce academically successful student-athletes and develop All-ACC and All-American student-athletes.

In her first four seasons at Florida State, the Seminoles have played in four NCAA Championships, produced the school's first NCAA Regional Champion (Maria Salinas in 2012), earned three All-American citations (Matilda Castren in 2014, Salinas in 2011 and 2013), earned five All-ACC selections (Salinas in 2011 and 2012, Jessica Negron in 2013, Castren and Alex Milan in 2014) and had 12 players earn All-ACC Academic honors.

As the fifth head coach in the history of the program, Bond's commitment to success at Florida State has become a way of life. First as a player, then an assistant coach and now as its head coach, Bond's energy and enthusiasm for elevating and securing the tradition of the program is rivaled by few coaches in all of collegiate golf.

As a player she earned a spot on the ACC's 50th Anniversary team, as an assistant coach she helped the Seminoles to three NCAA Tournament appearances and as the head coach, she has led Florida State to four NCAA Championship appearances in her first four years as the head coach of the Seminoles.

Throughout her career at Florida State, she has played as one of the Seminoles top players (she was named Florida State's team MVP in 1997, 1998 and 1999), played with a number of touring professionals (including LPGA major winner Karen Stupples) and has coached many of Florida State's recent greats including the only four-time golf All-American in school history (Caroline Westrup). While achieving success during her career as a player and a coach, Bond has never lost sight of her ultimate goal: the success and achievements of her student-athletes.

In her nine seasons as a Seminole coach (five as an assistant and four as the head coach), every student-athlete who has played golf at Florida State has earned her bachelor's degree and every one played on at least two NCAA Tournament teams during their careers. The Seminoles are among the NCAA leaders with a perfect APR rating during the first four seasons on Bond's head coaching tenure at Florida State.

COMMUNITY SERVICE CHAMPIONS

The Seminoles women's golf team has won 12 of the last 13 (including 12 consecutive) Athletic Director's Cup for Service at Florida State's annual Golden Nole Banquet. The Athletic Director's Cup for Service is presented annually and is the most prestigious award given to the Seminole student-athletes. It goes to the team that contributes the most service hours to the community over the course of an entire year. The Seminoles won the Athletic Director's Cup for Service in each of Bond's five years as an assistant coach and in her first three seasons as the Seminoles' head coach.

PERSONAL

An Ocala, Fla., native, Bond earned a bachelor's degree in sport management from Florida State in 1997 before earning her master's degree in sport administration from Florida State in 1999. Bond's twin brother, Tommy, is the Director of Athletics and head baseball coach at Trinity Catholic in Ocala, Fla. Tommy led Trinity Catholic to the 4A state championship in 2014.

Jennifer Santiago was named Director of Operations for the men's and women's golf teams in 2014. Prior to working with the golf teams, she was the Director of Operations for the men's and women's track and field teams at Florida State.

Santiago has been a member of the athletics staff at Florida State since 2007 when she became a member of the Athletic Academic Support Unit. She was promoted to the position of Associate Director of the Academic Support Unit before becoming the Assistant Athletics Director for Compliance in 2009. She served the department in that capacity until 2012 when she began working with the National Championship track and field teams.

Santiago previously worked as the Assistant Athletic Director for Student-Athlete Development at Georgia State University, as well as spending four years as a high school teacher before coming to Florida State.

A native of Sarasota, Florida, Santiago earned her undergraduate degree in English from Villanova University and a Master's in Education from the University of Pennsylvania.

In 2001, she married Matt Balog. The couple has four children: Tauara, 31, eleven-year old Alexander, nine-year old Nicolas and Lucas who was born in 2009.





HIGHLIGHTS

The Florida State men's golf team advanced to the NCAA Championships for the fourth time in five years, and the third straight, after finishing fifth at the NCAA Raleigh Regional. The team earned one team title during the spring which was at the USF Invitational where the team posted the best round and tournament score in school history. Jack Maguire won two tournaments and was named as an All-American and as the ACC Freshman of the Year. Hank Lebioda was named to the All-ACC Team for the second straight year.

HONORS STACK FOR JACK

Not only did freshman Jack Maguire win the USF Invitational and Mason Rudolph Championship, he nabbed honors nationally and in the conference. Maguire was named to the All-ACC Team and as the ACC Freshman of the Year. He became the third Seminole to earn this honor and it was the second consecutive for the Seminoles as Hank Lebioda took the honor last year. In June, he became the first freshman on the men's golf team to be named an All-American at Florida State. He earned second team honors by Golfweek and third team honors by PING/GCAA.

RECORD BREAKERS - PART ONE

Florida State had one team win this year, but the Seminoles made the most of it at the USF Invitational rearranging the record book. Freshman Jack Maguire played his best round of golf on Tuesday, March 4, in the third and final round at the Lake Jovita Golf and Country Club. With a 10-under 62, he topped the previous low of a 9-under 63 by current assistant coach Matt Savage. Savage posted his round at the FSU Spring Invitational in 2009. In 2012, Brooks Koepka (currently playing on the PGA Tour) carded an 8-under 63 at the FAU Spring Break Intercollegiate. With a final score of a 16-under 200, Maguire has the lowest three rounds in relation to par and is second with a 200. Koepka holds the records for a 199 54-hole total (14-under) at the same FAU 2012 Intercollegiate. Maguire wasn't the only Seminole to perform well at the USF Invitational. Freshman Cristobal Del Solar is now tied for third after posting a 13-under 203 54-hole score. He is tied for third with four people. Maguire posted another top three finish this year as he finished first at the Mason Rudolph Championships.

RECORD BREAKERS - PART TWO

At the USF Invitational, what Jack Maguire and Cristobal Del Solar did on the course was remarkable, but the three other golfers, Rowin Caron, Hank Lebioda and Harry Ellis, did their parts to ensure the team would win.

The team managed to record an outstanding 24-under 264 in the third round, smashing the previous team round record by four strokes. Before that, the lowest team round was in 2009 at the FSU Spring Break Invitational when the team had a 20-under 268. The Seminoles not only had a good thing round, but also an amazing 54-holes to finish the tournament with a 41-under 823. The previous low score was an 829 at the 2012 Seminoles Intercollegiate and the previous low score in relation to par was a 30-under at the 2009 Gary Koch Invitational.




