



#### THE 1964 OUTLOOK

The performance of a host of sophomores will largely determine whether or not Florida State can hold its place as the South's top swimming team.

Last season's 6-3 record is considered a setback by Coach Bim Stults whose 14 year record at Florida State is 116-22-2. What appeared to be one of the strongest Seminole teams in history had several major losses before the season started because of grades and other ailments. The result was two losses to arch-rival Florida and one to a fine University of North Carolina team.

"Last season was our worst in years," said Stults. "We don't have much hope of doing any better this year, even though we should have a better team."

Ten lettermen return from last year's squad, but the primary Seminole hopes rest on 19 freshmen up to the varsity from one of FSU's finest yearling squads in history.

"We should have better depth in the relay events than we had last year," Stults says. "But unless we come up with some outstanding performances in the individual events we'll have a difficult time matching the strength of Florida and North Carolina."

Stults views his toughest rivals this way:

"Florida was the strongest team in the South last year. They lost some good swimmers, but some good ones are coming up to replace them. This year's team should be as good as last year's was.

"I don't think North Carolina lost to anyone. They had an outstanding freshman team and will be stronger this season."

Despite a none too bright team outlook, at least two Seminoles are considered good bets for national recognition. Diver Neal Allen was undefeated in dual competition and sophomore Richard Abbott is potentially one of the best all-around swimmers Florida State has ever had.

Other expected standouts are backstroker Richard Acosta, back after a year's absence, breaststroker Doug Kruger, and freestylers Mike Blouin, Gene Dayton, John Kohnen, and Jimmy Mauldin.

#### NEW HOME FOR SEMINOLE SWIMMERS

Florida State University will boast the most modern aquatic facility in the South upon completion of the new Olympic-sized swimming pool this summer (cover). The eight lane competitive area is 75' x 60'. The long course pool is 50 meters long and 60' wide, also containing eight lanes. The pool will be equipped with two one meter boards and two three meter boards. The tower will have platforms of 5, 7½ and 10 meters. Complete with three underwater observation windows, heated water and deck, Florida State's new pool will have all the equipment necessary to hold Olympic trials or any national swimming meet.

### BIM STULTS, Head Coach



When Florida State University entered intercollegiate swimming competition in 1949, a balding, ex-naval officer was on hand to do the coaching. That first Seminole aquatic team won three meets, lost five.

It was the last losing season N. B. (Bim) Stults ever had.

In fifteen years at Florida

State, Stults' teams have won an amazing 116 meets against 22 losses and two ties in dual competition. That's a percentage of .841.

The record establishes Florida State as the South's top power, and one of the outstanding swimming schools in the nation. Much of the credit belongs to Stults--a former Navy commander who got his coaching start in Ohio high school circles.

Stults was graduated from Washington and Lee in 1930 with a B.A. degree. He went directly to Ross High School in Fremont, Ohio, where his teams won the Ohio state championship five times and were runners-up twice. His Ross swimmers finished third in national competition on four occasions.

During his Florida State career, Stults has developed six All-Americans, and one of his divers, Curt Genders, won the 1961 national championship in his event. Florida State has had four undefeated seasons (1951, 1954, 1955 and 1960) and have swept several significant team championships.

In 1939, Stults served as assistant swimming coach at Ohio State University. After serving in the Navy from 1942 through 1946, he returned to Ohio State until coming to Florida State in 1948.

DENNY FLANDREAU: Denny is a 24-year-old student at FSU....Earned 14 letters in six sports while in high school....Hometown is Paris, Ky., though he was born in Chicago....Coached 12th Naval District swim champs while in Coast Guard.

JACK SIMMONS: Jack is a 32-year-old assistant professor of English education at FSU who graduated with honors from Gloucester, Mass., High School....He and his wife and three children make their home in Tallahassee....Earned letters in baseball and basketball in high school.

NEAL ALLEN, Diver: Undefeated last year in dual competition. Exceptional strength gives him tremendous lift off the board... Continued improvement should give him a chance for national competition .... High school state champ and All-American at West Palm Beach Forest Hills.

RICHARD ABBOT, Medley: Squad's best swimmer... This sophomore can probably beat anyone on the team in any event at any distance... Will probably have a shot at nationals... One of the best all around swimmers ever to come to FSU.

RICHARD ACOSTA, Backstroke: Back after a year's absence... The team's number one backstroker... Once held two school records... Expected to be the best in school's history.

DOUG KRUGER, Breaststroke: Holds two varsity records...One of the strongest, most determined workers on the squad...An industrial arts major, he does repair work around the pool in his spare time.

MIKE BLOUIN, Freestyle: Another soph... Mike is expected to be the strongest sprinter on squad... On two record setting relay teams as a frosh last year... He was captain of his outstanding Fork Union Military Academy team in Virginia... Son of a naval officer.

GENE DAYTON, Freestyle: A distance man, Gene continues to grow in strength and weight... Squad's best at 200 and 500 meters last year... His father is a high school athletic director in Illinois.

JOHN KOHNEN, Freestyle: An easy to coach soph, Kohnen was slowed by illness last year, but if he can regain strength, he should help in the sprints... Quiet... One of the team's most popular men.

JIMMY MAULDIN, Freestyle: A former prep All-American at Georgia Military Academy... One of the most dependable freestylers on the team... Hopes are that maturity will give this sophomore enough strength to make him one of the nation's best.

# FLORIDA STATE'S ALL AMERICANS



ROGER SLATER, Diving, 1951, 1952: Florida State's first All-American in any sport, and the first diver in the South to achieve that honor, Slater was a choice on both the low and high boards. A tremendous athlete, Slater could have been outstanding nationally in any event if he hadn't wanted to be a diver. A pre-med student at Florida State, Slater is now a doctor.



ERNIE STOCK, Breaststroke, 1954: Probably the strongest swimmer ever to compete for Florida State, The Royal Oak, Michigan native was All-American in 1954 as a junior. He improved the next year, but a rules change allowing the butterfly stroke kept him from repeating. Stock, now living in Chicago, Ill., still holds the Florida State varsity and pool record for the 200 meter breaststroke.



BUCK HILES, Freestyle, Butterfly, 1959, 1961: Hiles is the only Florida State swimmer ever to make All-American in two strokes. He gained national honors as a freestyler as a sophomore in 1959, again as a senior with the butterfly. Illness in 1960 kept Hiles from being a three time All-American. Hiles was Athlete of the Year at Florida State in 1961, and coached the U. S. Military Academy Plebes following graduation.



BOB WEBER, Diving, 1959, 1960: One of Florida State's most popular athletes, Weber made All-American two years in a row on the one meter board. He came to Florida State after an outstanding high school career in Louisville, Ky. After graduation, Weber followed Hiles to West Point as diving coach.



CURT GENDERS, Diving, 1959, 1960, 1961: Possibly the greatest athlete in Florida State history, Genders was an All-American all three years of his varsity competition, and won the national onemeter board championship in 1961. He was also an All-American on the high board. Genders won the Scholarship Athlete Award at FSU. A pre-law student, he is now diving coach at West Point.



PAUL THOMPSON, Freestyle, 1962: All-American in both the 220 and 440 freestyle in 1962, Thompson missed the honor at 200 yards by .1 of a second. One of the most versatile swimmers ever to swim at FSU, Thompson holds more school records than any other Florida State swimmer. He is now a graduate student in Physics at UCLA, and swims with the Los Angeles Athletic Club with an eye on the Olympic trials.
