



THE UNIVERSITY



Dr. Champion

Florida State University, like all of its athletic teams, is characterized by energetic growth, exuberant activity and eager competition at the intercollegiate levels. Led today by one of the nation's younger university presidents, Dr. John E. Champion (46), Florida State is known as a record-setting institution in the realm of academics as well as athletics and takes great pride in

the production of prowess in both fields. Dedicated to the education of the whole student and the development of physical, as well as mental, abilities, the University enjoys an enviable reputation in its annual schedule of spring sports activities-swimming, track, baseball, golf and tennis. Just as each of these fine teams has grown to championship calibre in the past score of years, so the University has come of age in an era of phenomenal growth in its enrollments and its academic stature. Presently educating more than 16,000 students, the University's 10 colleges and schools (Arts and Sciences, Education, Business, Home Economics, Librarianship, Music, Nursing, Engineering Science, Law and Social Welfare) are taking an intercollegiate lead at both the graduate and undergraduate levels of instruction. By 1975, Florida State expects to have more than 25,000 students, of which some 10,000 will be studying for graduate and postgraduate degrees. Whether one looks to the University's distinguished professors (including the 1966 Nobel Prize Winner in Chemistry, Dr. Robert S. Mulliken) or its distinguished athletes, there is ample evidence that Florida State is "in the swim," both in the classroom and on the playing field.

Vaughn Mancha is in his ninth year as Florida State's Athletic Director. A former All-America football player at Alabama and one-time assistant coach for the Seminoles, he has a deep interest in all athletic programs.

In his tenure he has made great strides in taking Florida State toward its ultimate athletic goal, the strongest over-all pro-

gram in the country.

Bim Stults begins his 21st season as Florida State's head swimming coach this year. In the past 20 seasons his teams have won an amazing 154 dual meets while losing only 29, a winning percentage of .840.

Stults became the University's first and only swimming coach in 1948. His first team won only three meets while losing five, but since then he has

not had a losing season.

During his career at Florida State, the Seminoles have had six undefeated seasons, while six other teams were beaten only once. Only three times in the two decades since that first year have the Seminoles suffered more than two losses in a single season.

This record has established Florida State as one of the South's best, as well as one of the nation's outstanding swimming schools. Six Seminole swimmers have been All-Americas, and in 1961 diver Curt Genders became the first Florida State athlete to win a national championship.

A native of Ohio, Stults graduated from Washington and Lee University in 1930. In 1939 he became the assistant swimming coach at Ohio State.

World War II interrupted Stults' coaching career and he served as a line officer with the U.S. Naval forces in both the Atlantic and Pacific. He retired with the rank of Lt. Commander.

After the war Stults returned to Ohio State and remained there until coming to Florida State.

Stults is a past president of the College Swimming Coaches Association, and is a member of the Board of Directors of the Swimming Hall of Fame at F. Lauderdale.

Presently he is serving as a member of the Amateur Athletic Union diving committee. In June 1966 Stults toured the Middle East with an All-Star swimming and diving team, and last summer served as a diving judge at the U.S. Olympic Trials.

Head Coach at Washington and Lee University (alma mater of head coach Bim Stults) for eight years, Norris Eastman joined the Seminole staff in 1967, while he is working on his doctorate at Florida State. He is a 1958 graduate from Springfield College in Massachusetts.

PETE SCHOLLE

A doctoral student in Physical Education, Pete Scholle comes to Florida State after serving as swimming coach at Miami of Ohio. A graduate of Ithaca College in New York, where there was no swimming team, Scholle first coached at Muskegon (Mich.) High School where he helped establish a new swimming program.

JOHN SIMMONS

A valuable member of the staff, John Simmons handles the many important details in staging meets at the Florida State University Union Pool.

GERRY BRADEN

This former Seminole swimmer returned to his alma mater last year after five years as coach at Ft. Myers Lee High School, where he lead the Lee swimmers to the county championship in 1967. While an undergraduate at Florida State, the 1962 graduate swam the butterfly. He is working on his Masters degree in Educational Administration.

1968-69 OUTLOOK

For the first time in many seasons the Seminoles go into their season without a definite star. Gone are the Dick Abbotts and Seeley Feldmeyers. Nevertheless the outlook is bright for the 1969 campaign. The team is well balanced in the swimming events while the Seminole divers should continue their dominating ways.

Feldmeyer's departure leaves a big hole and his loss will certainly be felt, but Coach Bim Stults feels that overall the freestyle events will be just as strong as they were last year.

The schedule is tougher this season as an emphasis on swimming and recruiting in the South has strengthened many of the Tribe's long standing opponents. The season opened at its earliest date in school history when the Seminoles swam against Evansville and South Florida, Dec. 13 and 14.

Freestylers to be watching this season are cocaptain John Stafford and junior Jim Harrison in the 100 and 200. Other sprint men who will work primarily in the 50 and 100 are Dean Jerger, Hod Gray and Lee Eisinger. Jerger, Eisinger and Harrison are all members of the Seminoles' record setting 400 free relay team. Distance men Jim Thompson and Steve Mc-Nerney both return and will cover the 500 and 1000.

Breaststroke will probably be the Seminoles weakest spot this year, but perhaps only in the early going. Danny Brendle, who was the leading breaststroker last year as a sophomore, has left the team and once again the Seminoles will have to rely on inexperienced talent. Freshman Norm Loges may be the best of the lot, and if he comes along fast enough this area may not be as vulnerable as it first appeared. Sophomores Dennis Bunn and Ron Potts along with freshman Tom Harmon also show promise.

Butterfly was a big headache last year when the top performers left the squad unexpectedly, but Bruce Rathman, Jim Vining and Kent Davis all came along exceptionally well as the season wore on. They are all back and with the year experience and development the Seminoles could be strongest ever here.

Backstroke is in the capable hands of co-captain Dennis Shiels at the number one spot, but the ranks thin out quickly behind him. Dave Mignano may be the best of the young swimmers. He showed promise until hurt in a motorcycle accident last year. Bill Gest, a converted freestyler, also shows promise.

Individual Medley swimmers will probably be Shiels, Potts and freshman Steve Connell.

Diving has always been one of the Seminole strongest events, and despite the loss of Randy Stewart the divers figure to continue their winning ways. Ken VonRoenn and Howie Acosta a pair of juniors and sophomores Phil Boggs and Terry Maxhimer will carry most of the load.

SEMINOLE PROFILES

John Stafford, Freestyle: Team Co-captain and leading candidate in 200 . . . has tough assignment of taking graduated Seeley Feldmeyer's place in 200 . . . will also be counted on in the 100 and for a leg of the free relay team . . . best all around freestyler on squad.

Dennis Shiels, Backstroke and Individual Medley: Could be the best IM man in school history . . . only a junior but his leadership ability resulted in his being selected co-captain with John Stafford . . . record holder in backstroke, he is expected to crack Dick Abbott's IM mark before the end of the season.

Jim Thompson, Freestyle: Holds record in the 500 free . . . this senior is one of the most versatile swimmers on the squad, can swim anything from 100 to 1000 free . . . his best time for 1000 is actually better than the existing school record, but was made in a losing cause.

Steve McNerney, Freestyle: Most seasoned distance man...holds 1000 record...will lay back until he is seemingly out of race but finishes strong... teamed with Thompson... gives strong punch in the distance events.

Jim Harrison, Freestyle: Returned to school with much needed weight gain . . . with experience he got last year should be much improved . . . qualified for Canadian Olympic team this summer, but through a mix-up was not able to attend the Mexico City games . . . will see most work in 100 and 200.

Bruce Rathman, Butterfly: A big key to the Seminoles success this year . . . was thrust to top fly spot last year by transfers and came on strong . . . was injured last spring and did little work this summer, if

he recovers, the fly will be in good shape . . . will also swim leg of the Medley Relay.

Jim Vining, Butterfly: One of the best freshman flyers in school history last year . . . his best time is just .8 seconds behind Rathman . . . expected to be improved this season.

Norman Loges, Breaststroke: Freshman swimmer, but expected to be top breaststroker . . . has all the tools and credentials to be a good one, but still lacks the experience . . . look for improvement as the year goes on.

Dean Jerger, Freestyle: Has unenviable assignment of taking Feldmeyer's spot in the 100 . . . as freshman last season he worked his way up to number two spot in that event . . . fine competitive attitude, loves a challenge . . . bigger and stronger than last season, already has shown improvement.

Lee Eisinger, Freestyle: Young freestyler who showed a lot of improvement last year . . . member of record-holding free relay team . . . hard work this summer resulted in much improved performances this fall . . . could have big future.

Mark Jenkins, Freestyle: Versatile young swimmer... showing steady improvement... next to Jim Thompson probably most versatile freestyler on squad.

Phil Boggs, Diving: Much improved over his freshman season . . . made fine showing in this year's National AAU's . . . has greatly expanded his selection of dives . . . doing all dives well.

Ken VonRoenn, Diving: One of most experienced divers on club . . . made outstanding showing at AAU's this summer . . . hard work this summer is showing in his vast assortment of dives . . . should be a big point getter.
