He has been active in local tennis circles as a member of the Tallahassee Tennis Association, a


private instructor and serving with the Tallahassee Recreation Department in planning and running tennis tournaments.

### **Tennis Outlook**

The bicentennial version of Florida State tennis will be counting on sheer determination and individual improvement to make the 1976 season one worth celebrating.

After losing Clive Rothwell and Zeca Schmidt to the pro ranks, new Head Coach Ken Vinson finds himself with much less firepower than expected to return from last season's 14-6 squad. Vinson will be looking to experienced number one player Gordon Jones to provide the leadership and a host of upcoming players to rally to the challenge.

"Jones is a very fine competitor," Vinson said,

Jones, a junior out of Arlington, VA, was a fierce competitor at the number one spot last season and has improved his game even more since that time. He won the 1976 Sunshine State Tennis Championships in Orlando and has competed in many national and regional tournaments throughout the summer and fall.

"As for the rest of the squad, we have been looking sharp in practice," Vinson said, "but we will have to continue to improve and build on what we have to be competitive with many of the teams on our schedule."

Veterans Enrique Andrade and Dave Calvert hold down the two and three spots respectively and are expected to give the Seminoles reinforcement in the top of the order.

"Andrade is an experienced player with a lot of ability," said Vinson of the senior netter. "He is an exciting player to watch — very quick and always concentrating on the game."

Sophomore Bruce Knittle and juniors Andre Cantin and Rick Thomas also figure heavily into the Seminoles' game along with promising freshman Allan Bellamy.

In doubles competition, Jones and Andrade appear to be a pretty formidable pair for any opponent. Following the two vets on the second court will probably be Calvert and Bellamy. Number three doubles players will include some combination of Knittle, Chet Benson, Rick Thomas, or Bob Neinken.

"All of our players are improving," Vinson said, "and that is essential to our success."


