When first year coach Randy Jobson steps on the court this season, Seminole tennis will not be new to the personable mentor. In fact, being the head coach of the Tribe netters will not be new either.

Jobson, a former resident of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, played varsity tennis for Florida State from 1965-69

earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration. Following a four year absence from Seminole tennis, Jobson returned for the 1973 season as head coach and remained at that post three years. In that time, Jobson coached teams compiled an envyable 38-18 record and continued the excellence of Seminole tennis.

SEMINOLE OUTLOOK

Mix a new head coach, two returning varsity lettermen and the No. 3 player from Brazil and what do you have? Possibly one of the most talented Seminole tennis teams in recent history.

Under the helm of first year coach Randy Jobson, the Seminoles will possess a young, but very talented team. The Tribe netters return junior Peter Prinos and senior Steve Layton along with former varsity player John Dwight who did not compete last season. The returning Seminole players will have to compensate for the graduation of last season's captain Allan Bellamy and No. 3 player Barber Ali Khan. The Tribe also lost their No. 1 seed with the transfer of junior Jose Neto.

Although lacking in age, the Seminoles should have the talent to make up for last season's losses. Leading the way for the new players is former No. 3 Brazilian player Marco Abilhoa. Abilhoa, one of the steadiest competitors on the squad, conbines excellent touch and steady play with an aggressive serve and volley. Joining Abilhoa on the newcomers list is freshman John McLean. One of the top players on the team, McLean will be vying for the No. 2 spot, but will have stiff competition from Layton, Prinos and Dwight who have all played in the No. 2 slot.

With the No. 2-No. 5 positions still up for grabs between McLean, Layton, Prinos and Dwight, the No. 6 slot is also still unsettled. Junior Kevin Green, a transfer from Miami-Dade Community College, has a slight edge over fellow transferee (Indian River Community College) and returning Seminole Robie Golin.

The Seminole depth will be greatly enhanced starting in the spring with the addition of Hernan Luque, the No. 2 ranked junior player in Ecuador, and Anthony Boulle', ranked 12th in the South African junior competition. The duo of Luque and Boulle' should provide the Tribe with additional strength in the middle of the lineup and especially in doubles competition.

Also in the doubles picture for the Tribe are Abilhoa and Dwight who played No. 1 doubles all fall, and Layton and McLean who are close competition as the No. 2 team. Also expected to see action are Prinos and Golin in the No. 3 spot they occupied last season.

While the players continue to improve, so does the competition. The Tribe will square off against Miami, Florida and Alabama – all on the road – and Flagler College in a home-and-home series. The highlight of the season will be the Metro Conference Championships to be played once again on the Tully Courts May 9-10.

ASSISTANT COACHES

Joining Jobson at the helm of the tennis team is assistant Tommy Williams. Williams, a local product from Quincy, Florida began his teaching career as assistant pro under Randy Jobson at Capital City Country Club in 1975. Williams moved with Jobson to Killearn Golf and Country Club in 1978 where he is still currently employed while helping with the coaching duties. A highly intelligent individual Williams is presently a senior at FSU majoring in biology.

Rounding out the Seminole coaching staff is former varsity player Andy Bergvaulds. A physical education major from Canada, Bergvaulds completed his eligibility for the Seminoles last season but continues to participate in the program in an assistant capacity. Bergvaulds is also currently interning at cross town Leon High School where he serves as boy's tennis coach.

Managing the squad this season is Tim Anderson. A business administration major, Anderson hails from Margate, Florida where he developed his interest in tennis.
