



In non dual meet competition last season the Seminoles showed much strength which led them to victories in the Montgomery Coliseum Relays and State Championships. At Montgomery the Tribe outpointed Furman and Georgia Tech for the Championship. In the First Annual State Championships at Tampa, the Seminoles downed rivals, Florida, Miami and Florida A&M for the title. Later Florida State finished a close second to Southern Illinois in the Florida Relays. In May competing as the Tallahassee Athletic Club the Seminole runners finished third in the State Invitational. Sid Gainey led a contingent of Seminoles in several other national meets. Gainey captured first in the long jump at the Senior Bowl, Orange Bowl, Coliseum Relays, Southeastern Indoor Championships and Florida Relays, and was seventh at both the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships.

MIKE LONG Head Coach

Florida State year after year produces one of the best track teams in the Southeast. Much of this success is due to the knowledge Mike Long has gained through 29 years of coaching, 12 as Florida State's head track coach, and which he has effectively used to make his teams prominent.

In his years as head coach, Long's teams have often won the State Invitational and Montgomery, Alabama's Coliseum Relays, both tough traditional meets, and have managed to compile a 50-11 dual meet record. Five of these seasons Florida State has been undefeated in dual meets.

During the 1966 season Florida State again won the Coliseum Relays, was second in the Florida Relays, and was first in a newly formed meet-the State Championship.

Long graduated from the University of Minnesota where he won an Olympic regional pole vault title in 1936. After 16 years of high school coaching, 10 in Florida and 6 in Minnesota, Long came to Florida State as a football and basketball assistant in 1953. In 1954 he assisted Dr. Kenneth Miller in track and in 1955 he took over as head track coach.

Long is married to the former Louise Creeger of Luverne, Minnesota. They have four sons and one daughter. All four sons have participated in the Florida State track program.

ASSISTANT COACHES

JACK IBACH-The major responsibility of the former Aubum pole vaulter is administration. He charts the results of the workouts, makes sure all of the necessary equipment is ready to be used and handles much of the meet administration. He graduated from Aubum in 1962 in the field of agriculture education. He has previous athletic experience from administering and participating in Army athletics for 8 years and from coaching Crawfordville High School's track team year before last. He is married to the former Margaret Merrigan of Birmingham. They have a daughter Mary, two, and a son, Bobby, one. Ibach, 35, expects to receive his Masters in Physical Education in April.

ROBERT NOYES-Primarily coordinating the field events, the London, Ontario native, has experience in coaching both track and football. After graduating from the University of Western Ontario in 1963 where he was a triple jumper and quarter miler and a football halfback, Noyes was a track and football coach for four years at a London, Ontario high school and ran the London Track Club. The 26 year old Canadian is married to the former Betty Harmer of Mitchell, Ontario. He is working on his Masters degree in education while at Florida State.

1967 OUTLOOK

HURDLES. The intermediate and high hurdles spearhead the running events, and are possibly Florida State's best. It will feature nationally ranked intermediate hurdler Steve Landis. Backup men are, Charlie Vickers in the intermediates and Mike Kelly in the highs.

SPRINTS-Andy Guy will lead the Seminoles in the 100 and 220. Guy has a fine high school background and did well last season as a freshman.

440 Joe Rooney-a challenging newcomer from last year's freshman squad, hurdler Steve Landis and junior letterman Wayne Currie are the top prospects. The early performances of Rooney and Landis indicate the Tribe should be solid here.

880 - With the graduation of all last year's half milers, Curt Long has been moved from the quarter mile to take up the slack. He is expected to combine with sophomores Bob Thomas and Tom Rickard's to make a potent half mile team.

MILE AND TWO-MILE-Cross country standouts, Marc Williamson and Sid Merchant will take care of both distances. Williamson is an excellent sophomore prospect and should develop into one of the South's best. Merchant is a seasoned competitor and should have his best year.

RELAYS-Richard McLean and anchor man Andy Guy are expected to lead an untried and unproven 440 relay team. Steve Landis, Wayne Currie and Sid Gainey are all competing for the final two legs of the relay. The mile relay team should be one of Florida State's best ever.

LONG JUMP, TRIPLE JUMP-The NCAA's seventh ranked indoor and outdoor long jumper, Sid Gainey, should make the Seminoles prominent in both events. Last season Gainey was the long jump champion at the Senior Bowl, Orange Bowl, Montgomery Coliseum Relays, Southeastern Indoor Championships and the Florida Relays.

HIGH JUMP-Junior Bud Manning and Hurdler Mike Kelly hold down the high jump. Manning was second in the state championship meet last year

SHOT AND DISCUS-Dave Braggins and Charlie Fuchs lead a large contingent in these events which should be big point getters this season. Joining Braggins and Fuchs in the shot will be Tom Gardner and Dave Barton. Barton, Bill Dean and Dan Hamberg will add solid depth in the discus.

JAVELIN - Bud Manning is the prime contender here, but the junior letterman must add about 20' to his distance to be a consistent winner. He has the strength and potential and lacks only development. Bill Dean and Dave Thompson add depth to the Tribe's hopes here.

POLE VAULT-The loss of the State Champion, Jack Flandreau, and last year's freshman champion, Fletcher Sims, has turned what originally looked like one of the Seminoles strongest events into probably its weakest.

PROFILES

WAYNE CURRIE - Junior, Mobile, Ala. The rangy quarter miler and relay man had a good sophomore season and has a promising future. With strength, maturity, and a little bit more dedication he could become one of the best.

CHARLIE VICKERS - Junior, Orlando, The leading varsity high hurdler last year until a severe ankle sprain stopped him in mid-season. He is also a contender in the intermediates.

ANDY GUY-Sophomore, Atlanta, Ga. The leading prospect to replace last year's sprint champion Ken White, Guy will also be an important man in both relays. He is a strong, fast and tough competitor, but will have to come along rapidly and carry a heavy responsibility.

STEVE LANDIS - Senior, Atlanta, Ga. One of the top intermediate hurdlers in the South, last year's state champion, and a placer in the Penn Relays. A key performer and leader, this year he will add the open 440 to his events.

BILL DEAN - Junior, Eustis. A versatile performer, and currently making his most progress in the discus, he could be outstanding before the year is out.

TOM RICKARDS - Sophomore, Ft. Myers, Capable and promising in the middle distances, and one of Florida State's most improved cross country men. Rickards is making steady progress.

DAN HAMBERG - Sophomore, Austell, Ga. Making rigid improvement in the discus, he is aiming for a new school record.

MIKE KELLY - Sophomore, Winter Park. Was one of the finest freshmen hurdlers in the Southeast last year and is aiming for a national ranking in both high and intermediate hurdles in 1967. Kelly also does well in the high jump.

SID GAINEY - Senior, Cairo, Ga. Nationally ranked and school record holder in the long jump. Gainey might possibly attain a high national ranking in the triple jump this season as well as in the long jump.

DAVE FREW - Junior, Huntsville, Ala. Specializes in the intermediate hurdles and is very consistent. A strong strider.

GARDNER - Junior, Keystone Heights. Comparatively small for a weight man, but quick and strong. Should reach low 50's in the shotput.

MARCUS WILLIAMSON - Sophomore, Raleigh, N.C. A promising distance runner and effective competitor. Williamson is the backbone and leader of a talented young core of distance men. He should have a fine future and could become one of the best.

BUD MANNING - Junior, Gainesville. One of Florida State's most versatile athletes and a consistent winner in the high jump and javelin. He is also a fine decathalon prospect.

SID MERCHANT - Junior, Melbourne, Consistently a top performer in the mile and two mile. A strong contender in cross-country, especially strong during the latter part of the season. Merchant looks ready for his best season.

LONG - Senior, Tallahassee. CURT Last season's best quarter miler and steadily improving, he will move up to the half mile this year and probably continue his 440 work in the mile relay. In 1966 he was the high point man in the Florida meet.

JOE ROONEY - Sophomore, Ft. Lauderdale. The top freshman 440 runner in 1966, and is capable of running the 880. He will also lend strength to the mile relay. Rooney is a strong powerful type runner.

BOB THOMAS - Sophomore, Sparrows Point, Md. Ranks high among the middle distance prospects in this area and is at his best in tough competition. He has the necessary speed to run the 440 and the half mile.

CHARLIE FUCHS - Sophomore, Miami. Has an outstanding high school background and threw the shotput 50 feet as a freshman. A key man.

BEAVER LANIER - Sophomore, Jacksonville. A quarter miler on last year's freshman squad, he is now concentrating on the long jump and triple jump. Along with Sid Gainey he should give the Seminoles a strong one-two punch in these two events.
