MATHERLY

Matherly tutored the 1952 team to its best year winning 17 while losing only four.

Matherly came to FSU in 1950 as a Graduate Assistant in Football. He served as coach of the 1952 FSU Tennis Team that won the Dixie Conference Title.

Ralph received his BS degree from Colgate where he was a three-sport letter winner—football, track, and baseball. He received his masters at FSU.

One of Florida's native sons, Ralph was born in Sarasota. He is regarded as one of Sarasota's all-time great athletes, lettering in four sports there before going to Colgate.

In addition to his baseball coaching duties, Matherly serves as Business Manager of Athletics.

After five seasons as head football coach at Florida State, Dr. Don Veller relinquished his grid post in Ianuary of this year, and is now serving as golf coach. Veller's five-year football record at FSU was 31 wins, 12 losses, one tie.



VELLER

Veller came to FSU in 1948 as head grid coach after having served as an assistant in 1947 to the late "Bo" McMillan at Indiana.

Veller played football at Indiana three years ('32, '33, '34) and was one of the midwest's top backs in '34. His final game found him running 82 yards for a score that enabled

Indiana to down Purdue. He was awarded the Big Ten Medal after that season, an annual award bestowed on the basis of athletic ability and scholarship. He also received the Balfour award that year as Indiana's top athlete, and the Chicago Tribune award was presented to him.

Veller received his BS degree in physical education at Indiana in 1935. From 1935 through 1941 he compiled one of the nation's best prep school grid records, winning 54 games, losing only 11 and tying three at Elkhart (Ind.) High. Three of the Elkhart teams won Northern Indiana titles.

Veller was awarded the doctor of physical degree in physical education degree in 1950, at Indiana.

In addition to his golf duties at FSU, Veller holds the rank of full professor of physical education.

LOUCKS

Before joining the Florida State staff in the fall of 1947, Coach Loucks had served as a mathematics instructor at Florida High School in Tallahassee.

During World War II, he served as an instructor on the staff of the United State Military Academy at West Point. Prior to that he had

served in a similar capacity at Peekskill Military Academy in New York.

Although a native of Indiana, Coach Loucks graduated from the University of Florida in 1936 with an A.B. degree in Health and Physical Education. He received his masters degree at the University of Indiana in 1941 and his doctorate degree at Indiana in 1951.

Loucks' initial Florida State team in 1948 won nine matches while losing only four. In 1949 the Seminoles had their best season ever winning 11 of 13 and taking the first of three consecutive Dixie Conference titles.

In 1950, Loucks guided the Seminoles to a 9-7 record. However, the following year, he was granted a leave of absence to work on his doctorate degree and baseball mentor Ralph Matherly stepped in to guide the netters to a 7-8 mark and the Dixie Conference championship.

Last season with Loucks back at the helm, the Seminoles regained their winning ways and rolled up a 9-5 record despite playing their toughest card in history.

And this season the opposition is even tougher with such formidable opponents as Georgia, Georgia Tech, Auburn and Louisiana dotting the schedule.

excellent background as a coach of track events. Before joining the staff here, Miller coached track, basketball and football at Brentwood (Cal.) High; was freshman track coach at the University of Oregon; served as a graduate assistant at the University of Michigan while working on his doctorate of physical education degree.

Miller later served as head track coach and assistant coach in football and basketball at Lock Haven (Pa.) State Teachers College.

Miller received his BS degree at Oregon in 1937. While an undergraduate there he was a standout athlete in track and basketball. He received his masters degree in physical education from Oregon in 1938 and his doctorate from Michigan in 1948.

Dr. Miller served in the Navy as an aviator during World War II, flying combat missions in the Aleutians and the Mariannas.

Millers track teams at FSU have shown consistent improvement during his tenure here. His 1952 team posted a 6-1 mark while the 1950 and 1951 editions copped five of six dual meets and won the Dixie Conference title those years,
