

A Pair of Aces

It could be said that the Florida State swimming program has been raised by the power of two.

Two years ago, Terry Maul, then head coach of the women's program and Bill Shults, head coach of the men's combined the programs into one new innovative system, designed to capitalize on the strengths of the two respected coaches.

"Our goal was to offer our students an excellent education, while building our program to the point of being a national power," Shults says.

Maul agrees. "We've developed a plan for success that has already been set into motion and is operating smoothly," he says, "Under the new system, we are able to more efficiently monitor all of the critical areas necessary for the development of each student-athlete."

In just over a year's time, the Florida State swim programs are just now reaping the benefits of the move. Florida State's women's team vaulted from a fourth to second place at the Metro Conference Championships and came in fourth at the National Independents Championships.

FSU's men's team reached similar heights, moving two spots from the previous year to finish second in the NIC and second in the Metro.

But Florida State's success does not end in the swimming pool. Under the co-coach system, Seminole swimmers have the highest grade point average of any team on campus, turning in an impressive 2.6 last semester.

Florida State's impressive turnaround can be traced to the leadership of both men.

Maul, now in his 13th year as a Florida State head coach, has taken on a more specific role since the program was restructured. He is responsible for directing the overall training regimen for the entire men's and women's teams. That is no easy task consider-

ing the many aspects to the Seminole's training as well as the team's implementation of its psychological support systems.

Recognized throughout the country for his coaching achievements, Maul draws upon his success from the past when directing the FSU team. He has coached 28 All-Americans, complied with 83-36-2 dual meet record, and finished second behind Texas at the 1982 AIAW National Championships. Maul also has gained valuable international experience, serving as head coach of the United States' entry in the 1984 South African Cup in Rio de Janiero. He was also the South's head coach at the U.S. Olympic Festival this past summer in Chapel Hill, N.C.

While Maul works with the development of the Florida State teams in the water, Shults works with the administrative aspects of the entire program. His main duties include academic monitoring, career counseling, computer-assisted coaching, video-taping and handling all budgetary items.

Although only 33, Shults has quickly climbed the ranks of collegiate coaching. The 1976 New Hampshire graduate received his first head coaching position at his alma mater after serving one year as an assistant. Shults moved on to FSU in 1979, working under former Seminole coach John Stafford before succeeding him three years later.

Widely respected in coaching circles, Shults serves on a number of committees. As regional representative and member of the board of directors to the College Swim Coaches Association, Shults serves as chairman of the academic committee of the same organization. Shults was also selected as chairman of the NCAA Legislative Input Committee for the CSAA. Last spring Shults was asked by the NCAA to give a report on the status of collegiate swimming to the president's commission.

GARY COLE (Bowling Green '75) Diving Coach

Gary Cole, now in his sixth year as the diving coach at Florida State, has accumulated a wealth of collegiate and international coaching experience that helps enhance the diving program. Just this past summer, Cole was selected from applicants from across

the nation to coach South Korea's Olympic hopefuls. Before his work with the South Korean national team, Cole also gave clinics for the International Olympic Committee in Chile and Canada.

A graduate of Bowling Green, Cole has 15 years of experience and during his initial season won NIC Coach of the Year honors. Before coming to Florida State, Cole served as an assistant coach at Auburn, Bowling Green and Michigan State. He also coached and developed the Tulip Coity Diving Club in Holland, Michigan.

During his coaching career, Cole has developed divers at all levels, including two-time world age group champions and collegiate All-Americans. three of his pupils placed in the top eight at the 1984 Canadian Olympic Trials.

At Florida State, Cole's duties go far beyond his work with the Seminole divers. He is responsible for opponent scouting, meet operations and he assists assistant coach Sid Cassidy with recruiting.

Cole is a member of the NCAA Diving Rules Committee and a member of the U.S. Professional Diving Coaching Association. A standout diver in high school, Cole was coached by Ron O'Brien, the U.S. Olympic coach since 1972.



SID CASSIDY (North Carolina State '77) Assistant Coach

Sid Cassidy, now in his third year at Florida State, is quickly gaining the reputation as one of the most dynamic young coaches on the collegiate swimming scene.

As recruiting coordinator in 1986-87, Cassidy was credited with Florida State's best

recruiting year in history, as the school signed six All-American swimmers. "We've got an outstanding product to offer at Florida State," Cassidy says. "We're an up-and-coming school that intelligent student-athletes are finding desirable."

Cassidy's on-deck duties include planning and implementation of training methodologies for the distance swimmers, as well as assiting with all aspects of training for the entire team. The Kinston, NC native came to Florida State after serving as head coach of the Greater Tampa Swimming Association for two years. While in Tampa, he was a driving force in the creation of the Tampa Bay Swimming Association. In just its first year of existence, the club placed among the top 30 teams at the Senior Nationals and among the top 15 at the National Junior Olympic Meet. He also worked as an assistant coach for the University of Tampa's 1985 squad which placed third in the nation.

Before his Tampa assignment, Cassidy was head coach of the Wilmington Aquatic club — the same club where he spent his scholastic years under the tutelage of the internationally acclaimed Bob Matson.

In 1985, Cassidy was chosen to serve as an assistant coach of the United State's entry in the Arena Championship in Bonn, West Germany. He also coached the Mexican Olympic National Team in Mexico City.

As a collegiate swimmer at North Carolina State, Cassidy earned All-American honor three times. After the conclusion of his college career, he became a world-ranked professional marathon swimmer. Presently, he coaches the senior team at the Area Tallahassee Aquatic Club.

The 30 year-old Cassidy is single.



CHRIS BEADLE

Sophomore Cocoa, Florida

...the Lady Seminoles' top returning performer in the 200 and 500 free... expected to again head up Florida State's push to the Metro title in those events...was awarded the squad's Pike's Peak award, given annually to the swimmer who "climbs mountains during the swimming season"...highly motivated, she

mountains during the swimming season"...highly motivated, she is considered a team leader by the coaching staff...1986-87: saved her best time of the season (4:57.65) in the 500 free for the conference championships...that timing placed her fourth, helped FSU to a second overall...also posted the third best time on the team in the 200 free, a 1:54.20 clocking...Prep: a high school All-American at Cocoa High School...selected as MVP of Cocoa's team for four consecutive years...trained under John Hughes at the Brevard Swim Club...Personal: enrolled in FSU's basic studies...born February 18, 1968.



MERRIE BRENNAN

Freshman Tampa, Florida

...a multi-talented swimmer who specializes in the butterfly and freestyle...has already turned a time of 16:42.89 in the 1650 free which would not only eclipse the existing FSU school record, but qualify for the NCAA Championships...her time of 10:06 in the

1000 free and 4:27 in the 400 I.M. also tops any time by a Lady Seminole in those events in '87...comes from good bloodlines, as her father Ed was named National Division II Coach of the Year, as head coach of the University of Tampa. Personal: enrolled in basic studies...born November 30, 1969...is the youngest Lady Seminole on this year's squad.



MISSY BUNNELL

Sophomore Ft. Worth, Texas

... her presence in the 1650 free makes that event one of the most solid for the Lady Seminoles ... 1986-87: capped an excellent freshman campaign with sixth and eighth place finishes at the Metro Conference Championships in the 1650 and 500 free ...

also placed sixth in the 400 IM . . . Prep: a state champion and All-American in the distance events at W.E. Boswell High in Saginaw, Texas . . . junior national finalist . . . swam for Lucky Foreman at Texas Aquatics . . . Personal: a business major . . . born October 4, 1967 . . . named to the Metro Conference Commissioner's List after posting a perfect 4.0 grade point average.

Last year, Florida State placed 11 swimmers on the Metro Conference Commissioner's List. The list annually recognizes student-athletes in the conference who hold grade point averages over 3.0

Leading the list of eight Lady Seminoles was Missy Bunnell, who attained a perfect 4.0

Sophomore Palm Beach Gardens, Florida

... looks to be one of Florida State's top divers this season ... is just now picking up the finer points of diving because she began diving late in her high school career ... came to Florida State unheralded as a freshman and turned out to be a pleasant surprise ...

1986-87: finished 10th at the Metro Conference meet on the one meter board . . . Prep: attended Palm Beach Gardens High School . . . coached by Jeff Shaffer at Mission Bay Swim Club . . . Personal: is enrolled in Florida State's basic studies program . . . born July 17, 1968.

Sophomore North Palm Beach, Florida

Personal: enrolled in Florida State's basic studies program...born July 16, 1969.

the nation in the sprint free ... comes off an outstanding freshman season ... 1986-87: finished third in the 100 breast (1:06.14), fourth in the 200 breast (2:26.81), and 12th in the 50 free (25.53) at the Metro Conference Championships as a freshman ... also swam on FSU's third place 400 and 200 medley relays ... Prep: one of the top breaststroke talents in Idaho as a senior ... qualified for senior nationals ... the 1986 YMCA runner-up in the 100 breast ... Personal: a fashion merchandising major ... born May 25, 1968.



JENNIE HUGUS Sophomore Orlando, Florida

Championships . . . swam to a fifth place time of 24.62 in the 50 free and a sixth place time of 53.02 in the 100 free . . . also finished sixth in the 200 free (1:52.95) . . . one of her biggest accomplishments at the Conference meet came in the relays . . . swam legs on FSU's third place 200 free, 400 medley and 200 medley relays . . . Prep: an all-county selection at Orlando's Oak Ridge High . . . swam under coach John Woods as a member of the Orlando Dolphins . . . relays ... Prep: one of the top talents coming out of the Clearwater area as a senior ... a high school All-American. Personal: a special education major ... born February 15, 1969.

Freshman Marlton, New Jersey

...another newcomer in the breaststroke who will see action in those events as a freshman...looks to be a potential NCAA qualifier in the 200 breast...swam 2:20.3 in the 200 breast which would have qualified for the NCAA Championships...her personal

best in the 100 breast is 1:06.4...brother Donny (Pittsburgh) and sister Amanda (Southern Illinois) also had successful collegiate careers as breaststrokers...Personal: enrolled in Florida State's basic studies program...born June 16, 1969.

Freshman Americus, Georgia

...will be a valuable addition in the sprint events...regarded by many as a sleeper in recruiting circles...comes from good bloodlines as her sister Angel is the current American record holder in the 50 meter freestyle...with a time of 53.0 in the 100 back,

she is already ahead of the development of her older sister...both her parents serve as swim coaches for the Americus Blue Tide...Personal: enrolled in Florida State's basic studies program...born October 2, 1968.

Freshman Dallas, Texas

...an outstanding young middle-distance freestyler who is expected to have an immediate impact...will also be tried on the 400 free relay...a three-time state 200 meter champion... defended her title as a senior, winning her second title with a 1:50.7

timing...also, swam under five minutes in the 500...Personal: enrolled in basic studies...born December 13, 1969.

Freshman Upper Marlboro, Maryland

... teams with Stacy Wright to give Florida State two of the top freshman divers in the South ... a potential NCAA qualifier ... very versatile; can compete in the one, three and platform events ... comes to Florida State from the Hurricane Swim Club, which

is one of the top programs in the country ... a very strong athlete who advanced to her age group's national championships the past two years ... Personal: enrolled in basic studies at FSU ... born November 11, 1969 ... is the second youngest Lady Seminole swimmer.



KATHY TURNER Sophomore Roswell, Georgia

...proved to be one of the most talented freshmen in the Metro Conference last year ...scored more points for FSU than any other swimmer at the Metro Conference meet ... qualified for the Pan Am trials in the 200 fly ...qualifying for the NCAA Champion-

ships could be just around the corner if she continues to improve at her present rate...posted the team's best times in the 200 fly (2:04.63), 200 IM (2:09.81) and 400 IM (4:31.63) last year...1986-87: the third place finisher in the 200 fly at the conference championships, swimming a season-best 2:04.63...back to swim 4:31.63 in the 400 IM for third place...also scored in the 200 IM (sixth place — 2:09.81)...Prep: one of the country's most sought



Making a Splash in the Metro

It's no longer a case of sink or swim for the Florida State women's swim team.

Last year, most onlookers thought it would be a transition year for FSU, as it unified the men's and women's programs. But Florida State turned in a surprising second place finish in the women's competition.

Things will only get better. "I don't think any other team in the Metro has improved like we have," head coach Terry Maul says. "We're going to close the gap."

Although virtually every top performer returns, Maul and co-head coach Bill Shults didn't wait around last spring for the upcoming season. The pair along with assistant coach Sid Cassidy went out and signed the school's best recruiting class in history. "We had far and away the strongest recruiting year in the conference," Maul says.

Several of FSU's prized recruits, including Stacia Evans, Merrie Brennan, Stacy Wright, Kathy Isackson, Krissy Myers and Susan Pollack, will make their presence felt at the Metro Conference Championships. They also could qualify for the NCAA Championships—something that no Florida State swimmer was able to do last season.

This group of freshmen will compliment an ever-improving group of returning letterwinners. Sophomores Jennifer Hazard, Missy Bunnell and Kathy Turner will lead the way.

1650 FREE . . . a very strong event for the Lady Seminoles, where all three entrants could finish in the top six at the Conference meet . . . look for sophomores Bunnell, Chris Beadle and freshmen Brennan to contribute . . . Brennan, whose father Ed is the head coach of division II powerhouse Tampa, has already swam under NCAA standards in high school . . . the Lady Seminoles will feel the loss of Karen Acre to graduation after she finished second in the conference in the event.

500 FREE . . . Freshmen Susan North, Kathy Isackson and Alison Harvey will team with Bunnell, Brennan and Beadle to form a nucleus that should score during the course of the season.

200 FREE ... Former Texas state champion Susan North will lead sophomores Jennie Hugus and Beadle, who all have the potential to score.

50 FREE and 100 FREE ... FSU will depend on a number of newcomers to shore up these two events ... Evans, the talented freshmen from Orlando who already has been timed under the NCAA qualifying mark in high school leads this group ... Myers and Jennie Hugus will swim both events, giving FSU a strong one-two combination for the future ... Harvey, North and Hugus will compete in the 100 as well ... "The 50 and 100 free

events have the potential to be very good," Maul says. "It's an untested area that could become better then we expected."

100 and 200 FLY ... Here are two events where FSU coaches hope experience and youth will gell ... sophomore Kathy Turner, who was FSU's top point scorer a year ago at the Metro Championships, had an excellent off-season of training, qualifying for the Pam Am Trials ... freshman Isackson also qualified for the Pan Am Trials and could give FSU a formidable one-two punch.

100 and 200 BACK ... Maul says that the Lady Seminoles will concentrate on the 100 back but adds, "it should be a very good event for us ... freshmen Evans, Myers and Kristan Chambers are penciled in as the top performers in both events going into the season ...


going into the season ...

100 and 200 BREAST ... if there's an event the coaching staff feels comfortable about, it's this one ... "We have three talented swimmers in these events," Maul says ... one of those is sophomore Hazard who is capable of swimming as fast as anyone in the country in the sprint breaststroke ... she will head this group that includes freshmen Peyton, and Belinda Martin.

200 and 400 IM ... both events boast depth, although they don't have the strength of the breast and fly ... Turner, Peyton and Martin will swim the 200 distance ... in the demanding 400, Brennan, Bunnell and Turner will see action.

ONE and THREE METER DIVING ... not since the days of Wendy Fuller and Patsy O'Toole have the Lady Seminoles had the top-rated personnel in the diving events ... senior Sharon Warning finished third last year in the one meter board at the conference meet ... she will be pushed by a trio of competitors ... coming off her first full year of diving competition, Julie Deskin has been impressive during pre-season workouts ... incoming freshmen Stacy Wright and Susan Pollack are two promising divers who have the potential to qualify for the NCAA Championships.

If there was one concern at the beginning of the season, it would be allowing this young team the time to become accustomed to competition with the nation's top teams. Maul and Shults will not have to wait long to see just how good their team is. FSU opens the season against nationally ranked Miami before



taking on the likes of S.E.C. powers Florida, Alabama and Georgia. During the winter months, FSU will take on Louisiana State in preparation for the Metro Conference Championship on February 25-27 in Columbia, SC. The challenging schedule, combined with the youth of the squad, would be enough to scare most coaches, but not Maul. "I'm only worried to the extent that the freshmen haven't had considerable dual meet experience," Maul says. "Youth also provides great enthusiasm which allows us to accept these formidable challenges."

Talk about close encounters of the third kind. No, not the movie but the career of Florida State diver Benoit Seguin. For the last three years, Seguin has established himself as one of the South's best divers on the one and three meter boards. Every year, however, he has missed qualifying for the NCAA Championships by the narrowest of margins—6/100's of a point in 1985. But this year Seguin is ready to change his luck; he leads a young group of skilled athletes into the season that could see several Seminoles qualify for the NCAA Championships and a challenge for the Metro Conference title.


With over 32 swimmers on the roster, the Seminoles have nearly every event covered. FSU welcomes an impressive recruiting class that features national junior college champion Skip Laing, and heralded freshmen Charlie Rose and Mike Lockhart. The newcomers will compliment a corps of returning lettermen led by Jim Van Farowe, Dan Densmore, Mark Snesky, Graham Carothers and Vance Tankersley.

1650 FREE ... without question, the 1650 free will be the men's best event ... sophomore Wilkerson cut 16 seconds for his personal best during his freshman season to finish fourth last year in the Metro Championships ... he went on to swim at the National Sports Festival ... John Kenny and Kris Zumeants also add quality depth in this event.

500 FREE ... FSU is loaded in this event as well ... sophomore Vance Tankersley returns after finishing third last year in the event at the conference championships ... he will be joined by the entire group of 1650 swimmers.

200 FREE ... the men's team will find an easier time scoring at the Metro Championships with the graduation of four of the top six performers in the conference ... heralded freshmen Lockhart, junior college transfer Laing and sophomores Graham Carothers, Ryan Aycock and freshman Mike Dotson all are untested but have vast potential.

50 and 100 FREE ... Laing, a junior college national champion from Indian River, looks to be a formidable force in the conference ... sophomores Carothers,



Aycock, and Matt Muller will provide quality depth ... freshmen and Roder may be a year away from becoming a factor.

100 and 200 FLY ... two tested veterans will challenge Matt Muller for the top spots in the 100 fly ... sophomores Carothers and Snesky swam FSU's top times in the 100 last year, missing NCAA qualifying standards by just one second ... the 200 is more clouded, with juniors Keith Duncan and senior Pat Owens entering the season as the top returning performers ... Tankersley will also be tried in hopes of solidifying the event.

100 and 200 BACK ... traditionally backstroke is the event that is the toughest to score in the conference meet ... that will again be the case in 1988 ... junior Jim Van Farowe and freshman Charlie Rose are a pair of candidates who will try to turn the tide for FSU.

100 and 200 BREAST ... the Seminoles aren't able to boast the quality that they do in other events, but there is a catch ... five out of the top eight scorers from last year's conference meet have graduated ... untested juniors Dennis Kearn and Dan Densmore, senior Drew Cobb and freshmen Eric Cotter and Mike Roder are on the verge of making break throughs ... Mike Herman also returns and has shown improvement over the summer.

200 and 400 IM ... this is an event where Florida State has a perfect mixture of experience, youth and depth ... Lockhart, Van Farowe and Rose will lead this group ... Duncan, Densmore, Cobb and Mike Herrman will return to compete for the remaining positions ... look for Duncan and Densmore to swim the 400.

ONE and THREE METER DIVING ... FSU's hopes of sending a diver to the NCAA Championships rests with Seguin ... his improvement will also be a key in the Seminoles' drive for the team title at the Metro Championships ...

With the top-flight talent that Florida State boasts going into the season, there's no doubt that the Seminoles are ahead of schedule. That timetable was set last year when the men's and women's programs were combined into one last year. Maul and Shults designed a schedule that would lead the program to the Metro Conference championship and a top 20 finish within three years. "Before last year, the plan was really just a model that hadn't been tested," Shults says. "But now the plan is a working model. We accomplished the first-year goals and we are really looking forward to the second year of the plan. We're making steady improvement and we're starting to see the results we expected."

This Is FSU

Florida State is the University which boasts of such diverse assets as the world's most powerful supercomputer and the greatest all-collegiate show on Earth, the Flying High Circus.

Located in Tallahassee, the capital of Florida, FSU is a public, coeducational university and a senior member of the

State University System.

About 23,500 students representing all 50 states and more than 100 foreign countries work toward more than 250 different graduate and undergraduate degrees in the 15 schools and colleges of Florida State. The colleges of arts and sciences, business, communication, education, engineering, home economics, law and social sciences combine with the schools of criminology, library and information studies, music, nursing, social work, theatre and visual arts to make FSU a nationally acclaimed university.

The Florida State campus, located just a few blocks from the state Capitol, is one of the most beautiful in the southeast. Traditional Gothic-style structures combine with the latest in modern architecture, all brought together by an array of oaks, pines, palms, dogwoods and azaleas. The natural beauty of the 347-acre main campus mirrors the picturesque features of the surrounding North Florida region.

Florida State was founded in 1857 as the Seminary West of the Suwannee River. Name changes over the years included Florida State College and, in 1909, Florida State College for Women. Governor Millard Caldwell signed a bill in 1947 which again made the institution coeducational and named in Florida State University.


Today, Florida State faculty and administrators generate more than \$35 million annually in external funding to supplement state sponsorship of research. In addition, almost \$13 million in private gifts was raised through the FSU Foundation during the past fiscal year. These contributions from alumni, friends, corporations, the university community and charitable foundations are for the sole benefit of Florida State's academic

programs.

The FSU Supercomputer Computations Research Institute has attracted international attention to the University, home of the world's fastest supercomputer. The ETA10 has the capacity to perform 10 billion calculations per second.

The Tandem Van De Graaf-Superconducting Accelerator Laboratory in the Department of Physics houses two powerful atom smashers and has been ranked in the top four in the nation by the National Science Foundation.

The University's location affords excellent research and internship opportunities in government, law and the social



sciences. The reputation of Florida State's research programs, the expertise of its more than 1,500 faculty members—including four members of the National Academy of Sciences—and the quality of the graduate students involved in research represent major strengths of the University.

Programs in music, dance and theater at Florida State have earned well-deserved national recognition. The visual and performing arts exhibited and produced on campus offer students and the community a wealth of enrichment opportunities.

Student activities at FSU create an important balance between the classroom experience and the personal life of the individual scholar. Honors programs, student government, intramural sports and more than 200 organizations are available for student involvement.

Students from every academic major have a chance to become stars on the highwire or flying trapeze by participating in the Flying High Circus, the only one of its kind in the nation.

Florida State academic programs extend well beyond Tallahassee. The FSU Marine Laboratory is located on the Gulf of Mexico, 45 miles away. Students participate in professional training programs at the Asolo State Theater in Sarasota and the Burt Reynolds Institute for

Theatre Training in Jupiter. The Panama City Campus of Florida State offers upper-level courses which lead to bachelor's and master's degrees. The Center for Professional Development and Public Service, housed in the Florida State Conference Center on the edge of campus, manages educational outreach activities from Pensacola to Miami. In addition, Florida State maintains programs of study in England, Italy, Costa Rica, Switzerland, Yugoslavia, the Panama Canal Zone and even the People's Republic of China.

The physical growth of the University during the Sliger administration is best evidenced by such additions as the new wing of the Rovetta Business Building, the University Union expansion project, the new Paul A.M. Dirac Science Library Building, the Panama City Campus, the Jeffersonian Village Green project at the College of Law and the new building for the FAMU/FSU College of Engineering, now under construction.

Florida State is setting the pace as higher education in Florida prepares to enter the 21st century. And President Sliger takes pride not only in the academic programs and facilities of the University, but also in the people—students, faculty, alumni, administrators and staff—who make Florida State a successful monument to learning.
